As a 15 year old boy, Paul Ruston used to pop in and help his dad's cousin, Tim in his shop, Tim's Gentlemans Hairdressers in Windmill Walk working at weekends and after school.

When the time came and Paul left school he looked no further than his relatives hairdressers to pursue a career in Gentlemen's hairdressing, working alongside Tim until the day he hung up his scissors

Such was the faith that Tim had in Paul that he allowed Paul to run the Barbers shop and for the past 18 years Paul has done just that, and has developed a great relationship with Alex who works alongside him.



Like a lot of businesses in and around Beverley, the time comes when ownership is to be handed over, and in the next few weeks Paul will take over the business reins.

Paul said, "Having worked in the shop for the last 30 years and ran the shop for the last 18 years, I am excited to be able to have our family name above the door. It was still a big decision."

Paul decided it is time that in recognition of his family to rename the hairdressers as Forthmans Gentlemens Hairdressers.

Paul said, "Tims hairdressers have a good reputation, now I have the opportunity to continue and build on the reputation under our family name. My great uncle Roy Forth had a Gentleman's hairdressers at 37 Highgate, Beverley, which he started in the 1940's before moving to Scarborough in the 1960's. His sister Freda continued in Beverley and in the shop on Highgate until the early 1970's."

It was in the 1970's when Freda's son, Tim, started in Beverley behind Mitchell's Toy Shop on Butcher Row, which a lot of people of a certain generation will remember - "Tim's Gentlemans Hairdressers", was born.

In 1984 when the new buildings on Windmill Walk were finished Tim moved the business into one of the units, and now almost 40 years on the reins will be passed over and Paul will continue in the Barber's Shop in the family tradition with his great uncle's name above the door.

Paul said, "It will be a proud day, I look forward to continuing with his legacy".

For the future Paul will look to continue to build on good old fashioned customer service and



banter, and over the generations, people, families, father's and son's have continued to come to the hairdressers for a traditional haircut and/or beard trim.

Paul mentioned, "Families have continued to walk through the door and we have always looked after them, it is a great tradition, people of Beverley tend to support each other, and we look forward to both myself and Alex continuing to deliver what we have always delivered. Good service, good haircuts and banter to go with it."

Everyone took time out from their busy schedule to help raise awareness and be part of this fantastic event which Ali had organised.

This was the third event 'Toys for Türkiye' following on from the East Yorkshire to East Türkiye appeals, and the event continued

to show the generosity and humanity of the people of Beverley, and the wider East Yorkshire area, as well as support from other areas in a time frame of only 8 weeks.

Everyone gave their time and energy for free from individuals to businesses, and the event was opened by a Pipe Major, Mr Danny Fleming.

A variety of entertainment followed with Amelia Jackson a musical student from Hymers College, Ruth Getts a quintessential vintage singer, The Hand Song Choir, Danillie, a singer, Ray Gallagher on Accordion, a Quartet from The Humberside Police Band, and Josh with street performances.

The distinguished guests were truly humbled by the scale of the event and the previous events. It is fantastic to report that the money raised from the event was over £12,000.



Gary Jackson said, "We have collected approximately 1000 'shoe boxes' filled with toys, gifts, teddy bears, many with handwritten notes and labels from children in our area to children in Türkiye, and these boxes will be flown out in the next few days".

"We had in attendance Humberside Police, Humberside Fire and Rescue Service, and members of Lincolnshire Fire and Rescue, one of whom attended in Türkiye as part of the UK Emergency Response Team.

"We also had an ambulance with qualified staff giving their time for free throughout the day. I have not seen anything on this scale before, these events have brought positive attention to Beverley and the wider East Yorkshire area".

Graham Stuart, Member of Parliament for Beverley and Holderness, praised Ali Tekce for his wonderful Toys for Turkiye Fundraiser Event

Graham said, "Ali Tekce is a well known entrepreneurial Beverley restaurateur and the inspirational leader of the Turkish Earthquake Appeal. Following the disastrous earthquakes in February, which caused almost 60,000



deaths and affected a staggering 14 million people, Ali secured £17,000 in cash donations and 7 truck-loads of essential goods to provide crucial aid to those devastated by the crisis in Turkey."



