THE HISTORY BEHIND THE PERFECT CHRISTMAS PUDDING

Originating in England in the 14th century, Christmas pudding is traditionally a dark, sticky, dense sponge usually soaked with brandy or other alcohol. Its history goes back centuries and is steeped in tradition.

For many British households, Christmas dinner would not be complete without a Christmas pudding. Back when it originated as a sort of porridge 6 centuries ago, it was made with hulled wheat, boiled in milk, seasoned with cinnamon and coloured with saffron. People would serve it as a plain dish and was associated with meatless days, lent and advent.

Changes to the recipe began to take effect in the 17th century, and it was thickened with the addition of eggs, breadcrumbs, dried fruit and beer or spirits. While it now resembled more of a sweet pudding, it wasn't until the Victorians fine tuned the recipe to make it the Christmas pudding it is today. There is a popular myth that a Christmas pudding has 13 ingredients to represent Jesus and the 12 disciples, and that the flaming brandy represents the passion of Christ.

Some people add coins to the middle of the pudding as a fun Christmas tradition, the idea being that whoever finds the coin will have good luck for the next year. This tradition could date back to as early as the 1300s when several small



items such as dried peas and chicken wishbones were added to the pudding mixture. While Christmas pudding is predominantly a British tradition, it is eaten in various countries worldwide, including Australia and South Africa. Canadians also have their own version which is similar but includes potatoes alongside the carrots.

If you're having Christmas pudding this festive season, the number of ingredients that go into making the perfect pudding might seem daunting, but if they are prepped and planned ahead of time the recipe will come together easily.

MAKE YOUR CHRISTMAS LONGER AND MERRIER THAN JUST 24 HOURS

It almost seems a shame that Christmas, a holiday filled with special religious meaning, love and kindness, and celebrations, only lasts for 24 hours on the 25th. Some people wait around all year for Christmas only for it to pass in the blink of an eye, but why confine the festivities to Christmas Day? Here are some ways you can prolong the festivities and celebrate all month.

Make the first week count

As soon as December 1 strikes, start filling your home with decorations inside and out, and you can even get your family and friends involved by making it a fun decorating party. Half of the fun at this time of year is reopening your boxes of decorations after a whole year and seeing your home transform into a magical space. Get the Christmas carols playing and you have an ideal build up to Christmas beginning.

Drive around to take in the Christmas lights

This is something people of all ages love to do, but will be particularly magical for young children to experience. January 6, which allows lots of time to chill out, plan fun activities for the family and spread out the celebration. Use this time to remember what Christmas is truly about, and focus on spending time with people you love.

Attend a Christmas performance or service

At this time of year, there are plenty of local churches, choirs and theatre groups that hold Christmas themed performances for you to enjoy. Support local theatre and get into the festive spirit with ERT who are presenting the world-premiere production of Frost Hollow Hall, which runs from December 9 to January 2. If you prefer a more sporty performance, ask for a Boxing Day football match as a present and go with family or friends.

Have fun in the snow

If we have a white Christmas this year, have some outdoor fun and spend time in nature by making use of the hills in the Westwood. They make for the perfect place to take your family and friends sledging or tubing. If you have people staying with you from outside Beverley, it's a great opportunity to show them the local area and work off any cabin fever you are feeling.

There are very few who could stay consistently motivated while doing something they hate, which is why enjoying the process is an important factor in achieving goals.


Make sure to keep track of your progress to hold yourself accountable, as well as stay motivated when you see yourself reaching the targets.



LET'S TAKE A TRIP TO -Barton upon humber

Although this diminutive Lincolnshire town is almost on our doorstep, it invariably feels much further away than it actually is from East Yorkshire.

It also often seems to be much more old fashioned and less frantic than most of England. It has a fascinating waterside with 3 distinct attractions that the town makes good use of. It has 2 fine ancient churches within touching distance of each other, and Saxon St. Peter's is architecturally of national importance.

There are many interesting independent shops, good pubs and cafes, which make all the ingredients for a nice trip out by car or bus via Hull or Hessle. The intrepid may even cycle there over the Humber Bridge, or use the train to Hessle and walk across - the views are of course wonderful.

Unquestionably, the most distinctive attraction here is the tremendous Wilderspin School Museum; it brings out the child in everyone. Some of the attractions, such as Wilderspin, are currently only open at weekends. You can check details on the excellent **barton-upon-humber.org.uk** site.



Tile Yard

Let's start our visit with the 3 waterside venues, each blessed with fine view over the Humber. Firstly, Waters Edge is a delight for nature lovers, with adjacent ponds and live recordings of the wildlife. The cafe with outdoor seating is excellent, and the information area sells nice gifts. To the

west just beyond the bridge lies the Old Tile Yard, a huge historic tile and brick-making complex. It has now largely given over to retail and a splendid restaurant. Further still is the wetland area of Far Ings, a delight for serious bird watchers. All are easily reachable on foot from the town centre. Heading back to town you might well see the distinctive Ropewalk, now a thriving arts venue.

St. Peter's

Many of the town streets, notably Fleetgate, High Street and Priestgate are a joy to wander with much Georgian architecture. St Mary's is usually open to visitors and is a fine medieval building. St. Peter's, with its stunning Saxon tower, is run by English Heritage.



Check their website for current opening times and prices.

Baysgarth Park is excellent for children and has an interesting museum collection at the Hall. The Wilderspin Museum, with its original Victorian classrooms, school yard, games and activities, always thrills children and brings back memories for older folk. The cafe here is particularly good and is sometimes open when the museum itself is closed.



know Barton and its environs, so perhaps head there soon for some festive shopping and be pleasantly surprised by what you discover!

I still recall with relish the home-cooked meat and potato pie I had there just before the pandemic.

