Mingus Menzie-Baird celebrates his birthday for SSAFA, the Armed Forces Charity

Never one to shirk a challenge, Mingus will set out on January 20th, 2018, as he reaches his 56th year, to complete the SAS selection test march, known as the 'Fan Dance'. The march is named after Pen y Fan, a 2907ft mountain in the Brecon Beacons which 'Fan Dancers' must climb. The total length of the march is 24km - which also includes climbing a very steep path known as 'Jacob's Ladder' - must be completed within 6 hours. And marchers must carry a load of 25lb in their back-packs, too!



Why is Mingus undertaking this challenge? The charity which Mingus Chairs - the North-East Region of the Soldier, Sailor, Airmen and Families Association (SSAFA) - is in need of funds to ensure the increasing work-load it is called on to perform can be met. Formed in 1885, SSAFA is the original military charity which helps anyone in need if they have had or currently have a role in one of our armed forces; it also helps their families and merchant seaman and their families if they were on ships used in the Atlantic convoys in WW2. In this area alone, requests for help total more than £100,000/annum and volunteers undertake over 200 case visits a month. Our armed forces make many sacrifices in serving our country and deserve all the help we can give them. Unfortunately, the need is increasing and funds are dwindling, so Mingus aims to raise £2.5million by January along with his training partner, Chris Gibson, from EYMS.

Mingus is training by walking around Beverley carrying just 12lb in weight. If you see him, wave him down and add weight to his back-pack in the form of a cash donation - you'll be helping him achieve his training goal and the charity with the money!

Lucy Hepworth, Matthew Bestley and Julia Sharpe, otherwise known as 'Method in Madness' have taken on the challenge of raising money for a new much-needed Youth Club for 9-13 year-olds in Walkington. As three children who love to socialise, they want to be able to meet in a safe and secure way, to make a difference to young people so they have someone to talk to and people who will listen.

The Lifestylers have approached the Methodist Church and their newly-appointed Children and Family Worker who are delighted to welcome their fundraising efforts and have agreed to home and help run the club. The Lifestylers are aiming to raise £500 at a coffee morning on Saturday 26 August 10am - 1pm to put towards equipment

and refreshments for the Youth Club. The children, who are musically-talented, will be entertaining with live music with piano recitals and flute solos and duets and singing. Refreshments will be served and there will be a raffle and tombola. To help disabled people get to the coffee morning, they are looking to book a Beverley Community Lift bus, too!

Lifestyle is a project that was set up in 1989 to challenge young people to get involved with their communities, using their spare time to make a real difference.

This is not just about diverting young people from getting involved in crime and antisocial behaviour, it's about inspiring them to make positive choices and want to help others.

Lucy Hepworth said: "We think there are lots of young people who would enjoy a Youth Club so we hope we will get plenty of support in our attempts to make a difference to our local community. Do come along to the coffee morning - it will be fun!"



'It's Different for Girls' - a new musical inspired by 1960's Hull girl-band Mandy & The Girlfriends'

Mandy and the Girlfriends were a real band.
Practicing in a garden shed, the girls, all aged 16 &
17, gigged around Hull and toured US air-bases in
Germany. They were even invited onto Opportunity
Knocks, but decided to stay in Germany and play
live.

They recorded tracks at Fairview Studios in Willerby (still unreleased) and an album in a front room lined with egg-boxes! Their story, published as 'It's Different for Girls' is the inspiration for this new musical devised by East Riding Theatre's own resident company, She Productions, who present it during the month of September.

Through original songs, dancing and a witty script, She Productions will transport you back to the 1960's to celebrate five women who made their mark on the Hull music scene. It's a tale of female empowerment across the generations which came into being after She Productions met some of the original members of Mandy & The Girlfriends. In some ways, there are some extraordinary parallels between She Productions and Mandy & The Girlfriends.

She Productions have had to learn to play new instruments, overcome artistic challenge and to write drama inspired by history;

The Girlfriends had to learn to play instruments and battle against a male-dominated industry to find their moment in the spotlight. Although the musical follows the narrative of a fictional band, the essence is that of the challenges of the 1960s - both bands practice in a garden shed...

