

Wondering whether you need to complete a tax return? We asked Lynne Auton to help you out.

The deadline to register for Self Assessment if you're self employed, a soletrader, a partner or in partnership of (not self employed) is October 5, 2022. You need to submit your paper self assessment tax returns before the deadline on October 31, 2022.

It is important to submit your online self assessment tax return and state that you want HMRC to collect underpaid tax through your PAYE code. The deadline for this is December 30, 2022. You have until January 31, 2023 to submit online self assessment tax returns, don't forget!

On his final jump, he managed an impressive 4.64m jump to take the prestigious U13 Long Jump title in what is only his third ever competition.

Guy said "I was really pleased to be able to put some good jumps in and delighted when the last jump came together. It was a really close competition, so I am very happy to take the gold".



ABOUT BEVERLEY

I run costumed guided walking tours of Beverley - you might have seen me at the Market Cross (I'm the one in 17th century costume). I used to be a tour guide with the National Trust, and now I enjoy showing people around the town where I was born.

In this regular column I explore Beverley's history, month by month.

On 20th September 1188 (the eve of the feast of St Matthew, as it happens) there was a fire in Beverley that destroyed much of the town and caused considerable damage to the Minster. Roger of Howden wrote '...the whole town of Beverley together with the noble church of the Blessed John the Archbishop was burnt'. The wooden buildings and thatched roofs meant a fire could catch easily and take hold quickly.

It's likely that the damage to the church was severe, as the bones of St John were lost and not re-discovered until 9 years later.

This and the collapse of the central tower in 1213 (possibly weakened by the fire 25 years earlier?) led to extensive re-building that resulted in the glorious church we see today. Work started at the east end, where damage from the fire had been most extensive. Stone from the old church was reused, which is why Norman elements are included alongside the Early English architecture. Good to know that 'Reduce, re-use, recycle' has such a long history.

Walk with me through 1,300 years of history. Tours run on Fridays at 11am and 2pm from April to October.

JACK RAISES EVEN MORE!

10-year-old Jack McKenzie Fletcher has been raising money since 2019, despite living with several disabilities including autism, which makes each day difficult to navigate.

Jack is part of #thecrew raising money for Children's Air Ambulance, and despite the pandemic hitting Britain hard, nothing has got in his way.

On the August 6, 2022 Jack held an event on Flemingate which he arranged and planned with help from his mum and his nannie.

The event included a fantastic raffle, tombola, bake sale and merchandise sales, and Jack raised £654.50. He still has items for sale and auction so he is still hoping to hit the £1000 target even though this total now means he has raised more than he did last year.

Jack is currently at the platinum stage of fundraising and really wants to become a high flyer raising £3500 and beyond for the charity, which he states "he loves raising money to help poorly babies and children like himself and it makes him feel good to help others".

He really wants the charity to be noticed more as they only rely on kind donations from the public and #thecrew members fundraising in all kinds of ways.



His family said: "As a family we are so proud of Jack. Raising money is an amazing achievement and we hope that Jack's story can encourage other children to follow in his footsteps and do more kind stuff for each other that will benefit amazing charities like the children's air ambulance".

"Jack has been disabled since he was 18-monthsold and his struggles are hard to deal with for him and he can get very upset and distressed but keeping his mind active really boosts his emotions and makes him happy. We love Jack millions and want him to know that he is amazing and our superstar".

COULDN'T WE ALL DO WITH A BIT MORE CONFIDENCE

One thing I absolutely love helping people with, and that underpins most of the work that I do as a hypnotherapist is increasing confidence levels. Whether it's the confidence to give up smoking, lose weight or give up an ingrained habit or phobia, being able to enjoy each day with that confident spring in your step that makes life worth living.

The definition of confidence is "the feeling or belief that one can have faith in or rely on someone or something" and self-confidence is what I'm really helping people achieve as a belief in oneself then rubs off on the world and the ability to have confidence in everything going on in the world, especially in uncertain times.

