SOCCER TOTS TO SCHOLARSHIP

Seb Auton, born just a stone's throw away from the KC Stadium, looks to have taken inspiration from the stadium atmosphere, and from an early age set his mind to becoming a professional footballer.

At just 18 months old Seb was never without a ball in his hand and started at Soccer Tots in Beverley with coach Andy setting him on the way, laying firm foundations for Seb to grow and develop. It is true what they say "Show me the boy and I will show you the man" - he was going to be a Goalkeeper.



When Seb was just 5 years old he moved up to Brazilian Soccer Schools on National Avenue with coaches John and Owen playing Futzol, teaching young footballers the art of ball skills with a smaller ball which is harder to kick. The technique was paramount to develop good kicking skills, tied in with team play, communication, balance and all the aspects a child needs to develop.

When Owen set up Hull Football Skills Academy, he was delighted that Seb joined him as one of his first pupils! At that young age local coaches could see the ability Seb had, hand, eye coordination, skill and most of all determination, backed by supporting parents Nick and Lynne. It was only on Seb's last session at the age of 11 that Owen found out Seb was a goalie.

Owen concentrated on footwork which Seb enjoyed as it helped him to improve. All the top keepers are encouraged to have good footballing skills, and Seb managed to learn these skills at a very early age, which he has applied throughout his development.

Keen to get involved with a local football team, at the age of 7 Seb joined Beverley Town Panthers run by coach Ted Atkinson and played with them until the age of 12 where he moved to Beverley Town Pumas, run by coach Steve Harris. Seb was now starting to establish himself as a goalkeeper and starting to attract the attention of other managers and scouts from professional clubs. His performances won him numerous man of the matches and managing a tight defence at the back with his presence in goal.

Seb was keen to develop his skills and learn as much as he could in the art of goalkeeping, and with understanding parents, he travelled to Wiggington Grasshoppers once a week for goalkeeper training with Brian who had previously been the Youth Team coach at York City. He harnessed his skills and understood what it took to be the last line of defence and have the mindset to deal with being Number 1 on the team sheet.

Growing in stature as a goalkeeper, Seb increasingly attracted the attention of a number of local professional football clubs which resulted in trials for the Academies at Hull City, Scunthorpe United and Grimsby Town which led to him being successful in being signed by Grimsby Town in 2019

For everyone Covid times were extremely difficult, but through sheer determination and resilience and a mindfulness to succeed, Seb set about using the time he was allowed to work hard on his football skills on the Beverley Westwood. He worked on his running, cycling and working out in the garden and especially his fitness maintaining the high levels he has set himself.

His determination paid off, he currently trains 3 times per week, playing a match on a weekend, in the Yorkshire/Nottinghamshire area as well as further afield including visits to Manchester City and Leicester City, and last season he made his youth team Under 18 debut in the Youth Alliance league and helped the team to a win and gain 3 points

Seb has been fortunate to be able to keep in touch with a number of top coaches, and during the summer holidays he travelled with his parents to La Manga where he spends two weeks goalie training in the Spanish heat each year with coach



Harry Cosson, who is currently Head of Youth Development at Lusail Football Academy in Qatar.

Closer to home Seb doesn't let the grass grow under his feet, he travels to Thame to attend a residential goalkeeping intensive training camp run by coach Martin Brennan of DGUK who was previously a professional goalkeeper and goalkeeping coach at many professional clubs including Premier League Fulham. Seb continues to gain valuable knowledge and skills learnt from top professionals at the highest level and applies them to his game.

It doesn't come as a surprise with all the effort that Seb and his parents have put in, that in November 2022 Seb was offered a full time scholarship at Grimsby Town with 6 other boys, which will commence in Summer 2023. He will then leave home and take up his full time contract with Grimsby Town and set on the road to a professional career as a goalkeeper. The contract includes Seb studying towards a BTEC qualification in Sports Science. On completion of the 2 year deal the aim is for him to achieve a professional contract.

With the determination, skill and mindset shown this is an inspiration to anyone that you can achieve anything if you put your mind, heart and soul into it.

