WORLD DIABETES DAY

Internationally recognised as an official United Nations Day, World Diabetes Day takes place every year on November 14 with the aims of universal health coverage for diabetes, spreading awareness of the condition, and giving an annual platform to promote diabetes advocacy.

Diabetes is a serious, long-term (chronic) condition where a person's blood glucose level is too high because either their body doesn't produce enough insulin, the insulin it produces isn't effective, or their body can't produce any insulin at all. Everyone needs insulin to live.

November 14 is a significant date in the diabetes calendar as it marks the birthday of the man who co-discovered insulin, Frederick Banting. Along with Charles Best, Banting discovered insulin in 1922 and as one of the 20th century's greatest medical breakthroughs, insulin is still the only effective treatment for type 1 diabetes.

The two main types of diabetes are type 1 and type 2, and both are as serious as each other. With type 1 diabetes, the body's immune system attacks and destroys its cells that produce insulin, meaning the pancreas can't produce any insulin at all. Type 1 can't be prevented and the cause is still unclear.

With type 2 diabetes, the body does not produce enough insulin, or the body's cells do not react to insulin. The person's body still breaks down carbohydrate from food and drink, turns it into glucose and the pancreas responds by releasing insulin. However, because this insulin can't work properly, their blood sugar levels keep rising. Most people need medication to manage their blood sugar levels.

Type 2 diabetes is far more common than type 1, and in the UK around 90% of all adults living with diabetes have type 2, but there are other types.

These include gestational diabetes, which some women develop during pregnancy, and other rarer types including type 3c, LADA, MODY and more. World Diabetes Day was initiated to generate



conversations about diabetes, such as the fact that even a century after it was discovered, insulin and other fundamental aspects of diabetes care remain inaccessible to those who need them to live.

All over the world, people struggle to survive because they can't afford or get access to their life-saving insulin, blood glucose strips, meters or basic healthcare needed to manage the condition. This leads to complications such as diabetic ketoacidosis (DKA), rationing insulin, and sometimes death.

In the UK, the NHS provides people with diabetes structured care for every type and help at every stage, ensuring they get the support they need for life. This is different to America, where the #insulin4all campaign was launched in the lead up to World Diabetes Day in 2014 to help raise awareness of how the US healthcare system and the price of insulin puts many people with diabetes in danger.

Banting and Best sold the insulin patent to the University of Toronto for just \$1, saying "Insulin does not belong to me, it belongs to the world". With rising prices, one vial of insulin can cost American diabetics between \$175 and \$300 per vial, yet most people with diabetes need 3 or more vials per month, which leads to insulin rationing.

There is currently no permanent cure for either type 1 or type 2 diabetes, but there are ways some people with type 2 can put their diabetes into remission. World Diabetes Day promotes vital research projects to transform treatment and care, and find a cure for both type 1 and type 2 diabetes. Find out more at www.diabetes.org.uk

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

After more than four years of continuous warfare during the First World War, on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918 all the guns on the Western Front finally fell silent.

Every year since 1918, Remembrance Sunday has been commemorated in November and is a national opportunity to honour all those who have died at war defending Britain. It is traditionally marked with



the wearing and symbolism of poppies. In its tradition, a two-minute period of silence is observed throughout the country at 11am, with church services and other ceremonial gatherings take place during the day.

Remembrance Sunday always falls on the second Sunday in November, meaning this year it will be commemorated on Sunday November 14. It comes alongside the annual events of 11 November, the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice which marked the end of the First World War in 1918

The National Service of Remembrance, which is held at The Cenotaph in Whitehall, London, on Remembrance Sunday, provides a physical reminder of all those that have served and sacrificed, including British and Commonwealth soldiers, sailors, airmen and women all represented, together with members of the emergency services and civilians. It ensures that no one is forgotten.

The reason poppies are used to remember those who have given their lives in battle is because they are the flowers which grew on the battlefields after World War One ended.

The money raised from poppy donations is used to help servicemen and women who are still alive, whose lives have been changed by the wars they fought in.

LET'S TAKE A TRIP TO -POCKLINGTON

Pocklington has been aptly described as the classic English market town. With some 9000 inhabitants and expanding suburbs, it is large enough to support a good retail and leisure mix, yet small enough to feel notably local, individual and friendly.