Anxiety goes away and a confident outlook on life helps us to look for all the positives in the people, places and things that we encounter on a daily basis

Of course, the challenge for me is, how do you notice that your confidence has increased as you're searching for an absence of something... an absence of fear, anxiety, sweaty palms when you go into a meeting, sleepless nights before the monthly board meeting or a feeling of impending doom when thinking about meeting a particular person or attending a challenging event.

I often talk about how we take on fears for a positive reason - if someone we trusted as a very small child and gave us lots of good advice then goes running out of the bathroom because there's a spider in the bath then we take on the belief that spiders are very, very scary and dangerous and

we need to avoid them at all costs

Of course, unless you're living in the Australian Outback or rain forests of Brazil, spiders in this country are not to be feared on a life-threatening level. However, the belief that spiders are very scary has gone in alongside many other positive learnings, on a "survival" level and it's very hard, if not possible to "unthink".

If someone relates to a spider phobia, I throw this into the hypnotherapy session as I did last week with a client and here's the feedback I received yesterday...

"Just wanted to say a huge thanks for seeing my daughter last week - I'm really hopeful you've made a big difference to her going forwards. As you said it may be difficult to initially see any change regarding her phobia but you also worked on her fear of spiders. Well that night as she was going to bed she dealt with 3 small spiders herself!! That's never happened before and she was so nonchalant about it!" Job done!

Later today I'll be doing a second session with an otherwise confident and highly competent gentleman who in all other aspects of life has no issue with confidence having run an international business, however, the forthcoming best man's speech was causing him some anxiety. His fear is that he will freeze, stumble over his words etc was causing him anxiety.

My hope for him is that he will be able to enjoy not only delivering the speech but the whole day and run up to it, knowing that he is with a group of



friends, able to confidently ad lib, respond to any wise-cracks and generally have a great time.

I've often heard said "If you love what you do, you'll never work a day in your life" and I'm lucky enough to be able to do that and also to help others to find what it is in life that they love doing and live by their own values and beliefs and really get the most out of life with passion and with confidence.

Mindfulness can help with anxiety and if you're curious about mindfulness, every Monday evening I run an online mindfulness session free of charge which offers a wonderful opportunity to take time out for yourself. Bev 'N' Ley - Treasure Trails




"Bev! BEV, quick!"

LET'S TAKE A TRIP AROUND HOLDERNESS - BY BUS

On a beautiful day in early August, I decided to take a trip down into deepest Holderness, and to add a little adventure, I chose to use the bus.

You can go a long way using an EYMS day ticket, or for some, a bus pass. 12 hours, and 7 bus rides later, I returned home a contented soul. I suspect that many Beverley residents rarely venture much into the southeastern parts of the county, I certainly don't, beyond the occasional trip to Hornsea.

Perhaps we are all too mindful of what the eighteenth century writer Daniel Defoe said of Holderness, "the most remarkable thing, is that there is nothing remarkable".

The author of Robinson Crusoe was mistaken, if you seek them out, the region has much to offer the curious traveller, including what many rightly regard as the most glorious parish church in the country.

I began my journey on the 8.35, route 25 bus to Hornsea from Sow Hill. My plan was to reach Spurn Point. It takes a little trouble and scrutiny of a batch of timetables (available at Beverley TIC) but it was just possible, and allowed stops in interesting places en route.

All my buses that day were double deckers, which gave fabulous views across the countryside: which is not quite as flat as many think. The journey to Hornsea



takes some 35 minutes, it's lovely, passing through Tickton, Leven, Brandesburton and Sigglesthorne, with glimpses of the mere as you approach Hornsea.

I had 50 minutes to kill before my next bus down to Roos, ample time to explore along Newbegin, and stock up on a picnic for later in the day. This part of Hornsea has many fine period buildings and independent shops. The churchyard was full of summer flowers, but sadly never seems open for visitors. The 129 bus links the two coastal resorts of Hornsea and Withernsea, but I wanted to get off and explore the large village of Roos, catching the next service south.