Artistic Director of East Riding Theatre, Adrian Rawlins comments, "These are not easy times for any emerging theatre company, so here at ERT we are



very proud to be able to support She Productions. They are a great asset to ERT. Their creativity, enthusiasm and commitment is infectious and they continue to inspire and attract young performers and audience to the theatre. Their last show MissCast had me in stitches for virtually two hours and now they are taking us back to 1960s Hull. It's going to be a cracking show... can't wait.'

Directed by Becky Hope-Palmer with musical supervision from Paul Frankish and choreography by Jon Beney (Hull Truck), the cast includes Rachel Barnes, Abey Bradbury, Sophie Coward, Annie Kirkman and Alice Rose Palmer.



Create your own style with the help of Lee Wardell from Verb

Struggling to coordinate your wardrobe? Looking for ideas to freshen up your wardrobe? Throughout my years of retail experience, one of the most common colours which has held a place in men's wardrobes is the colour navy. Men see this as a 'go-to' colour possibly due to the popularity of jeans as a men's staple.

Following on from this, any shade of blue, as it is such a neutral back drop, can be given an accent of colour: oranges, pinks, and browns all work well. As mentioned in last month's edition, belts and shoes in tan, coordinate well with navy also.

Men gravitate towards safer colours whereas partners may well encourage a little bit of brightness. What has got to be remembered is it is a balance between the wearer and the viewer and also a balance between comfort and style. A happy medium is always needed.

Following on from Navy, one very popular colour palette is one which denotes the country landscape: the blue sky, burnt orange sun, green hedgerows, brown fields and the red berry's. Recreate these colours, with a skyblue shirt, green check jacket, brown shoes and belt, blue jeans and then add a touch of colour in a berry red tie/cravat or silk square, with the alternative of burnt orange waistcoat or accessories.

Obviously black or midnight blue is a very dressy look and can be contrasted with white,



red or grey and that can give a formal look.

Whilst coordinating these colours, consideration should be given to eye colour, hair colour and skin complexion. Most men will be aware of colours which wash them out or clash with their eye or hair colour. This

is another reason why it is essential to try on in natural daylight and visit your local independent retailer for a trusted honest opinion.

Finally, making sure you wear the correct fit. Trouser length should break once on the shoe with a straight rear seam which lands half way between the top of the shoe and the top of the heel. Pockets should not bulge - this is caused by too tight a fit on the seat /glutes. Belts should always be worn if

belt loops are provided. Shirts should always be tested for practicality - sit down to make sure there are no puckering of the buttons.

Jackets should always fit the shoulder well and all other areas of a jacket including sleeves, waist and body length can be altered by a good tailor. For any further guidance, pop into the store so that you can try on and get the best colour and fit for you.




















I've Been Thinking... by Colin Raynor

I have been thinking, in this month of August, about teachers. I have never subscribed to the view that teachers have an easy life. I would suggest that the teachers of our young people are working in one of the most demanding environments in our current society. Whilst the results of their endeavours can be rewarding for themselves and their pupils, they have, I believe, one of the most difficult and at times, dangerous of jobs.



I write this because recently I heard that a teacher of mine had died after a long illness. Whilst I was sad to hear this news I was honest with myself when I recalled why I could so easily bring this person to mind. I remembered this man for two reasons. He was our English (Literature) teacher and he was one of the best teachers in the school.

If I have a love of books, poetry, theatre etc. it is because he made the written word come alive. Dickens, Shakespeare and Tennyson were no longer just words in a book. When "Jock" took classes (every teacher I ever knew had a nickname!) the words of our greatest writers became real and I shared the emotions as this teacher led us through the rich prose.

You will see above that there were two reasons why I remembered this teacher. The second reason is that, like most school children I would often say of Jock "I don't like that teacher" and usually, as in my case, it wasn't because of his ability as a teacher. Jock was, to our young minds, not a very nice person. It wasn't just that he was a disciplinarian - he had to be with our rowdy lot! In modern parlance we would say "he took no prisoners."

His view was "you are here to learn and I am here to teach so lets' get on with it". If you hadn't done your homework, if you didn't understand "iambic pentameter" and all that, tough, you'd better find out before next lesson or else!

On reflection, we were a group of youngsters who had come from the comfort of home life with mothers and fathers who had in most cases cared for us with love and compassion and who gave us praise for just about everything we did. From this teacher, all we got was harsh words and reprimands and in those days often a piece of chalk (or blackboard duster) flying past our heads.