We wish Seb well with his continued development and hope that one day he will achieve his dream of playing professionally!!!

ESTELLE CELEBRATES HER 100TH BIRTHDAY

Estelle Crump, a resident at Beverley Grange, reached the century milestone and enjoyed a lovely day with the staff and her friends at Beverley Grange on 13th December 2022.

(Edna) Estelle Perry was born near Downham Market in Norfolk on 13 December 1922. She was brought up on her parents' farm alongside the River Ouse. On leaving school on her 14th birthday, Estelle went to work as a kitchen maid at Leeds Castle in Kent, the home of Olive, Lady Baillie, a wealthy Anglo-American who entertained Royalty and famous film stars there in the 1930s.

Estelle later worked for Mrs Eugenie Sassoon, widow of David Sassoon, a close friend of King Edward VII, who lived at 2 Albert Gate, Knightsbridge (now the Kuwaiti Embassy).

18-year-old Estelle joined the WAAF (Women's Auxiliary Air Force) at Bridgnorth, Shropshire, on 26 June 1941. She was sent to Blackpool in August 1941 where she was taught to drive cars and trucks before taking on the position of 'Driver Mechanical Transport'. Later she married Bill Crump - they lived in King's Lynn and Eastbourne before retiring back to Downham Market.

In 2013 Estelle, then a widow, moved to Beverley (Beverley Grange Nursing Home) to be near her nieces.

Estelle was delighted to receive a birthday card and congratulations from His Majesty King Charles III, making her day all the more special. In May, Just Beverley will produce its 100th publication, so please send in your "100" related stories.



Anne Stuart said, "We raise money to help victims of domestic violence, and the point of contact is Kevin Foster, team leader through ERYC Domestic Violence and Abuse Parnership (DVAP) and support those who are fleeing domestic abuse.

"DVAP work with male and female victims of domestic abuse but it is usually women and children who go to the council in the first place. Monies can go to help them in whatever way it is needed, for carpets, bedding, a fridge, cooker etc, just to give women and children a new start and get them on their way to a brighter future".

Kevin Foster works for the ERYC and is a team Leader for the Domestic Violence Abuse Partnership (DVAP).

He mentioned, "I work as a link between DVAP and ERDAT to help clients access financial support when it is most needed.

"Victim/Survivors of domestic abuse have a variety of support needs whether that is to access safe supported accommodation or with assistance to help in their own home to get the basics in life."







But we are no nearer knowing what will actually happen in this New Year. We can still only project and plan. Events of the last three years must surely have convinced us of that.

One event that I hope will take place without any difficulties is the Coronation of King Charles III on Saturday May 6th at Westminster Abbey. When Charles became King on the death of the Queen on Thursday September 8th last year, the Elizabethan age came to an end and the UnIted Kingdom entered into the Carolean age (the word is pronounced Caro-lean). This is because we now have a King whose name is Charles and the Latin word for Charles is Carolean.

In truth a monarch can be called by whatever name he chooses. When Edward VIII abdicated in 1936 his brother Albert became King but chose to be known as George V1. King Charles III's son William is his natural successor but he may choose another name other than William. Let us trust that

such a time is many years hence. Whilst offering my thoughts on such matters I am also aware that many people may not share my appreciation of the monarchy and have legitimate views about the position that royalty has held over the centuries in our country. Thankfully such alternative views do not today lead to mass civil disobedience. During the seventy years of Queen Elizabeth's reign, the people of this country came to appreciate, and it may be said love, their monarch in a manner that I suggest no monarch before had ever achieved.

Many writers have stated that they felt King George VI never expected to become King as he had a very retiring nature and, as we now know had a speech impediment so that speaking in public was the last thing he would have chosen to do. I worked for many years with a man who, during his formative year, had a terrible stammer but with help overcame this difficulty and he became a senior social worker who was often called upon to speak in the local Magistrates Court.

Let us hope that services for folks who have similar problems such as my friend had (also severe deafness or poor eyesight and others) are not part of any cuts to local services that might occur in the coming months.

