# TOM ASTELL ELECTED THE 2

Every year by law, Town Councillors have to select a Chairman from those elected to serve on the Beverley Town Council. At the Annual Meeting of Beverley Town Council, Tom Astell was elected as Chairman and the Mayor of Beverley.

The first recorded Mayor of Beverley was Edward Ellerker in 1573. Councillor Tom Astell became the 419th Mayor of Beverley.

The role of Chairman of the Town Council is to ensure the orderly, lawful transaction of business at Full Council meetings, for which they receive advice and guidance from the Town Clerk.



The Chairman does not act as a leader of the Council or have any more powers than any other individual Councillor.

The role of Mayor is to act as a civic representative of the town and fulfil many traditional and ceremonial duties. The Mayor is often described as the "First Citizen of the Town". Regardless of gender, the title is Mayor, not Mayoress.



The Mayor may select a Mayoress or Consort to accompany them to civic events, but this post has no legal standing or other duties. During the meeting a Deputy Mayor will also be elected.

The term "Chairman" is a legal one - the Local Government Act 1972, which directs how Town Councils are governed, makes no legal provision for the terms "Chairwoman", "Chairperson" or simply "Chair".

The roles of Chairman and Mayor cannot legally be separated, making it a challenging but rewarding responsibility to keep Council meetings in check, whilst also being the official civic representative of the people of Beverley.

Councillor Tom Astell, is Mayor of Beverley 2023-2024, with Councillor David Boynton elected as Deputy Mayor for the period. During the meeting, outgoing Mayor Councillor Linda Johnson thanked former Councillors for their service.

The outgoing Mayor reflected on her two years in office as the first woman to be Mayor of Beverley for two consecutive years.

She commented that the past 12 months had been especially remarkable, as during her time in office she had marked Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee, the sad death of Her Majesty, the Proclamation of King Charles III and his subsequent Coronation celebration.

The outgoing Mayor also spoke of other highlights, including the planting of 1,200 trees in and around Beverley to mark the 1,200th anniversary of the death of our town's founder, Saint John of Beverley. As she departed from her role she thanked her husband, Councillor Graham Johnson, who has acted as her Consort,



her fellow Councillors for their support, her Chaplin Reverend Fran Rhys and the three Town Council Officers and Macebearer for their hard work and dedication to the Town Council.

Councillor Johnson announced that over the past year, she had raised £1,538.30 for Guide Dogs and £400.29 for the Open Doors Project. In addition, £150 was donated to SSAFA last December in lieu of sending out civic Christmas cards

Tom Astell, having previously held the post of Mayor of Beverley in 2020-21, had most of his civic duties cancelled due to the Covid Pandemic.



# 19TH MAYOR OF BEVERLEY

He explained: "One of the duties of being Mayor is to represent Beverley at events and celebrations in other towns, alongside holding a range of civic occasions in Beverley, such as the annual Civic Dinner and Civic Service, plus a host of other community-based events to raise funds for my chosen charities. During 2020-2021 most of the civic occasions ceased, therefore, I am honoured and delighted to have been selected as Mayor of Beverley for 2023-2024. I have lots of ideas for the coming year and look forward to representing the people of our wonderful town to the very best of my abilities."

The newly elected Mayor Councillor Astell presented commemorative town crests to former councillors David Tucker, Chloe Hopkins and Ian Gow, and thanked Ann Willis and Duncan Jack in their absence.

In particular, Councillor Astell noted that Mr Jack was first elected to the Town Council in 1999 and had been the longest serving member until his recent retirement from post. He commented on the amazing service he had given the Beverley community over the past 23 years.

Newly-elected Town Councils are Councillors Bob Morgan, John Rebecchi, Adrian Ramsdale, Eliza Whitaker, Pedro Regina and Cheryl Giles, along with Peter Astell, Graham Johnson, Tom Astell, Alison Healy, David Horsley, Linda Johnson, David Boynton and Denis Healy who were reelected.

In his role as the new Mayor, Councillor Astell welcomed them all and promised residents both he and they would work hard to do their very best for the town and people of Beverley.

