

# A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM COUNCILLOR LINDA JOHNSON, THE MAYOR OF BEVERLEY

Christmas is the time of year when we should all be able to forget our worries and delight in the gift of the Christ child as we sing well-loved carols, eat far too many mince pies and gaze in wonder at the twinkling Christmas lights.

By the time you read this, I hope your Christmas tree is up, your presents wrapped and a turkey (or vegan equivalent!) in the freezer ready for the oven on Christmas Day.

Sadly, though, this Christmas will be a struggle for many as they try to deal with the cost-of-living crisis caused by political turmoil in the world and at home. It is truly shocking that anyone should have to experience hunger or be unable to pay their fuel bills when they live in one of the richest countries in the world. If you are one of these people, though, help is at hand. Our Cherry Tree Centre, East Yorkshire Foodbank and East Riding of Yorkshire Council are doing their best to ensure no-one goes hungry or suffers fuel poverty and all of our churches, working together as Churches in Beverley, have set up 'warm spaces' for people of all ages to find friendship and support.

Generous people who can afford to are donating money, food and winter clothing to be distributed to anyone in need, not because it's Christmas, but because helping each other is what we do as a society. Others are donating their time to give that warm welcome to anyone who could do with a friendly ear. I've discovered how generous people are in this area whilst I have been Mayor and I thank everyone of them for helping people who need a helping hand. If you are struggling, please don't be afraid to ask for support.

Last year, 2021, we were still restricted in our activities by Covid, but, thank goodness, this year we have been able to get together again!

Who could forget the party Beverley Town Council organised to celebrate the 70th Anniversary of Queen Elizabeth II's accession to the throne? Beverley has never been more blooming or booming!

It was a huge honour to be able to light a beacon in the Queen's honour in Coronation Gardens (where else?) on the evening of June 2nd and, the following day, a great pleasure to welcome the Deputy Lieutenant of the East Riding, Julie Good; the High Sheriff of the East Riding, Jacky Bowes, the Lord Mayor and High Admiral of Hull, Cllr Christine Randall and several other Mayors of East Riding towns to help us celebrate with music, street entertainment and that enormous picnic.

But who would have thought that our Sovereign Lady would be taken from us just 3 short month's later? It was an honour to lead the Minute's silence in Coronation Gardens the day before the funeral, but it was also such a sad event as we all felt a huge sense of loss.

The passing of a Monarch means a new Monarch, though, and I was so proud to represent Beverley as His Majesty King Charles III was proclaimed by High Sheriff Jacky Bowes in both Hull and Beverley. The crowds in Beverley at the proclamation demonstrated the town's regard for our heritage; it was the King's ancestor, Elizabeth 1st, who granted Beverley's charter in 1573. In a world of turmoil, we collectively recognised the national importance of a stable succession and I for one found comfort in the very British pomp and ceremony of the events of that middle week in September.

It will seem strange that this year it will be the King's Christmas Message being broadcast on Christmas Day, but I'll be there, at 3pm, in front of



the TV, listening to what he has to say. I'm sure it will be a fitting tribute to his 'Mummy' and to the happy memories we have of Queen Elizabeth II, as well as perhaps a glimpse into his plans for his reign. After all, we have a Coronation to look forward to on May 6th next year!

The world is ever-changing; it is impossible to predict the future. But the message of Christmas is that there is hope. I hope that you will find peace, love and contentment this Christmastime and, if you are finding life hard, there are better times ahead in 2023.







Now, I do not tell you that to make you in any way feel sorry for yourself as I'm quite sure that many of you could make a case out for saying that, although you do not, and have never suffered the life restrictions of my cousin, you do have other physical problems coupled at this time with increasing financial worries. So what is there to feel happy about right now?

Be assured that we all have at least one thing to be thankful for when all else fails. As the Festive season approaches you can give thanks for still being here to take another step into your personal history book.

My cousin has also had a strong Christian faith all his life, not always linked to any particular church group. guardian, anyone can contribute to one. The power of compounding means just one £3,600 contribution at birth could give their pension saving a massive head start.