By 1939 King George VI had given three Christmas broadcasts but it was the one he gave just after the Second World War had begun that folks, alive at that time, recall. There was hope that the war would last but a few months but as we now know it lasted over six long years. To some



extent we are in a similar state of uncertainty and therefore the words of the poem spoken by the King and written in 1908 by Minnie Louise Askins called "The Hand of God" are worth recalling.

"And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year

give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown"

And he replied.

"Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the hand of God.

That will be to you better than the light and safer than a known way"

So I went forth and finding the hand of God trod gladly into the night.

And he led me towards the hills and the breaking of the day in the lone East.

KEEP IT IN THE FAMILY WITH SMART TAX PLANNING

There comes a point in life when thoughts turn to what happens after we're gone. For those with children and grandchildren, this will likely include considering how best to pass on any assets we may have.

You might therefore be working out what you can do now to make life easier for your family, how you can give younger generations a helping hand and what you need to put in place for your own peace of mind. When you've spent your working life building up

your assets, you'll most likely want to protect them for the benefit of future generations. This is an area where pensions play a much more central role than they used to.

When you're trying to come up with a plan for passing on wealth, traditionally it's about trusts, property and so on, but people are increasingly using their

pension pots, and some are using them to skip generations.

A pension has long been one of the most taxefficient ways to pass on wealth, even more so after changes to pension rules in 2015. Your pensions sit outside your estate for IHT purposes, meaning your beneficiaries can access your savings without having to pay any IHT.

If you die before you turn 75 and you haven't accessed your pension, your beneficiaries can receive all of it tax free, provided they claim it within two years of your death.

If you die before 75 and you've been using a drawdown arrangement, your beneficiaries can access what's left and decide how they want to use it. If you die after turning 75, your


beneficiaries will be charged Income Tax at their marginal rate on any pension you leave behind (and it'll be passed on tax free if the beneficiary doesn't pay any Income Tax).

Making the most of ISAs and gifting

If you're planning to pass on as much of your pension as possible, you'll need to consider where else you get your income from in retirement.

You might be making more of your ISA allowances and taking income from those to create retirement wealth. Remember, however, that while ISAs offer shelter from Income Tax and Capital Gains Tax (CGT), the money you hold in them will form part of your estate for IHT purposes.

The tax system is also your friend when it comes to helping younger generations while you're still

alive. For example, you can give away a total of £3,000 worth of gifts each tax year without them being added to the value of your estate (and you can use the previous year's allowance, too, if you haven't already).

Similarly, small gifts of up to £250 can be given free of IHT during a tax year to any number of people who haven't also benefited from your £3,000 annual exemption. This is money you can give away while still alive in order to reduce the IHT bill, so it should be part of your end-of-year tax planning.

It's worth keeping a record of any gifts in case you or your beneficiaries need to provide paperwork for HMRC.

You can also maximise the benefits of financial gifts to children or grandchildren by putting the money into a children's pension. This is a win-win, as you get both the IHT reduction and the tax relief on pension contributions.





IN MY VIEW... IT'S TIME TO FOCUS ON THE WORLD AROUND US

Hello everyone, and Happy New Year! 2023 is finally here. I hope you had a truly great holiday season. It may even be that you were lucky enough to get a shiny new camera - in which case, you have come to the right place!

As we move away from the festivities and towards a fresh start and new chapter ahead, I thought it would be good to talk about getting out and about this issue. Going for long walks and taking in the sights and locations that we are so lucky to have close by is one of my favourite things to do - especially after all that Christmas indulgence!



I don't really think you can beat Bempton Cliffs for a bit of photography, exercise and fresh air. The images in this article focus on some of the beautiful birds that can be spotted there. There are endless opportunities for excellent shots, and it's the perfect place to experiment with different shutter speeds.

Fast shutter speeds are ideal for birds, simply because they can just suddenly take off. In fact, it's better when they do because you can get some great wing span shots. I also recommend using continuous shooting mode. This way, the camera will continue to shoot for as long as you have the shutter pressed. So, if the bird does take off, you will capture the whole sequence. The faster the shutter speed, the better, so experiment with that and be amazed by the results.