I have never forgotten 'Jock" and his death made me reflect once again on the fact that the people who make an impression on our lives are not always those who we like initially, or indeed ever. But if we are honest, the vibrancy of learning they implant in us usually far outweighs the poor image we have held of them as people. The Christian church has a leader who is at times called Teacher. He was known as a man of love but He also spoke harsh words and indeed said "My way is the only way - no man comes to know the Father but through me".

History records that many people have accepted those words as a way to a fuller and more satisfying life.

How do other people perceive you? You could be surprised!

Your reputation is based on what others think of you. A good reputation can be lost very rapidly if the behaviour you exhibit is deemed as negative or harmful, which is why there are companies which manage the reputations of senior managers and politicians! In this day and age, reputations can be lost at the click of a mouse as bad news travels fast along the grapevine or by social media. So, what is the best way of ensuring people perceive you in the way you want to be perceived?

Having worked in senior management in some very large companies, having a personal 'brand' was as important as having a brand identity for the company and the products it sold. Every year we underwent what is known as '360 degree' feedback from superiors and reports to ensure that behaviours meant to demonstrate positivity weren't interpreted negatively.

For example, not responding to a question with an immediate acknowledgement was seen as rude or disinterested (whereas the people doing that said they were just thinking about an

appropriate response) but people answering directly and to the point were seen as blunt and uncaring (whereas they thought they were being transparent and honest).

One of the best things I learnt from 'brand' management was that people who said 'yes' to everything were seen as a soft touch, even though they thought they were trying to be helpful. It's impossible to be all things to all men, so saying 'no' to things which aren't within your skill-set or which you really don't want to do - or which you don't have the capacity to do - is a strength. Being over-committed leads to tiredness, too much pressure leads to stress and too much stress makes you ill. And then your reputation suffers accordingly because you are perceived as being unreliable.

The most important person in your life is you. It is your responsibility to ensure you enjoy what you do and that other people appreciate the choices you have made. If there are negative perceptions about you and you want to put them right then you can - but often the negative is just a positive



from a different perspective. If you are satisfied and confident that the perspective you give to the world is the right one for you, then shrug off your detractors and achieve what you want to achieve.

And above all, be happy!

Could you be a My Guide?

Guide Dogs, the charity known more commonly as Guide Dogs for the Blind Association, has traditionally been associated with providing guide dogs for visually-impaired users. But today the charity is very different to the one which was set up in 1934 in that it now also provides additional mobility and rehabilitation services as well as guide dogs, campaigns for the equal rights of people with visual impairment and invests in eye disease research.

Its Head office is based in Reading. It has a Guide Dog breeding centre and four Guide Dog Training Schools but there are 20 Mobility Teams across the country. These Teams are dedicated to helping sight-impaired people get out and about (become more mobile) and one is based in Beverley! 50 years ago, the popular children's television programme teamed up with the Guide Dogs for the Blind Association when trainee Guide Dog Honey was puppy-walked by Valerie Singleton and Christopher Trace until she qualified.



Last year, Blue Peter (yes, it is still running, although only aired on CBBC) did the same thing when Iggy was followed through her puppy-walking and training stages until matched with Callum, who has been blind since birth.

Creating awareness of this charity is vital as it depends on many volunteers. But it is those volunteers who provide so much of the support which improves the well-being and confidence of service-users. One of the initiatives which the Beverley Mobility Team is piloting is that of My Guides - people, not dogs, being the eyes for the visual-impaired.

Although a guide dog can be a huge boon and can get their owner out of the house, dogs are unable to help with shopping, go swimming or round a gym!

My Guide matches a visually-impaired person with a sighted person with similar interests to help them maximise their independence. Lynne Clarkson is a guide dog owner who was desperate to use a gym to maintain her fitness - but being registered blind, using the gym without a helper was difficult and sometimes dangerous. Lynne told **Just Beverley**: "I could change into my gym kit and get Abbie, my guide dogs, to take me to the gym but gyms are full of obstacles - mats, free weights, equipment, people! Setting the machines up and getting on and off them without help is impossible for me. I applied through Guide Dogs and



now have a My Guide who takes me to the gym and ensures I am safe whilst I work out.