Roos is a lovely village, way off the beaten track, but having 2 pubs, a post office/store, and highly regarded butcher/bakers. Its church is on a quiet lane, half a mile south of the centre.

That day volunteers were cutting back the dense vegetation in the churchyard, one of them kindly gave me a guided tour of this beautifully sited and well-appointed medieval building.

At 12.38, I was on the next bus to nearby Withernsea. For me the most striking sight in the resort, is the lighthouse, hundreds of yards from the sea. The two towers at the former pier were open, and I was delighted to learn of ambitious plans to rebuild, what would be a major attraction.

Being a lover of railways, I had to seek out the nearby remains of the former station: terminus of the line from Hull, which closed, like so many, in 1964.

My next bus was the surprisingly regular 71 route, via Patrington to Easington. Upstairs, afforded thrilling views of the stupendous

St. Patricks church, which I planned to visit later in the day. The bus turns around in atmospheric Easington Square.

Here is yet another fine church, and the amazing site of an ancient thatched tithe barn, just to its rear. This is one of the lesserknown architectural jewels of the county.

A half mile stroll along Seaside Road, brings you to the fine beach, with sand dunes and lagoons running south towards Spurn. There is now a nature reserve at Beacon Lagoons, with abundant birdlife.

This is a lovely way to access Spurn Point and to ponder the Yorkshire Atlantis. For beneath the waves in the photo, lie the remains of Revenser Odd, a once thriving medieval town, destroyed in the 14th century by the sea, which continues to erode this fragile coast.

Exciting recent discoveries suggest that the remains of the town have been located, its large market cross was washed ashore, and now stands in a Hedon garden.

A short 15 minute ride on the 71 took me back to Patrington. On a gorgeous evening, it was an absolute joy to view the exterior and interior of what Pevsner says is "for sheer architectural beauty, few parish churches in England can vie with Patrington".

Much of the stone has recently been cleaned, and positively glows on sunny days.



This was my 6th visit, it is invariably open, welcoming and quiet. Inside, the calm beauty of the lavish interior is breathtaking. Patrington has many good shops, cafes and

Refreshment is needed for the somewhat tedious, hour long journey on the 75 service to Hull interchange, via Hedon. The final leg homeward, was on one of the many services that link Hull to Beverley.

I find Holderness a distinctly odd place, but





fascinating in its seclusion and quietness. Touring it by bus seemed very apt. No wonder it appealed to a major poet like Philip Larkin, who explored the area on bicycle trips from his home in Hull.

A line of his resonated throughout this hot August day, "Here silence stands like heat".

COUNTRYSIDE MATTERS WITH SAM WALTON

Australia, massive Country, totally different I guess from anywhere else on earth.

They have huge ranches covering miles and miles of acres, mostly arid or at least not very fertile or productive but their cattle industry is enormous.

The Merion sheep are very famous as wool producers, and they too can live on poor land.

However not everywhere is arid, they have some land as good as some we have here and have some excellent crops. Most of the arable land is in fairly sizeable units and a very good friend has 8,500 acres which he runs with his son.



Of course they have massive farm machinery and they only employ one man, so at sowing time, the employee does a 12 hour shift and then the son takes over, it is really quite a sight to see the equipment and they will drill at least 50 acres per hour and they have a large American lorry with the seed in which fills the drill by a long augur whereas here in UK we tend to mess about with half ton bags which are hoisted into the drill by a front end loader on a tractor.

This particular farmer is a one off to say the least as years ago he could not get a tractor big enough, so he built his own, yes that is right, he built one.



He also has his own aeroplane and I know this will take a bit of believing but he also built that himself and it was passed OK for every aspect, so he can fly over his vast farming area and view the crops from above.

I went to see him in 2010 and it was mind - blowing, what a man. He also has a 500 sow unit which is managed by his son-in-law but more about that next time.