His Excellency Osman Koray Ertaş said, "I was heavily moved by the generosity of the people of Beverley and East Yorkshire. I am also grateful to Lord Lieutenant Mr. James Dick, High Sheriff Ms. Tina Cerutti, Minister of State and Member of Parliament Rt. Hon. Graham Stuart, Mayor of Beverley Mrs. Linda Johnson and all other dignitaries for their presence at the event and display of solidarity with our country. The assistance of Beverley and East Yorkshire to Türkiye during these trying times will never be forgotten."

Ali Tekce said, "Even in the face of adversity, there is light and goodness all around us. This is something I have learned after all the kindness people have shown from all walks of life following the earthquakes."

Karl Douglas who helped on behalf of the local Lodge said, "We raised nearly £1,000 on Sunday (cost of the teddies plus cash donations plus donation from the members of the Constitutional Lodge No 294) - that is without the auction funds and Ali raised 'selling' teddies at the end (another £5-600). We hope we may be able to get some matched funding from Provincial Lodge charity funds and also



donations from other lodges, we hope to top £2.000!"

The Grand Lodge had already donated a total of £60,000, donated to the Turkey and Syria Earthquake relief effort, with £20,000 each going to the UK for UNHCR, British Red Cross and Unicef



Fundraisers: from Constitutional Lodge - Martin Rowland and Karl Douglas (Beverley Travel), Diera 329 (Ladies Lodge) - Theresa Rowland collectively mentioned that Sunday 16th April was a special Day and confirmed how working together can help so many people.







## I'VE BEEN THINKING... SAYS COLIN RAYNOR

You don't need me to tell you that on Saturday May 6th an historical event will take place in London for which millions of people throughout the world, have been patiently waiting.

This will be the first actual Coronation many people have ever seen but many will have listened to the memories of their family who have told them, time and again, where they were and what they did on that special day of Tuesday June 2nd 1953.

The Coronation of Queen Elizabeth 2nd was the first Coronation of course to be televised (in black and white then) and there were some who stated it was the wrong thing to do but common sense prevailed and we can only imagine the excitement when the waiting was over and the great day arrived. Television was in our homes and it was worth waiting for.

It is a fact of life I suggest that as human beings we spend a lot of our time just waiting and some of us are better at it than others. The British willingness to stand patiently in a queue is not



replicated in many other countries, but we know this is only short term waiting.

Many of you will know of young people who have recently waited anxiously for their examination results to come through in the knowledge that they have to do it all over again in the next few weeks. Waiting to see if their hopes and dreams of what they want to do with their lives are going to be possible. Family members can also feel stress as they wonder what the future holds.

At times the period of waiting can be clearly defined. A pregnancy for example will stretch over nine months, or less. This can be a very anxious time for the mother (and lots of other people) even though she may have given birth more than once. Miracles always take their time.

I recently had an examination for a medical condition and was told I would get the results in 'ten days time'. At first I welcomed the fact that I had been given a specific period of time. So waiting and time are very strange matters. Try as we might we cannot alter them no more than King Canute could stop the tide wetting his royal robes



May 6th will be just another day of twenty four hours but I'm sure it will be a day we will remember for many reasons. Many of them related to the Coronation of King Charles who, with Camilla by his side as Queen Consort, will reign we hope and pray for many years to come.

Yorkshire. I always enjoy an early morning walk along the River Hull.

As well as the beautiful morning light, there is a huge variety of wildlife to see such as Barn Owls, Roe Deer and maybe even an Otter if you're lucky.

You can normally hear the chirp of a Kingfisher flying past or the sounds of a Tawny Owl in the trees. For a better chance of getting some great close ups I also enjoy visiting Tophill Low Nature reserve. Located on the River Hull between Beverley and Driffield there is a range of hides for bird watching and photography.

Out towards the coast at RSPB Bempton Cliffs, you'll be able to watch the Gannets collecting nesting material from the cliff tops and see the Puffins and other sea birds gliding on the breeze as they come in to land.

If the wind is blowing from the right direction, they will hover right in front of you, making them much easier to photograph!



the Black-Browed Albatross may also return for another year. The landscapes of East Yorkshire and the Wolds also provide

plenty of photo opportunities this time of year. The countless yellow fields of Rapeseed break up the green landscape and look stunning in the sunlight.