Also, it is worth pointing out that puffins make their annual appearance at Bempton Cliffs between May and early July. I plan to go and see them this year; if you go too and see me there, feel free to say hi.

Other great places to go with your camera are Tophill Low, where foxes and kingfishers can be found by particularly lucky photographers. Add in The Deep, The Yorkshire Wildlife Park, The Westwood - there are so many lovely and photogenic spots to visit nearby, both on our doorstep and a short journey away. I hope this article inspires you to visit some of them.

I tend to not get too technical in these articles but if you have questions, or would like a more in-depth understanding of shutter speeds,



apertures etc., please feel free to get in touch. I am always happy to go into more detail to help you branch out and try some new photography techniques.

So, charge your camera, get your warm togs on, grab a flask and a snack and get out there snapping. Not only will there be plenty to see and photograph, you'll be getting active and enjoying that January recharge we've all promised ourselves.





GRACIE ACHIEVES GOL

Gracie Wilson started Judo in 2017 to build up her confidence, and meet like minded children enjoying a full contact sport. She attended the Judo classes which were taught at the Beverley Leisure Centre, and since 2017, Gracie has gone on to become one of the top athletes for her age.

Gracie is coached by Seth Birch and she now fights for Huddersfield judo, but also frequently visits her old club and coaches, Danny Kissenisky and Steve Shepard of East Yorkshire Judo Academy. In addition to Judo training, to increase her strength and stamina, Gracie trains daily at JD Gym doing a full weights program and working daily on her cardio fitness.

Gracie falls under the elite athlete status as she is on the GB Pathway 2018-present day. In February 2019 she achieved a West Yorkshire championships Bronze medal and in May the English open Bronze medal and London area open (Heart of England) silver medal June 2019.

On Gracie's first trip abroad with (R.E.D.S) Regional



England Development Squad she finished 5th and then went on to compete for Yorkshire and Humberside in Stuttgart, taking her 1st international Silver medal. Gracie continued to win medals throughout 2019 with the Northern Home Counties Gold in September, and competed in the Commonwealth Judo Championships finishing

She also won a Silver medal in the Welsh Open, finishing off in December as a British champion taking Gold in the under 17s at the British Championship in Sheffield. Finally, she won the Hull Daily Mail Young Female Sports Personality of the Year 2019. The success continued and in 2021 Gracie managed a medal at every English closed event and continued with podium finishes. One of her special moments in London was early in 2022, her first major competition where she took the English Open U17's Bronze and Silver in the U21s, followed by a double Gold in the C2 international with competitors from all over Europe.

Gracie won Gold in the U17s and U21's which has lead to her being selected to represent her country in all the European cups in Portugal, Spain and France and attended the French International training camp with team GB. Away from the highs of competition, Gracie continues to develop her craft and at the age of 15 became a Black Belt 1st Dan (the youngest age that this can be obtained). In order to achieve her Black Belt, Gracie managed it in one of the most prestigious ways by way of a line up of FIVE continuous fights without a break and not being defeated by anyone. (Defeating athletes all older than Gracie in the 16 - 23 category).



Whilst Gracie has represented her country in France, Holland, Germany and Denmark and scheduled to go to Poland in 2023, her greatest achievement without doubt was to become (Under 21) Junior British Champion in December at the Sheffield Institute of Sport at just 16 years of age, defeating the numbers 3, 2 and 1 seeded fighters. Gracie is now an active part of the team GBR juniors and seniors training alongside full time Olympic team fighters.

January 2023 offers no rest for Gracie as she continues with her training and development and aims to achieve her ambition to become an Olympic athlete and bring home medals for her country and become GB's number One.

Gracie said "It is with the help and support of her family that she is able to achieve so much and appreciates all the travelling they do to help her achieve her goals".

Fingers crossed we hope Gracie achieves her dream and "Makes it Happen".