IN THE GARDEN... SEPTEMBER

The month of September is all about starting to gear up for a change in season and getting prepared for the months to come, and the garden takes on a decidedly autumnal feel.

With the extremely hot, dry weather we have been experiencing during August there is evidence that even established trees and shrubs are under stress and already showing signs of 'going into autumn' mode.

On a positive note, they should recover over the winter and our 'brown' lawns will turn green again once we have a few rain showers. Brightness of colour is found from a few old favourites: Asters; Dahlias; Chrysanthemums, and my favourites Sedums, Rudbeckia and Ornamental grasses.

Tasks for September...

- Borders continue to dead head flowers that have faded you are unlikely to encourage any new flowers at this stage of the season.
- Plant prepared bulbs for Christmas flowering prepared bulbs are simply bulbs that have been put in a cold store and 'duped' into thinking that have had a winter, and when they are planted in the relative warmth in our houses, they think it is spring and need to get growing.
- Dead-head roses and if rambler and climbing roses have got a bit out of hand, spend a bit of time pruning and tying them in before the winter.
- Hedges trim them for the last time this season, but do not feed them
 as this will encourage 'soft' growth. If you are considering planting a new
 hedge over the coming months prepare the site before the really bad
 weather sets in and the ground is too wet to work.
- Lawns September is a good month to seed a new lawn but do so earlier rather than later and reseed any bare patches. Established lawns should be aerated and an autumn weed/feed applied.
- Containers continue watering, feeding and dead heading seasonal plants in containers, if you do so they should last until the first frosts.
 However, if they are past their best clear them out and replant with spring bedding plants and under plant with bulbs.
- Bulbs buy and plant your spring flowering bulbs. If you are planning to force hyacinths for Christmas, then this month is your last chance to do so.
- Ponds continue to feed fish and thin out any pond and marginal plants that have become congested (or started to take over the pond). Cover the pond with netting BEFORE the leaves start to seriously fall.

If your garden has really suffered this August, it may be worth considering planting more drought tolerant plants, Ornamental grasses are a particularly good option and becoming increasingly more popular in gardens, plant them in swathes of a single variety or plant individually in borders to 'set off' other plants.

Four of the most popular varieties are:

Festuca - e.g., Blue Fescue Grass (Festuca glauca 'Elijah Blue') **Pennisetum** - e.g., Fountain Grass (Pennisetum setaceum 'Summer Samba')

Miscanthus - e.g., Zebra Grass (Miscanthus sinensis 'Zebrinus') **Stipa** - e.g., Giant Golden Oats (Stipa gigantean)







Raindrops fall on the windscreen and are swept away. Glyphs trickling upwards, swept away.


A patch of blue opening as the Wolds diminish. Blue sky, forget-me-nots at the verge - a swathe of colour as monotones give way to sunlight.

Redundant churches, closed pubs, life giving way to life. To our daughter a daughter!


Once I was at the root of the family tree now two generations beyond support me.

WILLING FAST WOLLSTON SEPTEMBER 2022

This September, the Yorkshire Wolds plays host to the 12th Walking East Yorkshire Festival brought together by tourism partners and volunteers across East Yorkshire. Showcasing over 100 outdoor activities including specialist guided walks, boating, horse riding and cycling.

The focal points of this year's festival will include two four-day treks across the heart of the Yorkshire Wolds. **The Chalkland Way** and **Wold Rangers Way** are both around 40 miles and take in breath taking scenery across the chalk landscape and dry valleys of this region.

Walking the Town Beverley will be hosting their usual comprehensive list of guided history walks including Larkin about Beverley, which tells the story of Philip Larkin who was a frequent visitor to Beverley for over 30 years.

Beverley has talent! will inform you of those

residents who have made their mark on Beverley or Over 500 years of history in less than 500 steps takes you a short history walk with masses of information about the town past. Those interested in the painters Fred and Mark Elwell can enjoy a walk and talk looking at the places linked to the Elwell family in Beverley and finishing off at the garden of Bar House - Fred's home for 44 year!