The trees are also starting to blossom, and a great place to see them is in Huggate where one of the walks intersects the driveway of Northfield Lodge. The drive is lined with a tunnel of Cherry trees.



# **LEAVE A THOUGHTFUL LEGACY**

There are few more confusing - or unpopular - taxes than Inheritance Tax (IHT). If you're unsure of the details, or you'd like more of your inheritance to go to your family and less to the taxman or on care fees, we can help.

Vindolanda in Northumberland. One of Beverley's residents took time out to fulfil an ambition of his and take the opportunity to excavate at the site.

Vindolanda was a Roman auxiliary fort "Castrum", in the north of England just South of Hadrian's Wall. It is understood that it was under Roman occupation from approximately 85 AD to 370 AD.



Leon, who has an interest in Roman history, visited the Vindolanda Fort, which is a world heritage site, in 2018.

Leon became aware that excavations take place between April and September, so he decided one day he would excavate on the site. He knew that places are limited at Vindolanda and highly sought after to excavate under expert supervision of the resident archaeologist.

Towards the end of 2022 Leon received the news that he had secured his place but the news was just the start of his journey.

By December 2022 Leon's application to dig at Vindolanda had been accepted, he read through all the documentation. His heart sank with the sentence. "You need to demonstrate that you are physically able to carry out the required work"!!!!

Leon, at 80+ years old, had not carried out any form of exercise for 40 years. Undeterred, but with the backing of his family, Leon's journey began.

Leon sought the help of Beverley's Oliver Johnston who has a good reputation in personal fitness, helping people of all ages to fulfill their ambition and targets. Oliver knew what he was taking on...

Oliver said, "You are never too old to start to do exercise, to adopt a healthier lifestyle, you just need to have a positive attitude and be consistent".

Oli went on to say, "Leon's mindset was incredible. He was open minded and positive, and he told me what he needed to do to achieve a level of fitness to do two weeks of work of digging at Vindolanda. During a dig in 2022, a round house constructed of stone was exposed. This was unusual as the Romans houses, it was usually the British or Celts that built round houses but usually of timber construction. This area of the site held specific interest and captured Leon's imagination, resulting in many hours of research prior to going up to Vinolanda.

Leon is a credit and inspiration, and sends a message to everyone, "if you put your mind, heart and soul into it, you can fulfil your dreams."







The World's Fastest Indian (available on ITVX - free with ads) is a mundane title that turns out to be entirely appropriate, for a delightful film. The legend that is Anthony Hopkins plays a real-life New Zealander legend, Burt Munro, a retiree who during the 1960s restored the Indian motorbike of the title

Seen by his exasperated neighbours as an eccentric who doesn't mow his lawn and revs his machine in the early morning, Burt harbours the dream of speed testing his motorcycle, complete with his own makeshift modifications at the Bonneville Salt Flats in Utah. Despite medical advice to stop riding his bike, he saves enough money to travel to the United States, partly by working his passage as a cook on a cargo ship.

As Burt finally reaches America, he faces bureaucracy, scepticism and indifference, but his fish-out-of-water charm, down-to-Earth nature and determination lead him to find many helpful people from all walks of American society who assist him. If you don't know Munro's place in motorsport history, it would be a shame to spoil the quirky tale that unfolds but, suffice to say, you will be cheering this unlikely hero in the film's finale. As they say, it is not just the destination but the journey travelled and The World's Fastest Indian is one of those films where you can't resist a grin on your face throughout.

After writing about Rom-Coms a few months back, I was kicking myself that I missed out on the wee jewel that is Palm Springs (available on Amazon Prime video). Although it has echoes of "Groundhog Day" this has its own spin, charm and humour. In fact, the filmmakers lean into the fact, we have seen these time loop shenanigans before.

Starring Andy Samberg (best known here for

TV's "Brooklyn 99") as Nyles who appears as a guest at a Palm Springs wedding acting unusually and wearing beach wear rather than formally dressed. Nyles rescues the bride's sister Sarah (the black sheep of the family) from further torment after an embarrassing turn and both take a walk into the desert. However, Nyles is attacked by a strange man and upon finding a small cave, Nyles strangely asks Sarah not to follow him into the tunnel. Of course, she does and she ends up joining him in reliving the wedding day again which he has been doing for some time.

