They usually look most impressive in Autumn but with all the recent rain here they look great for photos right now. I usually take long exposure images to capture the flow of the

If you haven't taken long exposure shots before all you need to get started is a tripod and your camera. A long exposure just keeps the shutter open longer, allowing the moving parts of the image to blur.

This can make it easy to over expose images because it lets in too much light, so if you have any filters you can attach to your lens this will help give you a longer exposure. If not, even a 1 or 2 second exposure will give you some blur.

Even the slightest movement on the camera



exposure can blur everything so if you don't have a shutter release cable, try using the timer so you don't move the






There's usually a lot of wildlife to see as well such as Dippers, Wagtails, Adders and unfortunately plenty of insects so remember to take some insect repellent!

### I'VE BEEN THINKING... SAYS COLIN RAYNOR

August being the true holiday month, Beverley can expect an influx of visitors from all over the world, maybe even from Cottingham.

We were amazed when we came to live in Beverley some sixteen years ago to hear some folks tell us they never came to Beverley. I suspect things have changed over the last few years with the emergence of Flemingate. Two of the big attractions of Beverley continue to be the Parish church of St John and St Martin's, generally known as the Minster, and St Mary's church.

The two churches are at opposite ends of the town. St Mary's is situated along a stretch of road know as North Bar Within and the Minster is a good twenty minute walk, 'as the crow flies', to the other end of town. The walk will take you through the Saturday Market, then through the Wednesday Market and down the cobbles of Highgate where you will see the Minster as it stands tall on your horizon.

You may be fortunate to hear the church clock chime with all ten bells on the quarter hour or even ringing out for a wedding. I was told a few weeks ago, by a couple visiting Beverley for the first time, how much they had enjoyed their visit to our famous Minster.

After further discussion with them I had to tell them they had been to St Mary's but they had appreciated that church which also had a history going back to the early 16th century.

In a book I looked at recently Beverley Minster was named as being among the ten most important Gothic churches in England. Gothic

architecture began in Paris in the 12th century and is really symbolised by pointed arches, stained glass windows, flying buttresses, ribbed walls and tall spires. It isn't just the architecture however that draws people to walk within this hallowed place. It is the fact that over many years the Kings and Queens of our land have also come to worship as have thousands of men women and children.

On October 25th this year there will no doubt be a service of remembrance for the time when King Henry 5th came to Beverley Minster over 600 years ago to give thanks to St John of Beverley (who founded the Minster) for his famous victory at the battle Agincourt in 1451.

Beverley Minster, like many other churches who have existed for centuries, has its own particular slice of history waiting to be discovered by the diligent visitor.

Consider the name of Miss Elizabeth Caroline Hanks, a name I suspect not known to many outside this parish. But if you look carefully you will find a wonderful brass plaque, some two foot by four foot, prominently displayed, and it would seem regularly polished by the Friends of the Minster. I feel sure they value her memory just as much as they do more famous people who have crossed the threshold of this ancient building over the years.

Miss Hanks was the mistress of the Infants School at Beckside when on November 14th 1889 she realised that a fire had broken out in the roof of the church. The plaque states that 'the fire could have caused irreparable damage but due to her quick response the fire was extinguished.'



The plaque goes on to record that Miss Hanks died in late 1890 at the age of 23 years in the town of Prees in Shropshire near the Welsh border. I would encourage you to find time to take a walk around this historical building (still free to enter) and find the plaque relating to Miss Hanks.

The Minster is above all a place of worship and so I will finish with words from a hymn written before MIss Hanks was born, but still sung today...

We love the place O God wherein thine honour dwells

The joy of thine abode all earthly joy excels'

(the tune is Templa Quam Dillecta - 'How lovely are thy temples Lord').

### At a glance.

This inevitably relies on human judgement but is supported by all sorts of technological and data-driven inputs that are designed to provide a competitive edge. Ultimately, we believe good active fund managers have the potential for sustainable long-term outperformance of the wider market, in excess of fees.

The downside is active strategies have a higher cost. Investors must accept the risk that they won't outperform in all market environments and

there may be prolonged periods where the fund underperforms the wider market. In between these extremes lies a range of different strategies which use technology to make investment decisions using mathematical modelling rather than human judgements. This is known as 'active quantitative management'. It can be delivered at a lower cost than a traditional active strategy, but it still retains the potential for better returns than the market will deliver, albeit with no guarantees.







### FANTASTIC FILM (PODCASTS) AND WHERE TO FIND THEM

This month is going to be a little different as many of us will at least get a week relaxing at home or away and if the weather is in our favour, we may even get outdoors. You can watch films outdoors but it is not easy.