## I'VE BEEN THINKING... SAYS COLIN RAYNOR

As the month of June brings with it glorious days of sunshine (maybe not too hot) and we hope for times of enjoyment and laughter that will lift our spirits, I hope I do not appear to be too curmudgeonly this month.

I have been thinking for a while however that perhaps, in some aspects, I am viewing life a little differently from others. Let me explain and then maybe you might consider your own view.

There are some phrases which I have known all my life and so know just when to use them to enhance the meaning of a conversation for instance. One such phrase, which I hear less frequently these days and which I do hope is not going to fade way from modern speech is "common sense".

I can recall my father telling me to "use your common sense lad" or even, "show a bit of common sense" which suggested that there were



varying degrees of this "common sense" that could be applied to resolve the difficulty I had got myself into. That did seem to be the reason for this phrase being used. A situation had arisen and it seemed there was no easy way of resolving the dilemma

It could be applied to many everyday incidents such as not standing in the pouring rain and getting wet through when you could get inside and keep dry.

Common sense relied on simple sound principals such as don't spend more than you earn, and accepting that life is not always fair. Maybe sometimes you are at fault in a given situation, so common sense says admit it and move on.

Therein maybe lies the demise of common sense. An increase in well intentioned regulations has come into being which does not afford the principle of common sense to apply any more. Consider reports of a school teacher losing their job for reprimanding an unruly pupil or a six year old being charged with sexual harassment for kissing a classmate.

Common sense had an element of simplicity to it that seems to be frowned on today because of the expressed need to look at a situation from every possible angle.

Whilst this may still apply in some situations common sense took a severe knock when churches became businesses and appeared at times to project the need for finance before what the local community expects from a place



of worship. Or consider the case of the man who tried to defend himself from a burglar but who was subsequently taken to court for assaulting the intruder to his house.

One of the most bizarre episodes I read about was of the person who failed to realise that the coffee they had just purchased was quite hot. Having spilt it down their clothes they sued and were rewarded with a huge settlement.

As I suggested at the start this is my view and maybe I've got it all wrong and maybe common sense has had its day. Perhaps you could get together with friends and discuss it as you enjoy that cool drink in the long summer sunshine. Happy days...

## IN THE PICTURE WITH JOSH

As we head into June and the longest days of the year, the sun sets more towards the North West, meaning that through the height of summer, you can watch the sunset at places along the coast like Whitby Harbour, Saltwick Bay and Filey Brigg.

The sunsets themselves are usually impressive enough, but I often find the early evening light or the warm glow after the sun has dipped below the horizon, provides the most interesting light for photography. Even the blue hour creates some beautiful colours!

The warmer weather also brings out the plants, insects and reptiles which are hidden away through the colder seasons. Whenever I'm out on the North York Moors through the Summer, I always try to walk quietly to find Adders basking in the morning sun, or Slow Worms along the rivers and amongst the undergrowth.

Many of the flowers are also in bloom this time of year and you may see flowers like this

lens with me on walks as there are so many flowers and insects to see.



# Dogger Bank South Offshore Wind Farms

RWE Renewables UK (RWE) has published a Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) for the Dogger Bank South (DBS) Offshore Wind Farm Projects, in accordance with Section 47 of the Planning Act 2008.

The purpose of the SoCC is to clearly explain how RWE intends to consult with local communities in the vicinity of the Projects. It sets out how information relating to the consultation can be viewed and how people are able to formally respond with their feedback. ## SHANE ASKS, DID YOU KNOW? THE HISTORY OF FISH AND CHIPS

Shane Cooper, Lincoln Way's Fish and Chip man, has been frying fish and chips for over 23 years and manages Stuarts of Driffield Fish and Chip Shop on Lincoln Way. We welcome Shane with his column "Did you know"?

Although fish and chips have been a staple food in Britain (and other commonwealth nations over the decades), its origins are not entirely clear and has been much debated.

Fried fish was first introduced and sold by the East End Jewish culture; however, chips became increasingly popular in Lancashire and Yorkshire. Some say that during the 17th century, the western settling Jews would have prepared fried fish similar to 'Pescado frito' which is coated in flour. The fish would then be dipped in batter (flour mixed with liquid, usually water, sometimes beer). Others believe that the battered fish first appeared as early as the 16th century, when Spanish and Portuguese Jewish settlers were firstly living in the Netherlands before staying in the UK. The day of rest in Jewish culture (Shabbat) was on Fridays and so the fish was be eaten on this day.