"As a carer, she has free gym membership and, if I'm on, say, a rowing machine, she can hop on the one next door and have a bit of a work-out, too. She came along with me to my induction and learnt what I had to do. She ensures I follow my programme. The gym staff are very helpful, too. My Guide gives me peace-of-mind and I can't tell you how much my confidence has improved! I also go tandem cycling with HERIB (Hull and East Riding Institute for the Blind) - the exercise in the gym has improved my ability to cycle, too."

My Guides can help people who are waiting for a guide dog. There are 2 million people registered with sight-impairment



Another 'match' made recently was between an artist who tragically lost his sight very quickly and an art-lover who takes him to the theatre, galleries and art events. He is able to describe the art-works, introduce him to a wider social circle and increase his quality-of-life.

Paul Bush, Community Engagement Officer at Guide Dogs Hull Mobility Team (as the Beverley Team is called, although it covers the whole of East Yorkshire and Lincolnshire and much of North Yorkshire, too!) calls the service they provide, whether through guide dogs or My Guides 'Impairment to Empowerment'. Surveys of service-users have identified gaps which the Mobility Team are trying to fill - and one of those areas is finding younger people as well as older people to become My Guides, or in other volunteer roles.

Paul said: "Guide dogs need a break so every week we have volunteers who take them for a free run in a park or on the beach. The dogs are so well-trained that they will never run off, but they, like us, need down-time. We also welcome approaches from people who will adopt retired guide dogs or even failed dogs and we also need puppy walkers. We now have two Guide Dog Trainers based here in Beverley who are training dogs which have come straight from the puppy walkers rather than going to training school with the intention of reducing training times whilst maintaining the very high standards for all of our partnerships. We also need fund-raisers! There are lots of opportunities for anyone who loves what Guide Dogs can do!"



If you could offer your time in any of these areas, Paul would love to hear from you! As a guide dog owner himself (of Vargo) he understands the value of the charity and the necessity of ensuring sight-impaired people are valued along with the volunteers.

"We never underestimate the change our volunteers are making to the lives of our service users - without them, so many more people would be socially-isolated and unhappy. So, whatever you do or can do for us, here's a big thank you!"

Research and Development Enhanced Tax Relief

Research and Development Tax Relief is available to a small and medium sized limited companies that carry out specific R & D work. The tax relief for this is based on 230% of the actual cost of the research and development

Many businesses will be carrying out this type of work without realising that there is an enhanced tax relief available to them. Qualifying costs must have been incurred and cannot be of a capital nature. However, revenue costs that have been put to the balance sheet can still be included within the R&D Claim. Capital costs relating to R&D work qualify for capital allowances at 100%.

Qualifying revenue costs include:

- Staff costs
- · Materials consumed or transformed
- Water and fuel
- Specially commissioned parts
- Software
- Software designed or adapted
- Subcontractor costs
- · A proportion of variable overheads

In order to claim relief a company must have been engaged in qualifying R&D activity and then satisfy a number of specific conditions, as follows:

- The company must not be in receipt of a notified state aid in respect of the project.
- Expenditure must not be subsidised.
- The company must not have been contracted to carry out the R&D.
- The company must be a going concern.
- Any single R&D project must not receive total aid of more than €7.5m.

To claim relief:

- An R&D report should be submitted along with the company tax return as part of the tax computation.
- It is helpful that the principal activities statement to the accounts should state that R&D work is part of the company's business activities.

Example:

If a company were to spend £25,000 on R & D expenditure, with the R & D enhanced allowance the tax deductible cost becomes £57,500. The additional allowance of £32,500 will give a corporation tax saving of £6,500 (Based on a corporation tax rate of 20%).

In the garden... August

August is probably the only summer month that a gardener can take a holiday, with the proviso that they have mown the lawn, watered thoroughly and engaged the help of a friend/neighbour to pick the fruit and vegetables - and maybe water if necessary. In August the days become noticeably shorter and there is often a chill in the evening and heavy dew. By the end of the month plants are starting to become autumnal, with leaves start to turn colour.