The chemistry between Cristin Milioti (who plays Sarah) and Samberg really sparks with humour as the two take different routes to try to solve the predicament in which they both find themselves. Of course, romance is not far away and each day brings a new revelation about their situation and the wedding in which they are forever participating. Even with quantum physics featuring Palm Springs is light, frothy and a great deal of fun. I am a sucker for a good action film although the millennium saw CGI tending to neuter excitement usually generated by skilled stuntmen and actors doing things which leave you breathless. However, the recent John Wick films have reversed this trend along with our last two selections (well three actually).


I have previously mentioned my admiration for Dan Stevens in this column as he strikes me as a chameleon actor who can shine in a variety of roles. Indeed, without him providing a central charismatic performance as David in The Guest (available on ITVX - free with ads) would be a great film, but he makes it riveting.

The first half of the film is quite Hitchcockian with the arrival of a charming young man at the front door of a grieving family. He claims to be a close comrade of their son who was been killed while serving in the army. Although seeming to grudgingly accept the hospitality of the family, David soon inveigles himself by helping family members in a very unique way such as the younger brother's bullying problem.

However, when the father of the house receives a long-awaited promotion after the suspicious death of his superior, the wary daughter believes this could confirm her concerns that David is not all he seems.

Further elaboration would spoil the twists, turns and thrills that are about to transpire. With his choice of music, imaginative plotting, interesting characters and his eye for framing, director Adam Wingard captures the vibe of eighties-era action movies. Perhaps unsurprisingly he cites legendary director John Carpenter as one of his key influences.

It would be remiss of me not to mention Lance Reddick who plays a small but pivotal role in the film. Reddick recently passed away and The Guest does show why he was a sought-after character



in Film and TV such as The Wire, Fringe and all of the John Wick films.

#### "No... I'm done."

For the wild card this month, you have not one but two extraordinary action films with The Raid and The Raid 2 (both available on Netflix). Even though the films are set in Indonesia and in that country's language, they are written, edited and directed by a Welshman, Gareth Evans who is assisted with breathtaking action choreography by the star of both films, Iko Uwais.

Originally, Evans wanted to make a film based on the events that take place in the second film but could not raise the budget to realise his ambitious tale. So he created a paired-down story set in one location (a tower block in the slums of Jakarta) which still had action and drama but met the money available. The Raid follows an elite police team's mission to capture a ruthless mobster which goes awry when they are discovered between floors by a gang of killers and thugs. Including family man, Rama (played by Uwais), the squad's only choices for survival is to fight their way out or go up to topple the crime boss. Either way, it is the start of a bloody visceral journey which will reveal corruption and hidden loyalties.

The success of the first film meant that Evans and Uwais could release their initial ambitions and The Raid 2 follows on from the repercussions of the first film's events seeing Rama going deep undercover to incriminate the top of the crime syndicate. The sequel expands its action (there is a jaw-dropping car chase) and locations in an epic tale of jealousy, betrayal and deceit among the crime families of the city.



Many modern-age films hid the limitations of their performers through quick editing but, the actors in both Raid films are skilled in the Indonesian martial art, Pencak Silat, which makes for some of the most exciting close-quarters action set pieces of recent years. Both films are very, very violent (and had me exclaiming loudly on more than one occasion even on repeated viewings) but if you like exciting actioners, don't let the subtitles put you off.

# **LOCAL WOODLAND WALKS**

'Cherish the woodland it affects every aspect of life' - (Sir David Attenborough.)

Spring is the perfect time for a woodland stroll. Sadly, the East Riding, being so extensively farmed, does not have that many wooded areas.

Here, however, I offer three short walks close to Beverley, where you can enjoy the sights, sounds and smells of local woods in spring. I also suggest two woods to savour elsewhere in the county.

Each give us a real sense of seclusion, and a good chance of encountering wildlife; with the added bonus of carpets of spring flowers, notably the ever-popular bluebells.

The jewel in the crown of our local woods, is undoubtedly Burton Bushes at the top of the Westwood. An ancient wood with a wide range of mature trees, notably, commanding oaks. The bluebells that bloom profusely from mid-April, are amongst the finest you'll find anywhere.