## LET'S VISIT HULL'S OLD TOWN HERITAGE PUBS

Hull's Old Town is a pleasure to visit, and the 5 pubs included in the CAMRA guide to the best heritage pubs in Yorkshire, are glittering jewels in the crown. Here, we take a stroll that allows all to be enjoyed, but check websites for the variable opening times.

All are currently open through most of the day at weekends. Handily, all are in close proximity, within 10 minutes staggering time of each other.

We start our exploration at the grand, White Hart on Alfred Gelder Street, and end at the similarly named and venerable, Olde White Harte, snug in its own courtyard off Silver Street.



The White Hart is an exceptionally attractive building, inside and house. Built in 1904, it was formerly the company HQ of much-loved, Hull Brewery. Its curved profile, and striking frontage, are fine sights.

The bar on the left is full of architectural interest, pride of place going to the ceramic bar, one of only 10 surviving in the country. The original glazed bar cupboards, are even rarer.

The rear areas are more modern, but provide fine food, and sports viewing. The outside areas are also well appointed. The pub has a growing reputation for its extensive range of cask, keg and craft beers and ciders, I can recommend the rhubarb variety! The food is top notch, many customers rating their burgers as the best in Hull.



Just over the road, to your right, you enter Hull's historic High Street, full of character at every turn, with striking buildings like Wilberforce House and the text book, Georgian, Maister House. Just

beyond the latter, you reach the distinctive Olde Black Boy.

This is rightly a listed building, dating originally from the mid-eighteenth century. The pub fittings are from 1926.



The Smoke Room, on your right, is one of the great drinking spaces of England: the dark interior can't hide the splendour of the wood and glasswork.

The pub is full of fascinating spaces, upstairs and down. There is even a small roof terrace. The pub has long been noted for its wide range of quality whisky, as well as real ales.

Up an atmospheric alley off Lowgate, we find the Olde Blue Bell. This is a Sam Smiths pub, the Tadcaster based brewery has a merited reputation for running heritage pubs, and providing fine beers at reasonable prices. I am especially fond of their German style wheat beer, this has rightly been called a champagne of beers.

The pub's rich history goes back to the 1790s, and has always been a base for traders and shoppers at the adjacent market. The snug, with its fixed bench seating, is a classic, whilst customers can enjoy the open fire at this time of year.

At the other end of the market, facing Hull Minster is the deservedly popular, Kingston. Sadly, some of its best internal features have been lost by recent refurbishments, but the building itself



is outstanding, designed in 1877 by noted Hull architect William Marshall. It has a distinctive side room, the Tugger's Snug, after the tug boat crews who drank there. The outside seating area is worthy of a grand continental city square, with fine buildings in every direction.

Finally, we arrive at what for most is Hull's most historic and distinctive pub: Olde White Harte. The pub is a trilling mix of stained glass, fine woodwork and fireplaces.

It's biggest historic claim to fame, is the upstairs Plotting Chamber, the alleged place where the parliamentarian governors of Hull, decided to refuse entry to the town to Charles 1, and his royal army - thus precipitating the English Civil War. Purists are sceptical; as the building post-dates this event by 4 decades. The courtyard seating area is especially nice.

The coming weeks of the festive season, are an ideal time to enjoy these gems, just a short train, car or bus ride away for most of us.

May I wish everyone who reads my regular JB articles, my warmest compliments of the season - see you in 2023!



But am I proud? Well I should say not! It's not me that people have never forgot I'm wondrously pretty but matter not a jot


It's Jesus we celebrate every Christmas Day And show our love for him come what may So lets celebrate HIS birth - that's what I say!





## **SNOWY ADVENTURES - THE SEARCH FOR SANTA!**

Christmas can be as exciting and special as the day itself - especially if you decided to embark on an Arctic adventure in search of Santa.

It certainly is one of the most magical and unique experiences you can do. It lends itself very nicely to family groups - enjoying a large log cabin alongside grandparents and/or cousins and family friends.

You can have a private meeting with Santa - having searched for him through the forest. Free time to have family fun in the snow, as well as embarking on husky driven sled rides, reindeer driven sleighs, ice fishing, and hunting for the Northern Lights.