Tasks for August

- Arrange holiday care for your garden if you are going away to help the 'caretakers', move any containers out of the direct sun and huddle them together to make watering easier.
- Take cuttings of shrubby herbs and tender perennials, such as Verbenas, Argyranthemums, Fuchsias, Salvias and Pelargoniums. Dip the cuttings into a hormone rooting compound before inserting them into small pots of half peat and perlite or peat and silver sand. Water in well and keep the cuttings in a cold frame or even on warm windowsill out of direct sunlight. They should root within eight weeks and can then be potted up in Multi-Purpose compost and overwintered in a heated greenhouse or on a bedroom windowsill.
- · Water all containers every day and feed regularly If you have Camellias, Azaleas or Rhododendrons water them well in dry weather otherwise the flower buds for next year may not develop properly. To boost growth feed them a liquid ericaceous feed.
- Trim hedges and Lavender once the flowers have gone over, however if you want to attract birds to the garden this can wait until later, finches love the seeds on lavender.
- Treat vine weevil with biological control we rarely see the adults as they are nocturnal and hide during the day (in leaf litter, loose brickwork and woodwork at soil level) and crawl up onto plants at night where they eat irregular holes and notches out of leaves (Rhododendrons and Camellias are favourites). It is the larvae of the vine weevil which causes the greatest damage to plants. They feed on fleshy roots, corms and tubers of many plants - they are particularly troublesome on pot plants grown in houses and greenhouses, but can affect plants grown outdoors in borders. I once had an infestation of grubs on the Heucheras in my border (nice fleshy roots), the first indication was the plants wilted for no apparent reason and when I pulled them out of the ground there were no roots left.
- · Pinch out tomato side shoots.
- Prune raspberries and gooseberries when they have finished fruiting.
- · Mow the lawn before going on holiday.

And don't forget...

Spring flowering bulbs will start to be stocked in garden centres and nurseries. If you want hyacinths flowering in the house for Christmas, now is the time to buy your prepared hyacinth bulbs. Prepared hyacinths have simply been conned into thinking they have had a 'winter' (by placing them in a cold store) so when you plant them up in bowls they think it is spring and start growing - clever heh!

The first thing we learnt was that it's hearsay that a village show is all about growing the biggest vegetables, fruit and flowers! What it is about is quality. It can be quite a serious business, too, as judges from the National Vegetable Society come along to judge some of the classes. And it's also not just about horticulture - it includes showcasing baking, crafts and photography, for children as well as grown-ups.

The baking classes can get quite competitive, too, as the WI come to judge some of those, tasting every entry! But as Margaret said, "Although the judging can be serious, it's important to view the show as fun! It's a day when everyone in the villages can come together to recognise their own talents, admire entries from outside and welcome everyone to enjoy the displayed entries whilst enjoying tea and cake. This year, the classes are so diverse - we really would invite adults and children from anywhere to give even just one of the classes a go!"



Looking through the schedules, we understand why Leven Sports Hall is so busy on show day. The baking classes had our mouths watering as they include making: - a fruit loaf (which is a class which attracts 10-15 entries and is always of very high quality); scones; pies, gingerbread; carrot cake and this year, there is a set recipe of a seed cake from a 1901 edition of a defunct magazine called 'Hull Lady' in recognition of Hull City of Culture.

There's also a decorated cake competition. Then there's classes for winemaking and for fruit spirit, such as sloe gin and damson vodka. Margaret commented: "Someone entered sloe whisky one year and they let me have a taste. I'm not a fan of Scotch or Irish whiskey, but sloe whisky is something else! I hope they enter again!"

The craft, art and photography classes, which include floral art are always popular, although the biggest attraction is probably the horticulture section for fruit, vegetables and flowers. And then there are the children's classes which are split into age groups. There's crafts, photography, baking and handwriting for the under 16's. Margaret said: "The floral art section is not that well supported, even though I know there are lots of Flower Groups in the area. One of the classes this year is to portray 'One Hull of a City' so we're hoping that will get the creative juices flowing and even attract more entries from Hull." If you have green fingers, love to bake or create, do get yourself a full schedule of classes and an entry form for this wonderful show. As they say, you have to be in it to win it! Prizes this year will be presented by Terry Etherington and Vera Caygill, local people who have just retired after 40 years of running Leven Sports Hall, where the show is held.

Legal Q's and A's

Every month, Just Beverley asks a team of legal experts to answer a question to which we don't know the answer.

This month the question is about unwarranted personal complaints in the work-force.

Q. A complaint was made about me at work which was shown to be totally untrue. My employers won't give me a copy of the complaint. They say it was dealt with unofficially and if I pursue it, it will go on my record. Surely I have a legal right to see what was said about me?