For some of us, Friday is still a day for fish and chips! Over in Britain, the potato appeared during the 16th century, where the first published recipe for something similar to what is now known as 'chippy chips', was in 1817.

EFIRES TO SERVICE STATES

According to some research, the first fish and chip shop was opened in London around 1860 by a man named Joseph Malin. He sold 'fried fish in Jewish fashion'.

Others argue that it was in fact the entrepreneur John Lees who first combined fish and chips by way of setting up a hut in the industrial market of Oldham, Lancashire,

around 1863. Since fish and chips had lived separately, decades before this time, it may be that they have in fact co-existed but never popularised.

During the 1870s, the earliest purpose-built fishing vessel was created by David Allen and so this marked the beginning of the fish industry we know today, due to the development of trawl fishing in the North Sea. Fish and chips became the staple



meal across the British working classes and the development of railway connections meant that distribution of fish reached far and wide. The deepfried chip has been mentioned in many literatures including: A Tale of Two Cities (1859) and Oliver Twist (1837) by Charles Dickens and also George Orwell's The Road to Wigan Pier (1937).

The modern day 'chippy' has its roots in the UK and started with a large cauldron of cooking fat heated on coals. This later evolved into the traditional 'fish and chip shop' (early 1920s) where people used newer ways to fry fish and chips and also added the customer counters and food wrapped in paper. Well, we don't wrap in newspaper anyone, as that's most likely a health hazard by today's standards!

Fish and chips became so important to Britain, that the supply was safeguarded during the first and second world war. It was one of the few foods not to be rationed. Fish and chips continued to be popular over the decades and so in 1988 The National Fish and Chips Awards was created. Fish and chips continue to be a good old staple in the U.K. and we now have several of them in most towns and cities. How can we not think of fish and chips when we are at the seaside, or on Good Friday every year! And that good old combination of protein and carbs means we can eat them as a treat. Well, it's definitely good for the soul!



Lynne Auton MD of Stipendia, won a Bronze medal in her age and weight category at the European Masters, held in Southern Ireland, while Carol Marshall, Head Mistress at Wawne Primary School became European Champion with a Gold in her age and weight category. We asked the ladies 10 questions.

#### Q1 - How do you start the day?

Carol: Three alarms, a high protein breakfast and cup of black tea.

Lynne: Competition day - depends where the competition is, so would be either a drive to the venue with an early get up or wake up in a hotel. There would be a weigh in to ensure I was under the correct weight limit, followed by a high protein/high carb breakfast, usually chicken with pasta, a bagel, protein shake. Normal day - up at 5.30am (only one alarm - do not snooze!!), get ready, sort out lunch and then eat a high protein breakfast. Depending on how close to competition, depends on what I eat.



Q2 - How did you get into weightlifting?
C: I have always participated in sport from a very young age, intially gymanastics, swimming and dancing, then athletics where I went on to represent Great Britain and then Olympic Weightlifting, again competing for Great Britain. I then took a break for 16 years and

came back to Olympic

Weightlifting in 2017, with absolutely no intention of competing; that lasted all of 6 months as my competitive side took over, now I train every day and competed at least four times a year.

*L*: My personal trainer advised that as I was "getting on a bit" I should consider weight bearing exercises rather than cardio! I have always been involved with sports, either running, hockey or just gym training.

#### Q3 - What are your ambitions in work & in sport?

C: I would like to take early retirement from education and then set up a training facility coaching children and teenagers Olympic lifting and strength training to support their safe technique development and their chosen sport. I would like to medal at the World Masters Weightlifting Championships in August 2023.

*L*: Work - to continue growing my business with an aim to retire happy and healthy. Sport - would love to increase building my strength, both physically and mentally, and aim for new personal bests in both lifts.

#### Q4 - What music do you listen to before you lift? How do you motivate vourself?

C: Relaxing music as I start the warm up process but my ultimate lifting song and one which supported my British record and success at the Europeans is Guns and Roses, Sweet Child O' Mine, the intro of this song is fantastic.