Regardless of which ice room is chosen, guests will sleep comfortably on the ice beds topped with comfortable mattresses and reindeer skins and a thermal sleeping bag. However you decide to spend the festive season I would like to wish you all a very special Christmas, and a very happy new year.

As we look into 2023 I hope to inspire you to explore new places and have new experiences - one of my favourite quotes is that travel is the only thing you can buy that makes you richer. # COUNTRYSIDE MATTERS WITH SAM WALTON

None of us can control the weather and if we could, we would all want something different, to suit our own particular needs.



This year because of the drought, or at least dryish weather, the cost of drying cereals once harvested has more or less been unnecessary. Because of that, we get the full weight of the cereals whereas if we dry the moisture out of them, we have less

weight to sell.

However, the yield may well have been slightly down in some areas but by and large, satisfactory results all round.

However, on other crops, the hottest summer on record has had different effects. A neighbour had some potatoes this year and he desperately wanted rain, so the outcome was a lower yield because of the potatoes being smaller.



Taking all the above into consideration the weather has also had an effect on the vegetables we grow, because of the shortage of water for irrigation.

Cattle and sheep men have been short of grass and have been using some of the hay and silage which they had stored for winter feeding, so what are they going to do if they run out? Will they be able to either afford or justify feeding more expensive

cereals later in the year? You have guessed right, yes is the answer.

It is a strange world we live in, particularly in the farming world, so spare a

thought for the decisions farming has to take, don't whatever you do, take anything for granted, so far as food on your plates is concerned.

Yes, it has been the hottest summer etc but whilst we sit down and enjoy our Christmas Meal lets spare a thought for those who are less fortunate than ourselves and hope that everyone is able to enjoy Christmas.

## IN THE GARDEN...

Welcome to December, the last calendar month of the year and with a mixture of emotions my final 'In the Garden' offering. So, instead of writing specifically about December, I am going to give an overview of the gardening year.

We have four seasons in our gardening year: Spring (March, April, May); Summer (June, July, August); Autumn (September, October, November) and Winter (December, January, February).

These are based on meteorological criteria - temperature, rainfall, day length etc., and as with everything based on the weather, these can become blurred at the edges depending on location.

## Spring – is really made up of three mini seasons.

- The first is as we emerge from winter, there are signs of growth, but plants that flourish need to be frost hardy e.g., Snowdrops and other early spring flowering bulbs. During this time do not be too keen to work the soil as it may still be hard or waterlogged and you will do more harm than good. If you do dig over your beds add some organic feed.
- During the second, day length becomes noticeably longer and frosts less frequent/severe, the grass may need to be mown more regularly and hardy perennials and 'cold' vegetables can be planted, but do not plant out tender plants.
- Finally, as the threat of frost diminishes, you can plant/seed summer annuals and vegetables.
- Throughout spring keep on top of weeds, slugs, snails, and other pests as they appear.

Summer – most of the hard work has been done, summer is about enjoying your garden and maintaining the status quo.

- Trim hedges and prune spring flowering shrubs.
- Dead head flowers in both your borders and containers (this encourages more flower production).
- Feed and water plants in containers (daily) and newly planted shrubs.
- Harvest vegetables and fruit as they become ready.
- Lawns, continue to mow regularly, increasing the mower blade height in dry spells.

Autumn - tidying and looking ahead to next year.

- Deal with fallen leaves and tidy borders.
- Protect vulnerable plants.
- Plant up any gaps in your borders with shrubs.
- Plant spring flowering bulbs.
- Aerate the lawn and give it an autumn feed.

## Winter - get out into the garden when you can

- Mow the lawn lightly and avoid walking on frosted/snowy grass.
- Dig over border if not too wet and 'sticky.'
- Tidy the shed, greenhouse and check/maintain tools and equipment.
- · Look forward to the arrival of spring.





Sessions last for 45 minutes and are just £6 per person including free skate hire. Ice skating can be a lot of fun, especially if everyone is a beginner.