Coles the Solicitors have provided the following response:

A. Your employer is entitled to protect the identity of the person who made the complaint. If you want to pursue this, you can write to your employer and your letter would be followed up by a meeting. However, these procedures would be logged on your work record and could be used in future for the purposes of disciplinary action or, for example, for supplying a reference. It may be best to let sleeping dogs lie.



The Benefits of Dark Chocolate - even more of an excuse to indulge!

Did you know that dark chocolate (minimum 85% coca solids) can help reverse memory loss and improve attention? That it is good for people with sleep deprivation and insomnia? And that can help people lose weight? Want to know more - then read on!



Cocoa contains powerful antioxidants call flavanols which bolster connections between neurons in the brain, particularly in the dentate gyrus in the hippocampus, which is the part of the brain which is involved in long-term memory and in spatial memory which enables us to navigate around.


A study for the Alzheimer's Society in America by Brickman et al in 2014, which was endorsed by the National Institute of Health, showed amazing improvements

in average non-Alzheimer's 50-70-year-olds who were given high doses of cocoa flavanols. The results were so good that they performed as well as the average 30-40 year-old!

This has now been backed up by a recent Italian meta-analysis of all the data involving chocolate and memory by Socci and Ferrara from the University of L'Aquila, who are quoted in The Independent as saying that 'cocoa flavanols could result in immediate cognitive-enhancing effect, sustaining performance particularly in cognitively-demanding conditions including fatigue and sleeploss.' This would suggest that chocolate is a necessity - not just a treat!

The bad news is that the study subjects in most studies were given extra high doses of cocoa flavanols, up to 900mg, which is the equivalent of eating 17x100g bars of dark chocolate at once!

But the good news is that it would be very difficult to eat that much, as dark chocolate makes you feel full very quickly due to its ability to decrease insulin-resistance (insulin controls the transfer of sugar from the bloodstream to the cells in your body) and lower the levels of ghrelin (high levels of ghrelin increase appetite). Even smelling chocolate can make you feel full!





The other benefit of dark chocolate is that it is a 'sirtfood': it contains polyphenols which activate proteins called sirtuins, which regulate metabolism, burning fat and promoting muscle-growth. It also contains about 10% protein, which in itself blocks the receptors which tell your body it is hungry. So the message is that a small amount of dark chocolate every day is good for you and it can help control your appetite and that chocolate is food for thought!

With all this in mind, White Rabbit Chocolatiers have been working with local Masterchef Quarter-finalist Mike Williams, to develop a new 4-course chocolate menu! They already bake their own bread, make their own cakes, offer a 2-course lunch (which involves chocolate fondue) and have a Luxury Chocolate Afternoon Tea in planning as well as make the most delicious truffles and chocolates!

Classic Cars with Carfan - the Triumph Herald

For a long time, a tricky quiz question was to ask what car had the best turning circle after the London taxi cab and the answer is the subject this month - the Triumph Herald.

Designed by the Italian Giovanni Michelotti, who we have to thank for over 20 Maseratis and Ferraris, as well as the Triumph Stag and Scimitar SS1, over half a million were produced, ranging from the saloon, convertible and estate to the rare coupe and van. Available new from 1959 to 1971, the Herald could be described as a genuine, if basic, utilitarian British car which has yet to reach so-called Classic status, although it could be argued that it has that by virtue of its age alone.

The performance wouldn't have given Usain Bolt any problems in the early days, but the Vitesse model, with its 6-cylinder engine is certainly nippy enough, should you want to feel the need for speed - the moniker Vitesse is surely appropriate here.

Prices vary tremendously for a Herald. For those sufficiently brave to take it on, a total restoration project can be picked up for a few hundred pounds, while at the other extreme, a fully restored and ready-to-drive convertible can reach the heady heights of sixteen thousand pounds - so the choice is yours. Two features of the car are its general ease of access to the engine as well as the availability of spares, with new interiors still being manufactured and other parts in surprisingly plentiful supply.

The featured car is a 1200c.c. version, produced in 1968. Its proud owner bought it for £350 and spent seven years restoring it, replacing the chassis and respraying it himself. So if you see a Herald executing a neat 3 point turn, don't forget the cheery Carfan wave!