You can really wander here, the main paths are clear, many narrower ones involve picking your way through undergrowth.

The woods are full of birdlife, such as green woodpeckers and blue tits. On one recent occasion, I was thrilled as a red deer rushed right by me. There are even the remains of an ancient settlement.

The first bluebells had bloomed in the early days of April, with other colour provided by daffodils and the lovely wood anemone. 30 acres of paradise on our doorstep, with many entry gates close to the racecourse.

Even nearer the town are the woods in Newbegin Pits, which can easily reached by strolling up from the town centre.

Although not as thickly wooded as the Bushes, they are delightful in Spring, with many open grassy areas for picnics on the warmer days ahead.

The rolling paths are very attractive. In wet weather, the spring that feeds Beverley Beck can be seen spouting out of the ground. Kestrels hunt here, now joined by red kites that have recently

migrated east from the Wolds. Storkhill Wood is relatively new, dating only from 2004. The local landowner then made a commendable decision to develop a mixed broadleaf wood, with oaks, maples and wild cherry.

Already the results are impressive, with attractive paths going through dense canopies, with very attractive ponds. As accessing the wood involves a half mile walk from a road, it is rarely visited. I usually have it entirely to myself.

To reach it, walk up the left bank of the River Hull, across the bridge from the Crown and Anchor pub, parking is possible on both sides of the river at Hull Bridge.

Further afield across the East Riding, there are the popular woods at Millington and Houghton Moor, near Newbald. Two lesser known ones which are a joy to visit in Spring, are at North Cliffe and Pocklington.

The wood at the latter is reached by a steep path from the northern edge of town, with lovely views.

Heading west you pass through almost a mile of attractive woods, heady with the aroma of wild garlic when I last visited in late March.

You can easily walk back to town along the path beside the quiet road known as the Mile.

North Cliffe Woods, 3 miles south of Market Weighton at YO434XE, are a revelation, especially during May when the bluebells are quite breathtaking.

So, do seek out our precious woods this Spring, great for mind, body and soul.

Congratulations to Julian, and all those involved with producing Just Beverley, which this month reaches its centenary.

It has been my great pleasure and privilege to have contributed some 60 article on local walks and heritage, over the past 7 years.

A great Beverley institution, long may it flourish!





There is a flower for each wedding anniversary year, and there must be a rose for every conceivable life event... and yes there is a 'King Charles Coronation Rose.' The 'King Charles Coronation' rose is a floribunda rose (clusters of flowers), it has pale pink flowers with ruffled edges and a light fragrance.

With three 'Bank holidays' in May, I am sure some of us will endeavour to have a barbeque or relaxing in the garden with friends and family, weather permitting of course!! There will be plenty of blossom in the gardens and there will still be some spring flowering bulbs to add brightness. If you are not entertaining, then below is a list of tasks to keep you busy.

#### Tasks for May

- Be ready to protect plants against sudden frosts.
- Water all new plantings if weather is dry and windy.
- Trim spring-flowering perennials
- Support soft stemmed or tall perennials stake them from the early stages of growth.
- Finish pruning spring-flowering shrubs e.g., Forsythia and Kerria.
- Tidy up the foliage of spring bulbs and mark where they are in the garden. Divide daffodil bulbs and replant if they are starting to produce less flowers, this is a sign they are becoming crowded.
- Plant up hanging baskets and patio pots with summer bedding but harden off in a sheltered spot.
- $\bullet$  Keep on top of pests and weeds including slugs!
- Trim hedges and topiary and then feed them.
- Keep sowing vegetables out of doors.
- Continue to sow tender vegetables under cover.
- Check greenhouse ventilation and provide shading if necessary.
- Continue pruning trained plums and cherries.
- Mulch strawberries with straw or mulch mats.
- Cut lawns weekly and blitz lawn weeds.
- Remove duckweed and blanket weed from ponds.
- If you have an established pond divide aquatic plants.

# **BEVERLEY FOLK FESTIVAL ANNOUNCES 2023 PROGRAMME!**


Beverley Folk Festival returns once again in 2023, over the weekend of 16-18th June.

be trialling a pop up restaurant. Head over to the Café whilst you're in Beverley and see for yourself how good the coffee and cake really is.






