I run costumed guided walking tours of Beverley - you might have seen me at the Market Cross on Tuesdays and Fridays (I'm the one in 17th century costume). I used to be a tour guide with the National Trust, and now I enjoy showing people around the town where I was born.

In this regular column I explore Beverley's history month by month. Here we are in June already -

On 28th June 1643 Sir John Hotham decided that he'd had enough of the Parliamentarians, and changed sides - he was the Governor of Hull who'd refused entry to Charles I the previous year, marking the beginning of the Civil War. He was also MP for Beverley.

He managed to escape from the Parliamentarians in Hull and rode north, heading for his home at Scorborough just north of Beverley. The route took him through Saturday Market. Unfortunately for Sir John, 800 Parliamentarian soldiers were on parade, led by Captain Boynton (who happened to be related to Sir John's wife). Captain Boynton recognised Sir John, and grabbed his horse's bridle.

Sir John was knocked from his horse, and taken prisoner. His son, Captain John Hotham, was also arrested.

They were taken to Hull, then from Hull by sea to London, and imprisoned in the Tower of London. Seventeen months later, they were executed on Tower Green.

MAYOR OF BEVERLEY MAKES HISTORY

On Monday 9th May 2022 at the Guildhall in Beverley, councillor Linda Johnson became the first Mayor to be elected for two consecutive years since Norman Dickenson (1996-97 and 1997-1998).

The Mayor of Beverley in her address announced her husband as her consort and Tom Astell as Deputy Mayor and went on to say, "What an honour it has been to be elected the 418th Mayor of Beverley, hope I have been able to promote Beverley as the most wonderful town anyone could possibly imagine to live, work and play in, with the best people, the best buildings, the best countryside and the best surrounding villages."

The Mayor continued to say "Beverley wouldn't be here without St John, who established the town as a place of pilgrimage and tourism. Last year we celebrated 1300 years since his death and enjoyed a weekend of socially distanced events. On the Sunday, at an Anglican service, blessed an oak tree, in commemoration of St John, with a further 1299 trees to be planted around the town, 1244 of which were planted on the Archery Field last month".

Cheques were presented to Scope the Disability Charity. Scope provides an advice and befriending line for people with all kinds of life-limiting disabilities and to Hull and East Riding Breast friends. A donation of $\pounds150$ was made to SSAFA in lieu of Christmas Cards - so a grand total of $\pounds1084$ to three charities.

The Mayor chose the following charities this year - both are based on partnership working and enable beneficiaries to live their lives to the full. The first is Guide Dogs helping someone, an adult or a child with sight loss, to stay safe as they travel and maintain their independence. And Guide Dogs is based in Beverley!

The second is Open Doors based at Princes Avenue Methodist Church in Hull. Open Doors works with asylum seekers, refugees and migrant workers Open Doors helps all-comers navigate the system to rebuild their lives.

TRANSFORMING PRINCIPAL RETIRES

East Riding College Principal Mike Welsh retired at the end of May. Over four years in charge Mike oversaw a number of major developments. Most significantly, he led the College through what was described as an exemplary merger with TEC Partnership, securing its long term, sustainable future.

Mike's tenure has also seen significant increases in student and apprentice numbers as well as the construction of a brand new Institute of Technology at the College's Flemingate campus.

The Institute is part of the Yorkshire and Humber IoT, a collaborative partnership with several other colleges - and one of only 12 established by the Government in 2020.

In the last four years the College has seen growth in its funding income, putting it in a very sound financial position and allowing it to expand its estate at Flemingate, which is now at capacity. Under his leadership, the College has been recognised as a high performing provider by both the QAA (twice) and OfSTED; continuing to enhance high levels of quality and standards.

One of Mike's passions was to invest in a valuesdriven community focus. In fact he showed his commitment to the college's communities from the off, whether it was taking part in a cook-off at Beverley Food Festival, welcoming guests at the open air cinema to celebrate the Bridlington campus' ten year anniversary, representing the FE sector on the Humber and East Yorkshire LEP Employment and Skills Board, or founding and chairing the Humber Principals' Group.

Mike said, "Like everyone else, the past couple of years has enabled my family and I to focus on our long-term future. We have made Beverley our permanent home and look forward to having more time to enjoy all that our wonderful region has to offer."



Kerri Harold, Chair of Governors at East Riding College said, "We wish Mike very well in his retirement and thank him for his huge contribution to the sector as a whole, as well as for his transformational work at East Riding College. He leaves us in an excellent position to move forward with exciting plans for further growth and to meet the challenge of delivering future skills."

Penalties were needed after a pulsating 60 minutes of normal time, with both teams giving their all. Head coach Stephen Rawlings said: "It was a fantastic day with some iconic moments that will live long in the memory.

"This is something that can never be taken away from them - they go down in the history books as Under-12 Jubilee Cup winners."

WHAT IS THE JUNE SOLSTICE? This year, the June Solstice falls on Tuesday June 21 and will mark the start of summer in the Northern Hemisphere.