Golf with Michael Durcan - The Unseen Side of Pro Golf: Sponsorship Stresses and Sole Struggles

This week, a national newspaper reported on this years Opens' Newest Qualifier, Nick McCarthy. The story detailed some of the personal sacrifices which Nick has been forced to make, to enable him to continue to pursue his career as a professional golfer.

Many non-golfers who read Nick's story will probably have been surprised to learn of the financial struggles which have accompanied him on the path to achieving his dream. However, any pro golfer which read Nick's story will relate to his struggles and sacrifices. I for one certainly did. There exists a public misconception that all pro golfers are affluent and have a jet set lifestyle where they tour the world and stay in 5 star luxury. Unfortunately, this is far from the reality of our day-to-day life. Unless, you rank alongside the small number of players in the world rankings, equivalent to football's premier league, you live a less than glamourous lifestyle. Nick said: 'the level I'm at is like the third division. You pay for everything - food, petrol, accommodation. To get that back you almost have to finish in the top 10 out of 160 at every competition.'

From travel, to accommodation, to the game entry fees, to the kit, most of the time outgoings exceed incoming and, until you are playing and achieve good prize money, you have very little. Every penny you have is used to fund the expenses to attend the next event. Unless, that is, you manage to secure sponsorship the primary solution to any pro golfers financial woes. Securing sponsorship for any professional golfer however, is a challenging task. Many people, outside the golf industry believe that as soon as a pro golfer wins a professional tournament they also receive offers of sponsorship.

Unfortunately, that is far from the case. Our reality is that even after winning events and titles there is no guarantee sponsorship will be provided. In order to attract and secure the interests of investors what's the secret recipe required? Success? Winning? Competing as well as you possibly can?

They are for me what you would expect companies to want when considering potential sponsorship opportunities. Yet, even though I am delivering the aforementioned, it has not as yet been enough for me to receive sponsorship.

Zack Byrd, Dustin Johnson's old college team-mate, is another example of a pro golfer who has struggled to survive in the game due to financial difficulties. For him, the struggle can be likened to gambling every day in life. He said: 'It's a gamble....you gamble on yourself, and you hope to win....'

Byrd, who has just recently managed to secure some minimal sponsorship which will facilitate his next tour, noted: 'It's stressful; it's hard. I can't tell you the last time I woke up and wasn't stressed out. It's constant stress.' Perhaps, if more businesses were aware that in return for sponsoring a pro golfer they often receive benefits for their investment. For example, I offer my sponsors corporate golf day events at which I provide golf lessons to them and their colleagues etc. Also, sponsoring a professional athlete can be a good advertising/pr opportunity with positive coverage and publicity for their business on a local, national and even international level depending on the golfers tour and success.

However, to date businesses remain sceptical and investors remain limited so for now, until I secure sponsorship, I have no alternative but to keep trying to secure sponsorship and scraping by whilst calculating every cost.

Why? you might ask do I continue and persevere with my dream to be a world class professional golfer despite the challenges and hardship. I continue because when I feel like quitting I ask myself why I started and embarked on my dream. I remember my 10 year old self who wanted to take their love and devotion for golf forward into my future career and I remind myself of the tremendous support I have always received from my parents. With that I continue and remain determined.



If getting to the top necessitates me experiencing the lows and travelling a tough road I will continue, ensuring when I achieve the highs I embrace every single second of them.

As for the Open this week, I will of course be supporting McCarthy who, if he plays well, will not have to worry about seeking out sponsorship on his own again. The sponsors will instead approach and be very eager to sign him.

Tales from the Racecourse - betting is not what it used to be!

It's fast approaching Ladies race day at Beverley and this year is tipped to be one of the best as Sally and her team get ready for an exciting fun filled day. Catering have some great food on offer and are expecting to serve 1000 plus meals in the restaurant as well as 500 bottles of champagne.

There are going to be many top jockeys riding and I have already ordered the hottest day of the year. I've sorted some winners for you too - check the tipster board in the paddock. Beat the Bookie tips are in red; he's red hot right now having had 5 out of 6 winners in one June afternoon! In the past, a race day consisted of 6 races and were sponsored by wealthy individuals or

businesses and you very rarely saw any banners or advertising. Now most race days are 7 or 8 races and sponsored by the big bookmakers.

The traditional tic tac men are a thing of the past as all the betting is computerised, so if someone has a large bet at the bookies then the odds will automatically change everywhere - much quicker than relying on the telephone and the men in white gloves!