Favourably positioned, almost equidistant between York and Beverley and 18 miles out east along the A1079, it is also blessed with the glorious countryside of the Wolds to the north. This all makes for a fine place to spend a few hours shopping and strolling followed by

some refreshment at the many fine pubs and cafes. Free parking is usually not a problem, or you can use the regular X46 bus service for the pleasant 45 minute trip to and from Beverley.

As one might expect, the most rewarding shopping is around the large Market Place and the adjacent lanes. It is especially striking how the buildings merge with the churchyard of the fine church with its grand 120 feet high tower. Tuesdays, being market day, are a great time to visit, and

galleries, gift shops and antique shops are well represented, whilst the old-fashioned sweet shop is understandably popular. Like most towns nowadays there are perhaps too many charity shops, but the ones here are very good. Laverack's butchers, bakers and deli also has a well-



deserved high reputation. The town Arts Centre has a varied and interesting programme of live theatre, music and cinema, for example, at the end of October there is a Harry Potter themed production. Given its recent growth, with many residents commuting to work in York, it is very regrettable that the town lost its rail connection over 50 years ago. The handsome station has been put to good use though, as a sports hall for the prestigious private school once attended by William Wilberforce.



The town's most notable tourist attraction is Burnby Hall Gardens, but it does require an entry charge. These are at their best during the summer when the wonderful water lilies are blooming, but there is always plenty to eniov.

I would suggest stretching your legs with a stroll on the the hills and woods behind the town where you will be rewarded by excellent views. If you walk a further mile or drive there you can enjoy for free the fabulous grounds of Kilnwick Percy Hall, one of the lesser-known gems of the East Riding. This fine classical Georgian mansion is now a Buddhist centre, and its World Peace Cafe is marvellous, as are the church, woods and lake in the rolling grounds. So maybe take a trip out soon to this lively little town with so much to offer. Ian Richardson.

COAST 2 COAST WITH WILSON WHEELS

Last month, Nathan beat his target time to complete his Coast to Coast cycle challenge, cycling from Morecambe to Bridlington and raising over £2800 for Brain Tumour Research.

Nathan set off at 6.30am on the day of his challenge to ride from Morecambe and arrive in Bridlington for 6pm before the sky turned dark.



The route was approximately 180 miles, which he aimed to complete in 12 hours in one day, but he smashed his target time and finished the ride in 11 hours 30 minutes. Prior to this the longest ride Nathan had cycled this year was only 60 miles, and usually cyclists aim to complete this route across two or three days.



Nathan averaged 17.7mph on the journey, had a moving time of 9 hours, and climbed 8000ft without technical or mechanical changes. Everything went to plan on the day. As the charity is very close to his family's heart, Nathan had lots of support along the ride which was crucial for such a tough challenge. He was joined on the full route by Jason Brooks, and Chris and James Robinson joined him from Patley Bridge for 10 miles.

Mark Etherton, the team rider, joined in from Stamford Bridge to Lund.

Nathan's dad, Paul Wilson, was also following on a motorbike for the full journey, along with his mum and Barry in a support vehicle carrying vital supplies...

most importantly chocolate, not for Nathan but to keep mum happy! Friends and family were waiting at the finishing spot to welcome him home.

The current amount raised is £2800 but this can go up as donations are still open. Well done to Nathan for taking up the huge challenge, and to Jason who gave full support and encouragement for the whole journey.

NNY WREN DRAWS REFLECTS ON BEING AWARD-WINNING

As part of Art & Soul's one year birthday party to celebrate the anniversary of moving into Flemingate, Jenny Wren Draws took home not one, but two special awards on the evening, which took place at Art &Soul creative hub in Beverley.

Winning one of two Artist of the Year awards, along with Seller of the Year for a Large Space, Jenny's hard work navigating her way through the pandemic as a small business has paid off.

She said: "Being part of the fabulous creative community at Art and Soul has been such a positive focal point for me throughout the last year, especially amidst the upheaval and uncertainty of the pandemic. It's been a lot of hard work, but a real privilege to be part of. I was surprised but absolutely delighted to receive the awards, especially as there are so many talented creatives and small businesses there".