L: I have a competition play list which is a mixture of 70's, 80's and 90's music including rock and pop. More relaxing music to warm up to, then more rock songs before going out to lift. My motivation comes from keeping fit and healthy and working to my best.

#### Q5 - Who do you look up to - work and leisure?

C: In work I actually admire the children and the resilience they show and determination they have to succeed, even at just the smallest of things, they inspire me and remind me of that no fear attitude we all had a child but seem to lose as we get older. In leisure, I don't admire anyone specifically but I do admire people who take responsibility for themselves and their life and get out there and fight to achieve no matter what life throws at them, no excuses, just pure determination and grit.

*L*: Leisure - my fitness and nutrition coaches, Adam and Sam Travis. They not only run a successful gym and nutrition business in Stalybridge, but look after their family and have time to send powerful, uplifting messages and check in every week with their gym family. L: In training this would be chicken and pasta. As a treat I love to go out for a steak and a bottle of wine, or a Thai meal.


### Q7 - Have you always been competitive?







# CARFAN - THE ALFA ROMEO SPINFR

The subject of this month's column will be familiar to anyone who has seen the film The Graduate - an Alfa Romeo spider.

Whilst the car took second billing to the Simon and Garfunkel soundtrack, this particular vehicle was first choice for a member of the Belgian royal family before making its way to the U.K. in 2001.

Alfa is an acronym of Anonima Lombarda Fabbrica Automobili and in keeping with the film theme, to paraphrase Michael Caine - not a lot of people know that, with the Romeo part referring to one of the founders, being added



in 1920. The model featured is a Series 4 originally registered in Padua in 1991 and has clocked up 73,000 miles so far, sharing a garage with a Series 2 spider and this undoubtedly makes the owner a bit of an Alfafan as he has previously owned another! It has benefited from a repaint, new hood and a fast-road suspension upgrade.

Owning any Alfa can be challenging to say the least and the current owner is keen to keep it in as good condition as possible by taking advantage of the winter months to address minor dents/marks and clean the interior. Should you wish to have a Spider in your garage, be prepared to spend in the region of £13,000 depending on the model type but great caution is recommended as there is a surprisingly large amount available and "Buyer Beware certainly applies here so having it thoroughly checked beforehand could save a lot of pain in the wallet. Research shows that this is a rare sight on our roads nowadays, probably due to rust and poor Italian build quality, so if you should be lucky enough to see one of the approximately 700 of all types still on the road don't forget that cheery Carfan wave!



# **DISCOVERING SKERNE**

This is such a little-known, hidden delight, I've had to think long and hard about sharing it, but such is my regard for the discerning readers of Just Beverley, here, I do so.

Skerne Wetlands, is a 45 hectare oasis of nature on our doorstep, dissected by the sublime chalk stream that is the River Hull in its upper reaches. It is based around 80 ponds of a former trout farm, and absolutely teems with birdlife - including the thrilling spectacle of marsh harriers.

This Yorkshire Wildlife reserve is not marked by road signs, you have to seek it out, but it is all the more delectable for that. There is a parking area for half a dozen cars at the end of a mile of access lane. It runs from just east of the church in the quiet village of Skerne, 2 miles from Driffield or Cranswick. Postcode of the nearby Cleaves Farm YO25 9HU.



The access track is quite bumpy, and you might prefer to walk from the village. I have visited 3 times in recent months, there is always something new to experience.

Just to the right of the parking area with its handy information board, is a fine area of reed beds and pools, here a hide allows you to seek out the mightily impressive marsh harriers. In late March, we saw three, presumably a pair and its offspring, their wingspans are enormous.

From here, you can cross the bridge over the river, then take lovely paths to north and south. In early summer, the crystal clear waters will be full of water crowfoot. There are nice benches en route, sit, be patient, and you may well see kingfishers darting along the stream.

This is also otter country, but you will need to be there early or late in the day to see them, water voles keep more sociable hours. You can wander upstream for almost a mile, before access ends - there is even a northern section to the reserve, which can be accessed from the road at Wansford Bridge





On my visits, I have only ever come across a couple of other visitors, it's a place of rare beauty and solitude. Go with camera, binoculars, and a picnic on a fine day, for a slice of heaven right here in the East Riding.






