The big clubs in the Premiership are always on the lookout for big names and big money transfers. At the lower level it is just the same, but on a much much smaller scale. The principle is still the same.

At the lower level, everyone keeps their eyes and ears open to grab an opportunity, so when Beverley Town's Chairman was out walking his dog, signing an Italian International was not on his radar - but dreams can come true.

Beverley Town FC are making great steps on and off the football pitch, having secured their place in Northern Counties East Football League Division One. Now chairman Mark Smith has grabbed an

opportunity for what could be considered the biggest signing in their history.

Daniele Mannini has played in Serie A alongside and against some of the biggest names of European football over the past 20 years recently, and following that initial chance meeting with Mark, he decided to come out of retirement and in July 2022 and signed papers to play for Beverley Town FC.

Mark Smith said, "I was out walking my dog when I got chatting to another dog walker. During the conversation he mentioned he played a bit of football in the past, the conversations continued and I suggested he should get down to preseason training.

"I had no idea he had such a fantastic playing



career with over 200 Serie A appearances".

The Club manager, Dave Ricardo, praised Daniele's attitude saying, "his training and dedication has been first class."


His late mother used to get her dogs from the Hull Dog Rescue Centre, he knows how much his mum loved the dogs and what a difference they made to her life.

# **ABOUT BEVERLEY**

I run costumed guided walking tours of Beverley - you might have seen me at the Market Cross on Tuesdays and Fridays (I'm the one in 17th century costume). I used to be a tour guide with the National Trust, and now I enjoy showing people around the town where I was born.

In this regular column I explore Beverley's history, month by month.

For August, there was now a new Governor of Hull after Sir John Hotham had changed sides and got himself arrested and imprisoned in the Tower of London. Lord Fairfax was now 'it'. And his son, Sir Thomas Fairfax, was in charge of the Parliamentarian troops stationed in Beverley.

In August 1643, the Royalist Earl of Newcastle (with 12,000 foot soldiers and 4,000 cavalry) was heading for Beverley. Sir Thomas asked his Dad if he could retreat. His Dad said no.

Sir Thomas, knowing he was facing certain defeat, took his troops to Westwood to await the inevitable. At the first sight of the Royalist army the following morning, he ordered his foot soldiers to withdraw to Hull and his cavalry to withdraw into Beverley itself. And by 4 in the afternoon, after some fighting in the streets, they were all on their way back to Hull - with the Earl of Newcastle at their heels.

The Earl of Newcastle and his army then returned to Beverley to take revenge on the town for sheltering the Parliamentarians. £20,000 worth of damage was done, and, it's said, the women were even crueller than the men.

Walk with me through 1,300 years of history. Tours run Tuesdays and Fridays at 11am and 2pm from April to October. In July and August there'll be evening tours as well - book online and meet me at the Market Cross at 6pm.



# OVERCOMING ANXIE

I love my job as I get to help people overcome all sorts of challenges and improve their physical and mental wellbeing on a daily basis.

Over the last year or so, following the global pandemic, I've been helping an increasing number of people overcome anxiety which has ranged from general feelings of worry to specific circumstances such as a fear of flying or travelling abroad or even a dread of leaving the house.

Of course, during the height of the pandemic, we were told to stay home and stay safe so it's not at all surprising that sometimes our minds can take on these messages even when the danger has passed.


A few weeks ago I was confronted by a situation when a lovely gentleman arrived for a hypnotherapy session to overcome his general anxiety but it became immediately clear that he was about to go into a full-blown panic attack - which can be both scary for the person experiencing the panic attack and those around.

As the gentleman perched on the edge of the chair, looking very anxious and shallow-breathing, I asked him to breathe with me and I taught him a simple breathing technique called box or square breathing.

Within a minute or two, he reported that "Oooh! I'm feeling much better" which was no surprise to me and I told him that this was one of many tools that he would learn in the session to pop in his (imaginary) rucksack to help him in the future.

The technique is really simple... breathe in for four seconds, hold for four seconds, breathe out for four seconds and hold for four seconds... and repeat. The diagram on the top right shows how you can imagine a square as you're practising the technique.

The biggest benefit of box breathing is relaxation, especially in times of stress. Studies show that regulating your breath can lower levels of the stress hormone cortisol and maybe even help lower blood pressure.





# **LET THERE BE LIGHT**

Let there be Light / Let the lights shine / At evening time it shall be light / (the 3rd is the epitaph of the man who first lit a London street).

We think we have the oldest surviving gas lampposts in the world. Still standing in the streets of Beverley, the dates cast on their bases proclaim 1824, 1825 or 1826. Yes, there were older ones in London (the first city in the world to have gas lamps) and other British cities, but they have been scrapped now. Not here. Georgian lampposts, they are individually recorded by Historic England as 'Grade II listed buildings.'