The world of podcasts offer an audio alternative to feed that movie fix but there are so many... The Good, the Bad and the Ugly... so to speak. Here I will be your guide only for the good although I will say some of these are "deep dives" and you may have to ask yourself this question "do I feel nerdy?"

For those of you not in the know, there are many different platforms to receive podcasts on your computer, tablet or phone to playback. Most of the music streamers (Spotify, Amazon etc.) have a podcast section as well as various other providers. I suggest just do an internet search for the podcasts or a podcast player and you will find the best way for you to listen but what to choose in this myriad of options?



Film Stories with Simon Brew

Simon Brew is a journalist and author. He publishes a magazine also called Film Stories (with its own website) and does the odd live

show as well as this podcast. It is a very simple production: one man with a microphone who is very well researched. It is not a film criticism podcast but as the title suggests, the story of how a film gets made from the beginning, from wherever the kernel of the idea came to the eventual release and aftermath culturally.

As Simon says, it is very hard to get a film made and the podcast is there to celebrate that achievement. These are not obscure movies but ones you may well know mainly from the 90s onwards. There are two films per episode and titles covered include both versions of the Italian Job, several James Bond films, Big, Paddington, Trainspotting and many, many more in over 300 episodes. It is absorbing and interesting stuff especially if one of your favourites is being covered.

Occasionally, there are special episodes where Simon interviews filmmakers (directors & producers) in a genial and thoughtful way about their careers. A recent episode featured some of the stage interviews he conducts on the live shows. I was particularly moved by his interview with Trevor Hickson who some might remember as children's TV comedy duo, Trevor & Simon. Trevor is now the manager of a very special cinema in London. Medicinema are fully functioning and immersive cinemas built in hospitals to enable long term patients and those with complex needs, to experience the joy and escape that cinema provides. The conversation between Simon and Trevor was funny, emotional and inspiring. Certainly, if such a facility is built near me, I would be signing up as a volunteer.

For me, Film Stories is a must listen podcast (each about an hour) and until a couple of months ago, I would have named it my favourite by a clear margin but, there is a new player on the block.



Down The Back of the Seats In my former life, my duties included looking after cinema social media. I am no expert and so I always had a look at what

other people

were doing,

saying and let's face it copy their ideas. This research brought the Campbeltown Picture House to my attention. Situated in the Mull of Kintyre, it is the oldest purpose built cinema (just celebrated its 110th birthday) in Scotland which is still in operation. This is partly thanks to a community project which saw an extensive refurbishment of the cinema while retaining its gorgeous original architecture. It is on my bucket list to visit sometime.

The cinema's Facebook page could get important messages across in an amusing way (on age restrictions - "shouting at us is not a valid form of ID"), the amazing baking you buy when visiting and highlighted fantastic community initiatives (if you ever wondered where the idea of "the cans film festival" came from, look no further).

The Picturehouse now has a podcast, "Down the Back of the Seats". At time of writing, there are 7 episodes of "Down the Back of the Seats" hosted by cinema manager, Ellen and performer & Bute resident, Alasdair. Differently, it is not about the film but as they say themselves "explores what happens when public and public spaces meet".

Cue some hugely funny stories about the behind the scenes of cinema, theatre and concert hall as well as explaining some of the "mysteries" involved with running a cinema and answering those frequently asked questions. Most importantly, amusingly and never condescending.

The titles of each podcast include a phrase from each episode. No matter how much you try and guess what they could refer to, you will rarely be correct (especially "Holding Open a Fire Door"). Each episode is a lovely precise 30 minutes.




All the Right Movies

Back to films and if you fancy a more in depth, critical analysis and discussion of some classic films then "All the Right Moves" could be for you.

A team podcast with five university friends who look at the making of a movie as well as a dissection of the finished product with a play by play look at the artistry. It can be an interesting two hour listen.

"The Thing", "Inception" and "Who Framed Roger Rabbit" are among the titles to get the detailed examination with the team complimenting each other on their knowledge and bringing a lot of humour and passion to their chat. Occasionally, they have the opportunity to bring filmmakers into



the conversation. On a trivia note, the podcast title is a play on the film "All the Right Moves". A 1983 film which was one of Tom Cruise's first starring roles.



Video Archives Podcast

All the above podcasts are done by enthusiasts and journalists but what of a filmmaker's perspective? If there is one writer/director who is not shy of giving

an opinion, it's Quentin Tarantino. The Video Archives in the podcast name was the rental shop in California where Tarantino worked before his big break.

As with all such stores, it eventually closed and he bought the entire inventory of VHS tapes to add to his collection of film prints and other cinematic detritus. (Quentin even owns his own cinema, The New Beverly in Los Angeles.) His podcast co-hosts are fellow ex-employee, Roger Avary - the co-writer of Pulp Fiction and himself a director along with Avary's film fan daughter, Gala.