Back in the 60s I remember a syndicate of 6 men who planned to back their horse by standing close to 6 bookmakers and at the blow of a whistle place their bets at exactly the same time, ensuring that they all got 33/1, as the bookmakers didn't

have time to alter their prices. The plan worked a treat! But due to technology, this wouldn't happen now as the system is so fast and within seconds every bookmaker would know that a large bet had gone on.

In the late 60s, there was a Tipster known as 'The Major' who would walk around the car park at Beverley selling tips in brown envelopes. He would shout out "Follow the Major" and for a shilling you could buy an envelope containing the names of three horses running that afternoon. People thought they were buying the names of winners - most weren't of course, but



eventually the winner would crop up in someone's little brown envelope! And the Major meanwhile had made himself a nice profit! How things have changed!

In my early betting days, I would visit a terraced house at Potter Hill in Beverley where Mr. Wiles ran a betting shop from his front room. There were no such thing as official betting slips then, so bets were scribbled out on a piece of paper or cigarette packet with your name or nickname written on it. You can no longer visit Mr. Wiles in his front room but you can place your bets wherever you are from your tablet or phone and, of course, at the racecourse.


Well that's all for now. I hope you have a great Ladies Day and I'll see you there with the winners!

Walking with Ian Richardson - Leven Linear - 5 Miles





This is an unusual walk for the East Riding as it follows watercourses for the entire length. in a county perhaps better known for its dry valleys and Wolds.

It is best done as a linear route, the only viable way to return on foot is by the way you came. It is ideal for using the good EYMS 246 bus service that serves Leven and Hull Bridge from Beverley and Hornsea. The walk is perfect for a summer's day or evening and being so close to water, the flora and fauna are particularly abundant, I even saw a snake - the first I have spotted in Yorkshire for twenty years.

1 The newly refurbished riverside pub, the Crown and Anchor, is a great place to start any walk. Easily reached in 10 minutes by bus from Sow Hill, or you can walk to it over Swine Moor, which is alive in summer with wild flowers and horses. There is a moving plaque on the footbridge to mark those killed here in an air crash during WW2: we have a tendency these days to take peace for granted, but the historian in me says we never should. There is also something of a mystery in the car park overflow field just behind the fantastic new ice cream parlour. As the photo shows, here is the striking remains of what appears to be a church entrance but my researches and enquiries have so far drawn a blank as to what exactly it is - maybe you could let me know? It is grand to see boats for hire on the river; rowing and motor boats are available just across the bridge



If you can drag yourself from the many refreshment options, you should now head up the River Hull, first passing under the busy road bridge. Within a few minutes you leave the traffic noise behind and enjoy the tranquillity of what is the most northerly chalk stream in England. Route-finding is easy on this walk; just head a mile up-river until you come to a very large lake. Many local people who do not know this impressive half mile stretch of water express surprise that is exists so near to Beverley. There are huge numbers of swans and geese and no doubt more elusive species. I was also pleased to see a large group of teenagers enjoying it when I walked here in late June. Oddly the lake is unnamed on OS maps and again I wonder if any reader knows what it is called.



If you take the path along the river bank just before the lake, you reach the nature reserve that is splendidly named Pulfin Bog - a great place for spotting dragonfly and the hobbies that hunt them. The path along the river by the bog rejoins the main track at the north end of the lake, so you can take either route



4 A further 500 yards up river and you come to the lock that was the entrance to the Leven Canal. This closed in 1932 so it is surprising to see some of the machinery is still there. The path, no doubt the former towpath, runs along the north side of the canal for three lovely miles to the centre of Leven village.

This is easy walking and in early summer the canal is full of striking yellow and white water lilies. Why pay to go to Giverny or even Burnby Hall, when you can see these for free a few miles from Beverley?





The canal which linked Leven to the outside world was opened in 1802. Unusually, it was built by a wealthy local woman Charlotta Bethell; the lock keepers were also women for many years, too. After passing a large pipe, which now sadly cuts the canal in two, and a most pleasant set of holiday homes on the oposite bank, you emerge by the New Inn.



5 Turn left at the pub to enjoy the many fine buildings of this well apppointed village. Indeed, there are few places so well favoured outside our local towns; the combined butchers and bakers is a particular favourite. End the walk by the church with the bus stop across the road for those returning to Beverley.