The lamps were cast at Thorncliffe near Sheffield, and designed by John Malam, pioneer of gas engineering. His design has a base with a lion's face and olive branches, a Roman column of bound sticks called fasces (from which the word Fascism came) and an upper column decorated with two collars of palm leaves, referring to the 'Egyptian' craze in 1820s London. Often the



crossbars to support the lamplighters' ladders survive. Many of the lanterns, made at 59 Saturday Market, have been replaced by replicas.

In the summer of 1824 Malam found a site and built the gasworks in Figham Road, laid the gas pipes, restored the paved streets, had the lamps cast, shipped to Beverley and installed - and the lights blazed out before Christmas, changing the lives of the townspeople for ever. They were not changed to electricity until the later 1940s. The gasworks have gone, but the grand arched entrance is still where Malam built it.

Malam left Beverley in 1826 and went to Hull to try to sort out their street lamps which were running on whale oil and not gas. Beverley gas was left in the charge of William Dimbleby, ancestor of our media Dimbleby family. Additional lampposts were made by William Crosskill at his iron works in Mill Lane Beverley, we think from about 1827 but unfortunately, although he copied much of the design, he did not date them. These too are listed buildings, so altogether we have 39 historical lampposts.

Nearly 200 years later, East Riding of Yorkshire Council, Beverley Town Council and the Beverley Civic Society have combined to renovate the lamps and repaint them in Beverley Green, Pompeiian red and gold. Many people (including this writer) have lived alongside the lampposts for years and never really looked at them.

Take a moment to admire these astounding survivals, celebrated in this year's September Heritage Open Days festival.

## 'WALKING ON THE BEACHES' - 3 OF THE BEST NEAR BEVERLEY

We are very lucky to have such a fine coastline on our doorstep. Let's hope this August brings plenty more fine weather for us to enjoy them.

Here, I explore 3 of the best, each within a 45 minute drive from Beverley, and each quite easily reached by train and/or bus. All three offer fine sands and bathing prospects, all have refreshments and toilets close at hand. They are also perfect for short strolls, to really get a feel for the coastal landscape.

Our nearest beaches are less than 15 miles away at Hornsea and Mappleton. They are pleasant enough, the former, a medium-sized resort, with amusements, lots of pubs, shops and cafes.

2 miles south, Mappleton is much quieter, but very popular with locals. This may not be a

view shared by all, but I think we have to head a few miles north to find our region's best beaches. Let's start at Bridlington North Bay, blessed by panoramic views of the soaring chalk cliffs towards Flamborough Head. This is the favourite of my wife and younger daughter, as it is excellent for swimming. Not for me, I once caught a chill from the North Sea, so now it's just a case of modest paddling! The promenade area up to the splendid Expanse Hotel, has good cafes and takeaways, with public toilets at the corner of Limekiln Lane.

The popular Land Train that will whisk you up to Sewerby Hall, adds to the jaunty seaside atmosphere. For those who like to stretch their legs, a stroll north towards the chalk cliffs along the increasingly rocky shoreline, is a real tonic.

Flamborough Head can claim 6 accessible beaches, each of which are well worth a visit.



South Landing is smashing, but lacks toilets and refreshments. So all in all, I feel North Landing offers the best option, with good car parking, and even an open top bus ride to and from Bridlington. The coastal scenery hereabouts is truly stunning with easy strolls in both directions. Just to the north of the fine sandy cove, used in the recent film of Dads Army; there is even a hidden waterfall, the only one in the East Riding. The cafe and bar, with boat trips to see the caves and sealife, make this a fantastic day out.



Our final local beach, takes us just over the county boundary into North Yorkshire. You can walk the 1.5 miles from Hunmanby train station to the glorious beaches at Hunmanby Gap, and there is paid parking on the adjacent cliiff.

The cafe, perched above the sea is desrevedly popular. The sands and views here are really exceptional, amongst the very best in the UK, with sweeping views towards Filey and south to Bempton. Walking here is a joy, towards Reighton the sands take on a tropical island quality, and you might even enjoy a spot of fossil-hunting.



So this August, unless the weather takes a downturn, head to the seaside, perhaps humming the Strangler's tune "Walking on the Beaches".



# CARFAN - OPEL MANTA GT/E

If the subject of this issue was built today it would probably be called a Vauxhall, but it wasn't and it isn't, it's an Opel Manta GT/E

Formed way back in 1862 before being taken over by General Motors and now Stellantis, Opel originally launched the "A" version in 1970 before replacing it with the "B" in 1975 and the latter is featured here, being produced in 1985.

Lovers of the German language will appreciate that when discussing cars the E in GT/E stands for einsprit which means injection, indicating that the car has no carburettors. To complete



the language lesson, it is generally accepted that GT (in Italian) stands for Gran Turismo or Grand Tourer in English. The current owner has had the car for 26 years and has spent ten thousand pounds on it and it certainly shows.