The trio watch the original VHS tapes in the collection and begins with the two men discussing the films later joined by Gala who gives a younger female outlook. Films selected are generally from the 1970s and 1980s, given their format, and the discussion can include both the videocassette box and cover as well as the film itself.

Via this podcast, I have discovered some movies I never knew about as well as rewatching films I remember. The enthusiastic debates certainly motivates you to find movies although I must say I differ in tastes from the hosts but I am always entertained by their take and sometimes they have made me a convert. However, I will never have Roger's passion for the James Bond film "Moonraker". As a schoolboy, I had to watch that a multitude of times in my job as a cinema usher. I don't think I have ever been the same.

Whatever type of film fan, I hope you find something to entertain on these summer days. I will return to the movies themselves next month as the nights start to really draw in again.

# WALKING FAST YORKSTINE TESTIVAL 9-22 SEPTEMBER 2023

This September, the Yorkshire Wolds plays host to the 13th Walking East Yorkshire Festival brought together by tourism partners and volunteers across East Yorkshire.

Guided walks around our historic stately homes are always popular. A short walk from Snaith takes us to **Carlton Towers** where we are greeted with tea and cakes in the banqueting hall followed by an informative tour.

Wassand Hall will be providing a tour of their regency house, finishing off with a walk exploring the woodlands and arboretum with views across Hornsea Mere. Secrets of Sewerby Hall and Gardens offers a rich history tour of the hall and grounds.

**Pocklington Canal** will once again be hosting two trips aboard the New Horizons narrowboat where you can spot wildlife along this scenic waterway. Alternatively, we will be taking our first charter on the **Sun Barge** leaving from Beverley Beck up the River Hull.

Walking the Town Beverley guided history walks include When Beverley made a big splash - a walk and talk on the history of shipbuilding along the river Hull. Beverley has talent! will inform you of those residents who have made their mark on Beverley or the Quiet Gardens of Beverley which take you to 10 different gardens dotted around the town centre, each with their own history.





### CARFAN - CADILLAC TYPE 53

Anyone who feels overwhelmed by the amount of technology in modern motor cars really should look at the subject of this issue - a Cadillac Type 53.

This car has no stop lights, indicators or windscreen wipers and as the car is left hand drive, a long pole with a flag on the end is pointed through the car to alert following cars of an imminent lane change.

Produced in 1916 in the United States, the vehicle made its way to North Dakota where it was used as a wedding car before being restored in the early eighties and then it travelled to Phoenix, Arizona when the current owner saw it advertised online accompanied by various photographs

before wisely travelling to see it before parting with any money. Having been owned for 30 years now, very few miles are added to the odometer each year with it now reading only a little over 23,000 miles in total, including a trip half way across France, which must have been quite an adventure.



This model's claim to fame is that it is the first production car to be fitted with a V8 engine which certainly has to be a tricky quiz question. Parts are somewhat difficult to find, apart from tyres and points etc. with most others especially made or repaired.

One feature we can be grateful for is that this was also the first production car to have (from right to left) accelerator, brake, clutch and the handbrake and gearlever in the middle between the seats. If you fancy one on your drive you probably need to travel to U.S.A. and enjoy hunting as they are now very scarce. With only 18,000 manufactured in a single year of production, should you see this car around and about, don't forget that cheery Carfan wave!

The title Just Beverley does not mean that the popular magazine just focuses on Beverley and immediate surroundinas.



At this time of year in particular, a lot of people tend to travel round the area to look at the Wolds, Moors and of course the coast.

Mentioning the coast reminds me of how much of that we have lost in the last 50 years or so, probably 200 yards or more in my lifetime. What reminded me of that was a recent visit to Spurn Point, where I always take any visitors there which we might have. There are sheep and cattle grazing the surrounding areas.



I first went there when

I was 12 when an uncle, who farmed in Holderness and used to keep pigs which were fed on swill (waste food) and every other day he had the swill from Spurn Point Military Camp which was at the far end on the point, collected so I went several times. It is a fascinating place with a fantastic history and played a vital role in the 1939 to 1945.

Recently I went with our Senior Club which is ex Young Farmers on a specially organised tour to hear about the history and to be able to see the damage now done by erosion.

At one time you could drive down there and there was also a railway line. Now you can either walk the almost three miles or go on their Unimog, which drives along the beach until it gets to the bit of road which is still there.

Spurn played a very important role in the last war and to-day what looks almost like a small village down there, is virtually deserted other than the Lighthouse Crew who stay there on their shifts, but the Lifeboat Crew are now across the water near Grimsby. Give it a go.