Also known as the summer solstice, it is the longest day of the year and occurs when the sun travels along its most northern path in the sky. For those in the Southern Hemisphere, it means the start of winter as it is at the opposite when the sun is at its lowest point in the sky.

The word "solstice" comes from the Latin words sol meaning "sun" and stitium which means "standing." On the summer solstice, the sun's path stops advancing northward each day and appears to "stand" still in the sky before going back the other way. It is the shortest night of the calendar and celebrated as the "longest day", meaning the longest period of sunlight



in the year. The day does not have the latest sunset, however, nor the earliest sunrise as that depends on where you live.

The timing of the June solstice is not based on a specific calendar date or time and won't always happen on the same day, which is why currently it shifts between June 20, 21, and 22. The day completely depends on when the sun reaches its northernmost point from the celestial equator. When the sun is at its highest point in the sky this month, you'll notice that your shadow is the shortest that it will be all year.

Throughout history, the summer solstice has been recognised as a significant time of year in many cultures which have marked it with many festivals and rituals such as bonfires and Maypole dancing. The summer solstice marks the beginning of summer in accordance with the seasons and lasts until the autumnal equinox, which is usually September 22 or 23 in the Northern Hemisphere. Make sure to write a list of activities you want to plan for the summer now it's here. Maybe you'll take a sunrise hike, or perhaps you'll enjoy sun themed arts and crafts with your kids, there's lots of ways to enjoy the sunshine now it's here to stay for a while.





...thinking about a phrase that an old Methodist Minister friend of mine would often quote.

"The poor are a bit like dandelions, they will always be with us". As I looked out of our house window, a couple of days after I had spent time cutting the grass and getting rid of all those lovely coloured "weeds", there they were, back again, and there seemed to be more of them.

Now I know that biblical phrase, which my Minister friend had ever so slightly misquoted, can be quite controversial and subject to various interpretations but it is a fact that I have found in the current media so many examples of the ever widening gap between the rich and the poor in our present day society. Some so bizarre that I questioned if they were part of that mysterious fake news we hear so much about.



One item concerned the auction of a football shirt, worn in 1986 by Diego Maradona the Argentinian footballer, when he scored a goal against England, which everybody watching knew should not have been allowed.

For football fans this has always been one of the worst injustices ever to take place in a football match. If you have no interest in the game of football so be it. But this 36 year old shirt (and there was some question of it really being "the shirt") was sold at auction for £7.14 million pounds recently.

It reminded me of a similar incident that took place in November 2021, in the midst of the Covid pandemic, when the people of this country raised over £40 million pounds for the Children in Need appeal. In that same week a painting of a Coca Cola bottle, by Andy Warhol, who had died in 1987, some 34 years previously, was reported to have been sold for £43 million pounds.

Does that kind of thing make you angry? As I get older I like to think that I can resist getting really angry about such matters if for no other reason that I consider anger a "wasted emotion", that achieves nothing other than upsetting me as I realise this is the world I now live in.

There have been many examples over the past year when some of the unbelievable behaviour of our elected leaders has stretched incredulity to the extreme.

At such times people could be forgiven for allowing their anger to overwhelm them and not



see the bigger picture. Amidst all the furore of many people living on very limited income, and benefits distributed in a manner that brings the shadow of the Means Test and the Poor Law to mind, the people of this country have shown themselves to believe in the statement "I am my brother's keeper" and have gone out of their way to help those less fortunate than themselves.

ET'S TAKE A TRIP TO NORTH CAVE & IT'S NATURE RES

For many of us North Cave is a village we drive through as we rush west. It is, however, well worth exploring, with its fine period buildings, beautiful stream and two fabulous nature reserves nearby.

It is on a regular bus route from Hull, and one direct from Beverley (eastyorkshirebuses. co.uk) - the 10 mile drive via Walkington is a pleasant one.

This is a great time to visit as you may catch the last of the fantastic display of bluebells in the woods at North Cliffe, as well as its abundant bird life at the Wetlands.

There is on street parking in the village and a handy car park by the play area, just across from the striking church. A very nice short stroll can be had around the village streets, which

have many attractive homes. It has a fine pub, well-stocked shop and a fish and chip shop to tempt you.

It is especially pleasant to take the path over the stream on Church Street, passing the lovely restored mill house. From here you can double back to the village and perhaps view inside the church, if you are lucky like me, I once got the key from the vicarage.



It is a short drive round to the fabulous



Wetlands Nature Reserve. We were pleasantly surprised on a recent visit that access and parking are free.

These former extensive gravel pits are a joy to wander on a network of paths with a series of hides and benches. They are the work of the most commendable Yorkshire Wildlife Trust

Over 270 bird species have been seen there, including bittern, Egyptian geese, egrets, and my personal favourite, cormorants, with their amazing

wing display. The reserve has excellent paths, toilets and a very good cafe/kiosk, serving good value food and drink. It really is a lovely place to get closer to nature.