A lot of that went on a re-spray, not to mention new full chassis rails, floorpan and a re-built petrol tank. The Opel Owners Club is the best place to get parts, as is so often with cars that are becoming quite rare, largely due to the old enemy of vehicles that don't spend their lives cocooned in heated and de-humidified garages - rust.

This version is known as an Irmscher and has optional extra headlamps together with beautiful Recaro seats which certainly lift the interior to another level. It has done 98,000 miles and a B.M.W. getrag 5 speed gearbox makes touring just that little bit easier with its 2 litre engine.

Should you fancy a GT/E on your drive, good luck finding one as a cursory search found just one on a well-known car sale site for £15,000 with similar mileage to the one featured, albeit totally restored.

And don't forget, should you come across this teutonic beauty on your travels, don't forget that cheery Carfan wave!



# COUNTRYSIDE MATTERS WITH SAM WALTON

Having mentioned Waratah Farms in New Zealand last time and their dairy herd, they also have 1200 breeding sows from which they supply replacement gilts the length and breadth of New Zealand.



The piggeries there are pretty much the same as they are here, but they have to cope with extremes of weather greater than we do.



The farm is an excellent set up for getting the best out of the grass as not only do cows graze grass all the year round, but there is also a really excellent set up for the slurry from the pig unit too.

There the slurry pit is completely covered over

with plastic sheets for two reasons, one to avoid any smells and secondly to prevent the heavy rain they get from diluting the slurry and taking up storage space.



The pigs are either on solid flooring with scrape through dung passages or are on plastic slats, where the slurry drops through the slats into a sort of sump underneath, from where the slurry is then pumped into the slurry lagoon to be spread on the grass, which the cows have grazed whish helps to fertilise the grass for the next grazing.

Some of the grass is too hilly for a tractor to travel on but they have several hundred acres where they can spread.

Some of the higher ground can be fertilised from the air but I hasten to add, none of that is slurry!

A very good unit from UK Genetics and of course you would expect no less!



## IN THE GARDEN... AUGUST

Welcome to August and I hope we have enough pleasant weather for you to sit in the garden and enjoy the fruits of your labours earlier in the year. The vegetable plot will be bountiful in August and harvesting will be a daily task.

We will continue to have similar weather to July, although there can be a noticeable chill in the evenings and towards the end of the month, we will start to see the first signs of autumn, with flower colours becoming more muted and some leaves starting to turn brown.

#### Tasks for August...

- Lightly trim hedges and Lavender bushes once the flowers have finished (this is not essential, and finches love the seeds).
- Pick courgettes whilst they are still small and tender.
- Pinch out tomato side shoots and runner beans when they reach the top of the cane.
- Prune raspberries and gooseberries after fruiting.
- Mow the lawn before going on holiday do not give it 'a short back and sides,' because if there is a dry spell while your away, you will return to a 'brown lawn'
- Roses stop feeding them as any lush new growth will not have time to ripen before the winter. Prune the long old stems of rambling roses when they have finished flowering, leave those that have not flowered this year to bloom next summer.
- If you have Camellias, Azaleas or Rhododendrons water them well in dry weather otherwise the flower buds for next year may not develop properly. To boost growth, feed them a liquid ericaceous feed.

Having just had the hottest two days on record, one task on every gardener's mind will be 'watering' whether you are away on holiday or staying put at home.

Firstly, established plants will need little or no watering as their root system will be developed and get moisture from deeper in the soil. However newly planted shrubs and containers will need watering.

- It is better to give plants a good soaking every few days rather than a splash every day.
- The best time to water is in the evening the sun is not evaporating the water and soaks deeper into the soil. If you cannot manage an evening water, do it early in the morning.
- Minimise the amount of water you use by:
  - Not watering the lawn yes, it will go brown, but grass is resilient and at the first decent rainfall we have it will 'green up'.
  - Ditch the hose for a watering can yes it may seem like harder work, but you will be amazed at how much less water you use.
  - Long term mulch your borders with organic matter, this will help reduce evaporation and the organic matter also holds moisture.
  - Consider harvesting rainwater in water butts it is free (well it is after the initial investment of the water butt).
- If you are going away place all your pots and containers in a shady spot, close together and get a kind neighbour/friend/relative to come and water for you at least if they are all in the same spot they are not going to 'miss' one out.

#### And don't forget...

Spring flowering bulbs will start to be stocked in garden centres and nurseries. If you want hyacinths flowering in the house for Christmas, now is the time to buy your prepared hyacinth bulbs.

Prepared hyacinths have simply been conned into thinking they have had a 'winter' (by placing them in a cold store) so when you plant them up in bowls, they think it is spring and start growing - clever heh!

That's all for now – have a lovely time this August whether you are away or spending time at home, if you get chance maybe visit some gardens for inspiration in your own patch.