After discovering her love of drawing and creating at an early age, Jenny was bought a watercolour paint set by her supportive mum and dad when she turned 12, which is what really set her off on her artistic journey.

She quickly began teaching herself different styles and techniques, painting pictures for family gifts that were very often of birds. Jenny has always loved to draw British wildlife. As a keen wildlife watcher and photographer, she takes much inspiration from the natural world and spends as much spare time as possible out and about with her binoculars and camera. Her goal is to share her personal enjoyment of escaping into nature to observe and learn about the natural world by converting those experiences into art. There are some fantastic places for wildlife in East Yorkshire which have encouraged her love for detail.

She says: "I try to create very intimate, detailed pieces which make the viewer slow right down and draw them in to take time to look at the detail; just like we loved to do as children, but don't seem to find time to do as busy adults. I have always loved the tiniest details that you have to actively go looking for, like a hidden treasure! You can't find a better subject for detail than the tiny intricacies of the natural world".

If you have seen Jenny's work or follow Jenny Wren Draws on social media, it's no secret she loves watercolour, which she credits to that first paint set. After a long break from creating however, in 2018 she made the switch to drawing with fine liner pens, using her own wildlife photography as a basis for some new work.

"I was drawn to the simplicity of pen and paper," she says, "trying to go back to that illustrative style I loved as a child. It was a very different way of working from watercolour painting, but it felt like a fresh start.

"My first pen drawings were of Little Owls as I had managed to take some great reference photos at a local Little Owl colony just outside Beverley. Then a few little mice crept in

and they seem to have taken on a very adventurous life of their own".

She has received lots of positive comments and messages from people all over the UK and beyond who have bought her work for themselves or as a gift for loved ones.

She says: "It's very rewarding to imagine something and be able to convey that in pen on paint to the viewer, but I think I get the most pleasure when I hear how much joy my artwork brings to other people. That makes me really happy".

Jenny is keen to keep developing her unique artistic style, and is now introducing colour pieces after dusting off her 'trusty watercolours' again.

She has found it rewarding to find a way of using both the pen and paint



techniques together. While she continues to enjoy creating and sharing her work, she would also love to look at writing and illustrating her own book - if only she could find the time!

I recently read a quote by John Humphreys (who after 18 years has just passed on the chair of 'Mastermind' to Clive Myrie) which stuck in my mind. It went like this: 'writers should not aim at being possible to understand but at always being impossible to misunderstand'.

So my hope is that you clearly understand the connection between to the two events I am going to put before you now.

November 22nd 1963. This was the day that Lee Harvey Oswold assassinated the American President John F Kennedy in Dallas, Texas.

One of those moments in life when you always remember where you were. The shooting took place at midday but it wasn't until 6.30pm that the news was made public in this country (how different from today).



I was 25 and working in a textile mill in Huddersfield and I was at the mill's annual dinner. It was the mill owner who told us, in the middle of our meal, about the shooting of the President. Why do I remember it so clearly? It was the first assassination I knew about in my lifetime, others I had only read about in history books.

Secondly, although I was never very politically minded, and still aren't, I shared the hope that many people had at that time, that this young President and his wife were going to usher in a new generation for a brave new world, but now he was dead. Would he have risen to the challenges before him in his time in office? We will never know but I do know I felt sadness at the death of a person I had never met.

November 22nd 1984. By this time I was Senior Fostering officer for Dudley Social Services in the

June Bowers was a 'mature student' and had been on placement with my team for the last 8 weeks. She was due to leave us on that day but had gone on a visit with one of the team to meet a foster carer. I took a telephone call in the afternoon from a neighbour of June's informing me that June's husband had collapsed and died. We did know that June's husband was not a healthy man but this was totally unexpected.

I drove to the foster home and took June to the hospital. I'm not sure to this day what words I used to convey the tragic news of her husband's death. I do know she told me she had been expecting something of this kind for some time.



Did she say that for my peace of mind as well as her own? I'm not sure.

I left her with friends and relatives and although we talked on the telephone later, we never met again. We had intended to have a party in the office to say farewell to someone we had all come to like but that didn't happen of course.