Barton was once a major port and a ferry crossing point to Hull, and while its commercial importance has now perhaps declined, it still maintains an individual and proud identity. It often surprises me how few Bevelonians




"You look beautiful." He said as she approached him. She hadn't heard those words since Harry had died. He had often said it.


She felt tears pricking her eyes. The old man stood up and walked around the table to the side of the nurse. With a kindly look on his face he put a gentle arm around her.

CARFAN - LOTS. OF. TROUBLE. USUALLY. SERIOUS.

This is the acronym that follows every Lotus owner like a lead weight as the make does not have a terribly good reputation for reliability, especially the older models.

There are always exceptions to the rule and the model featured, an Excel S.E., has proved to be a reliable steed, with the AA only needed once in 23 years ownership when the fuel pump blocked.

To be fair, the current owner has done a lot of work on it: replacing the leather interior and steering wheel, new steering rack, new stainless steel exhaust system and replacing the headlining. The latter is a weak spot on this model as the headlining often falls off the plastic that it is stuck onto.

Another major plus point with this car is that it was purchased from a Lotus dealer that had previously returned the car



to Lotus for a respray and an engine rebuild. There isn't a spot of rust on the bodywork but this should come as no surprise to those in the know as the car is made of glass fibre.

Putting 30,000 miles on a replacement clock and bringing it up to about 130,000, one might think this car was past its best but no, it can still accelerate with the best of them as Carfan can attest, having been treated to a quick (in both ways) test drive. Expect to pay up to £12,000 for a good example.

Parts are still readily available and relatively inexpensive, helped by the fact that Lotus used some parts from other models - the door handles, for example, come from a Morris Marina and if you own one of those now rare beasties, please let the editor know, and should you happen to see an Excel, don't forget that cheery Carfan wave!



COUNTRYSIDE MATTERS WITH SAM WALTON

Thailand Part 2... Like most countries, Thailand has good, moderate and bad areas in most of the agricultural sector. In complete contrast to the way pigs are kept on small family holdings, there are also some exceptionally good ones.





One such development I saw each year for three years was an absolute opposite of the ones shown last month. A very forward-looking farmer, who already had three hundred sows on a relatively modern system, had decided to become a multiplier of breeding stock for an English breeding company to sell to the many farmers who were considering

going modern with updated genetics. It was an enormous undertaking on a five-acre plot, which he built a high concrete wall around for security, with a drive-through disinfectant pool for lorries entering the unit. He already had a huge pond in which he had been keeping fish. He emptied that out to be able to use it as a slurry pond and enable him to use it as fertiliser for his cropping land.

The actual construction did take a long time, well over two years, as all the holes for the supporting pillars were dug by hand. The sows, litters and growing pigs were all kept on a slatted, raised floor to allow the air flow to keep them cool. This also enabled the dung and urine to drop through to a sloping concrete



reception area underneath, where that was then flushed along a channel and into the former fishpond.

The older finisher pigs were on a floor level building with sloping floors and their dung and urine was flushed each day into a channel again pumped into the slurry pond.




A sloping ramp had been built up to the floor level for the sows to enter and leave at the end of their time and for the growing pigs to reach their finishing accommodation on floor level. This also allowed entry for the staff. As well as that there was a connecting walkway from one side to the other, which allowed the piglets to

enter their growing area and provided access for the stock persons to attend to the pigs.

In addition to all this, the farmer had built a row of small accommodation rooms for the staff so they were well looked after. Some of the staff came from Myanmar as the farm was near the border and they were cheaper than Thai labour. I have to say, it was the most impressive set up I saw in the whole of Thailand.





IN THE GARDEN... DECEMBER

December is undoubtedly the quietest month in the gardening calendar - days are short and most of us retreat indoors as there is very little 'to do' in the garden. However, if you want to blow a few cobwebs away there are tasks that can be completed...

• Dig over any bare patches of soil and clear away any remaining old crops.

- Clear any leaves that have gathered in nooks and crannies.
- Give an occasional liquid feed to pots and containers with seasonal bedding in them.

• If we get ice and snow - keep an area of your pond 'ice free' and shake heavy snow from large shrubs and trees (where sensible!!)

Colour in the garden is found from any remaining berries, a few flowers, bark, and evergreens. The evergreens come into their own at this time of the year as they are no longer a backdrop to the bright colours of spring and summer, they also play a significant part in the traditions of Christmas and the Winter Solstice.

Winter Solstice - this signals the beginning of the coldest season in the northern hemisphere (midwinter). Evergreens have long been revered as symbols of natures hardiness because they retain their leaves through the coldest weather. Decorating our homes with evergreens is nothing new either, the origins of this tradition can be found in Celtic and Norse pagan beliefs. Originally discouraged by early Christians, they now symbolise aspects of a Christian Christmas.

Evergreens were hung in homes to ward off evil spirits, bring about fertility, good luck, and signal rebirth. All the evergreens we view as symbols of Christmas (Holly, Ivy, Mistletoe and Pine Trees) have mythical meanings and traditions built around them. An evergreen circle (door wreath) encircles your hopes and dreams for the coming year and if used indoors and laid flat with candles, the candles represent the return of the sun.

Christmas Trees - Celtic druids decorated evergreen trees with fruits, nuts, and coins during the onset of winter to ensure a fruitful coming year. The first evidence of evergreen trees being brought indoors was during the Renaissance period in Germany, workers would bring an evergreen tree indoors, decorating it with sweets, fruit, and nuts to be enjoyed by the apprentices and workers children. This tradition was taken to the North American continent by German immigrants and deemed a pagan ritual by the American puritans. It became fashionable for the European nobility in the 19th century to have a decorated Christmas tree and we have Prince Albert to thank for introducing us all to this Christmas tradition