Not too far away, only a 2 mile drive along the minor road towards Market Weighton, brings you to the small village of North Cliffe.

Turn left here along Sands Lane, where you will find parking spaces adjacent to another YWT reserve: North Cliffe Woods.



Here are 33 hectares of fine woods and wetland areas with over 3 kms of paths. The sense of peace there is most refreshing. May is the best time to see a stunning display of bluebells, but they may linger into June, and the woods are always great to visit.

We drove back to Beverley from here, on an especially nice rural route, via Sancton, passing the impressive Georgian mansion of Houghton Hall - joining the A1079 back to town at Arras Hill.



BEVERLEY AC - FUN RUN AND 10KM



WILSON WHEELS - ENJOYING THE LONGER DAYLIGHT

June welcomes everyone to the start of summer Tuesday 21st June Longest Day, any cyclist will appreciate the longer hours of daylight.

Having owned it for the last eleven years, the current owner is certainly not afraid to use it, adding around four to five thousand miles a year to the odometer, including trips abroad.



During this time the car has benefited from a new hood and has been restored to its original colour.

A complete engine rebuild took sixteen months to do and surprisingly enough for a vehicle of such

age, parts are relatively easy to obtain, often with next day delivery. The manifold is one such example, albeit costing £600, so perhaps deep pockets are needed here for ownership. This car has an interesting history too - it was used as a pace car at Donnington race track, as a hearse for a previous owner and was hidden in world war 2 to prevent it being used.

Eagle-eyed readers may have noticed that this particular model has a kneeling Spirit of ecstasy radiator mascot as opposed to the usual standing up version. Putting a value on a car like this is virtually impossible and if it ever comes up for sale it is a classic example of an auction sale where the market will decide.

So don't forget, should you be in the right place at the right time and spot this beauty, don't forget that cheery Carfan wave!







COUNTRYSIDE MATTERS WITH SAM WALTON

Who would want to be a farmer? I have been involved physically for 70 years and have never known such uncertain times. Things are changing as people say and I am not sure if they are for the best.





To provide the public with cheap food, farming has received a subsidy for many years but that is now changing.

It will disappear over the next three years at an alarming rate, so that will either ruin farmers or the public will have to pay more, or heaven forbid, the Supermarkets will have to cut some of their profits.


The thing is we do not know what is going to happen. The Ukraine

situation has had a huge effect on lots of people and on the World food market.

I remember going to the Ukraine about 15 years or more ago, accompanying some of our top-notch breeding pigs and seeing some unbelievable crops. It is only now that people are aware of how much the world relied on the Ukraine for food.

With inflation set to increase living standards are going to be seriously

affected. Food is usually the first thing people cut back on these days, whereas when I was a lad, food was the most important item in the lifestyle. Currently prices for cereals have never been higher but neither has the cost of production and, will all this continue?









IN THE GARDEN... JUNE

June in the garden is normally the month when we can relax a little as all the hard work should have been done earlier in the year. However, if you have been part of 'No mow May' - you may want to tidy the lawn up before you host your 'Jubilee Garden Party.'

'No mow May' is a where you don't cut the lawn for the month of May to encourage pollinators and more plant species into your garden - yes, I know you may get Buttercups, Dandelions and Daisies but they will provide valuable nectar for the pollinators and can look very attractive (think Beverley Westwood and its Buttercups).

When you start mowing the lawn again don't cut it too short, if we have a dry spell the lawn will go brown if you do; try and increase the length of time between cuts and if you can leave an area uncut and let go wild.

Tasks for June...

- Mow the lawn.
- Keep a look out for pest, particularly on roses and lush green shoots.
- Keep on top of weeds.
- Tidy up/lift any remaining spring flowering bulbs.

• Lift and divide daffodils - especially if they have been in the same place for a long time. Daffodils can become crowded and over time stop producing flowers (this is called coming up blind).

• WATERING PLANTS - due to a combination of longer days, drier/ sunnier days, and the rate at which plants 'drink' water, you will need to water the garden. Newly planted plants, young vegetables and plants in containers will need watering most. Watering should be done thoroughly - ideally either early in the morning or in the evening.

Hanging baskets and small containers should be watered daily and fed with a liquid feed once a week. If you have large areas in the garden to water do not try and water the whole area by splashing a bit of water on daily, split the garden into areas and give each a 'good soak' which should last up to a week.

Don't be fooled by heavy thundery downpours - often most of the rain 'runs off' and does not enter the soil.

• Feed plants in containers with a water-soluble feed - this can be done every time you water and certainly once a week.

• DEADHEADING (removing flowers as they fade) - this is an important task which needs doing regularly. Deadheading will extend the flowering period, by diverting the plants' energy from producing seeds into new growth and flowers. To deadhead cut back to just above a bud lower down the stem of the plant using secateurs or garden snips.

Here's hoping we have pleasant weather for the 'Jubilee Weekend,' and able to enjoy our gardens with family and friends, J.