A few years later I heard of a social worker named Bowers holding an important position in social work and I tried to convince myself it would be June.

Two very different events linked by the same date and by the same outcome, loss of life. As the writer I assure you I gained in my understanding of life from both sad events. I hope as the reader you can take this understanding for yourself.



COUNTRYSIDE MATTERS WITH SAM WALTON

I have no idea how many countries there are in this weird and wonderful world, and I do wonder if they all have a different method of farming or producing food.



I have mentioned parts of Africa and Denmark so far, which proved quite a contrast, so thought I would have a look at what happens in Thailand next.



Thailand is the same size as France but totally different as you would expect. There is a massive family farming businesses around in the local villages where most houses have maybe a cow for milking or half a dozen pigs, plus hens running around. With the climate always being warm, there is no need for

fancy buildings, which you would mostly see on small family farms growing a few veg and selling eggs in a local market, where they take their produce there on the back of a motorcycle as well as carrying the wife and kids at the same time.

That they are quite clever there is no doubt. I have seen many a farm where they had maybe six or seven sows in very basic wooden pens, or a dozen weaner pigs being fattened for either the family or to feed another family who



don't have pigs. The dung and the urine from these pens dribble down into a pond which is full of fish. Topping the pond up is not a problem as they have



a rainy season there and when it rains it pours, believe me. The lagoon is then used for watering some of their crops, so I suppose the dung from the pigs helps those too, but I was never very sure how that made the fish taste.

Thai people are so natural; they live day by day, have no burning

ambition to travel the world, live a very simple life and are probably closer to nature than we are here. They work hard in their fields and never seem to have a day off, but they all make time to go and pray in front of a statue of a Buddha every day.

Away from the villages there are different farms where village people go to work and there is quite a bit of machinery around, including a combine for rice and I have seen several excellent piggeries, but more of that next time. Thailand produces thousands of tons of rice. and you can always see the barges coming down the river in Bangkok on the way to the docks further south. There are also specialist prawn farms, which I think Thailand is number two in the world for. One thing they do have is a million sows, which is more than twice as many as we have, and they have some cracking pig units too. It is not all backyard and peasant type farming, they have both wealthy and poor.



IN THE GARDEN... NOVEMBER

November is a quiet month activity wise in the garden - although the weather often has other ideas, we move from the bright hues of autumn colour that may still be lingering at the beginning of the month and then tumble into winter at its close. Colour from flowers will be scarce, but replaced by berries, variegated evergreen foliage, and decorative bark on trees, seed heads and grasses.

Tasks and Tips for November...

- Continue to clear up leaves and compost if applicable. Don't allow them to stay on the lawn as this will lead to bare patches and clear them from nooks and crannies, slugs and snails will overwinter in them especially if they are dry!!
- Tidy up roses and any other shrubs by clearing old stems and dead foliage don't overdo this as grasses and seed heads can look very attractive in the depths of winter (especially with a frost on them) and they will provide food and shelter for the smaller creatures in the garden.
- Aerate (spike) the lawn, give it a light cut and apply an autumn feed. Autumn feed differs from the spring/summer feeds, containing a different ratio of nutrients which enhance root development, helping your lawn get off to a flying start next spring. Don't apply any feed if frost is forecast.
- Protect tender plants using horticultural fleece.
- November is your last chance to plant spring flowering bulbs plant bulbs at 2 to 3 times their own depth for best results.
- November is a good month to plant a hedge; bundles of bare root hedging plants will become available in nurseries and garden centres. It is also a good time to transplant any shrubs or trees that maybe not 'quite where you want them' in the garden.
- Dig over bare soil in the vegetable garden when weather permits. If done early in the month the rain and frost over winter will help to break up the soil and digging will be easier in the spring. However, don't trample on the soil if it is wet enough to stick to your boots as you will end up compacting it, which will do more harm than good.

Well, I think that's about it for this month - just a couple of things to add; if you are having a bonfire (for the 5th November or just tidying up) take care and check that no small creatures i.e. hedgehogs, have decided to make a home at the base and please don't leave your carved out pumpkins where hedgehogs can eat them (it makes them very poorly, dehydrating them and then they sadly perish).