Pocklington and Hornsea will be taking visitors on informative history walks through their towns. Pocklington will be focusing on importance of the beck within the town and how it serviced the two mills of which the town grew up on, whilst the Hornsea walk will take you from the seafront to the Mere and finish off at Hornsea Museum which holds the largest display of Hornsea Pottery. Driffield are hosting a couple of circular trods along sections of their hugely successful Wold Rangers way which plays homage to a nomadic tribe of farm hands living off the land on the Yorkshire Wolds.

For those looking for a more relaxing experience, why not join us for **Outdoor YOGA** at Oldroyd's

corner in Woodmancy? Whilst you soak up all the feelings of being outdoors – you can rest assured that the weather won't stop this session taking place!

New events to the festival this year include **Walking with Alpacas** at North Cave, where you can take a stroll with beautiful fury animals to the **Bridlington Crab Chase** where children can try your luck at catching as many crabs as possible within 45 minutes session. **Laurel Vines** are joining us for the first time to take us on a tour of their vineyard and winery.

For those who enjoy a bit of foraging, why not join the **Mires Beck Nursey** 'art in nature' teach to forage for artistic pieces to be used back in the art room or join **Wild Harvest** for a food foraging walk.

If it's an evening stroll you are interested in, join the team at **RSPB Bempton** for a dusk walk along the white cliffs where you will be able to spot local seabirds, catch a glimpse of porpoises and spot the UK's smallest bats with the reserves new bat detector!

For those with an interest in fine wine, join the National Trails Ranger for a circular walk around South Cave finishing off at Little Wold Vineyard, where you will have the opportunity to learn about the vines and indulge in a spot of wine tasting. Learn how Side Oven Bakery have diversified into an award-winning bakery on a tour of the Bakery and Mill at their Farm near Foston.

For ladies looking to get back in the saddle and make new friends join the **Breeze Cycing** Ladies on a number of taster events taking in some pretty country roads across the East Riding and finishing off with a well-deserved refreshment break.

Join the **British Nordic Walking workshop** for a taster session of this special walking technique which uses 90% of our muscles, helping people get fitter.

Other walking delights include a number of walks focusing on the Goe-park at **Danes Dyke**, **Flamborough Head** and the **Londesborough estate**. Walking will be treated to facts about local geology and archaeology of these landscapes.

CARFAN - ALVIS TF21

The subject of this month's column very nearly met a premature end as this 1966 Alvis TF21 was bought initially to be used for spares.

Further investigation however showed that it had previously belonged to the scottish Alvis aviation director and it was saved from such an ignominious demise. Thank goodness for that as it has repaid its current owner of the last 25 years with very good reliability and a lot of admiring looks wherever it goes.


Founded in Coventry in 1919, the company also produced aircraft engines and armoured cars before finally closing in 1967 although the name continued under various guises and indeed, there are moves to produce a



vehicle in 2022 so watch this space. Supplied with an optional steel sunroof and steel wheels as opposed to the then more popular wire wheels, this car is certainly used, adding around 4000 miles a year to its odometer.

A five-speed gearbox, power steering and brakes upgraded to 4-pot calipers all contribute to a very usable vehicle. Being styled by Graber of Switzerland and built by Mulliner Park Ward of Rolls Royce fame has undeniably contributed to the car's longevity and rarity. The current owner has replaced the head gasket and the colour is now Peony red as opposed to the original Sand gold.

Parts are easy to obtain, somewhat surprisingly and the Alvis owners club and Alvis Register both contribute to keeping this marque alive. Readers will struggle to find one for sale and a quick search only found three, ranging from a restoration project at £20k to an aftermarket convertible at £63K so good luck with that should you have that particular itch to scratch. As only around 105 of this model were produced, including just a few convertibles are a rare sight indeed nowadays, but should you see one at a car show don't forget that cheery Carfan wave!
