

### BEVERLEY BUILDING SOCIETY RAISES OVER £9,000 FOR CHARITY

Beverley Building Society has raised over £9,000 for its Charity of the Year 2022, the Cherry Tree Community Centre, and helps to support the lives of vulnerable local people!

Giving back to its local community is a priority for The Beverley and the team at the only independent building society in East Yorkshire, raised a total of £9,250 for the Centre last year, through a variety of staff initiatives, plus events and promotions that were widely supported by its members, private individuals and local businesses.



Since 1993 Cherry Tree, which receives 1,000 calls a month from people in urgent need of help, has been a vital lifeline for vulnerable people of all ages across the region.

A wide range of popular services are available, from advice on issues including Money, Housing and Employment, a Community Pantry and Holiday Club, to an Outer School Club and even a Little Gruffalos Pre School Nursery.

Society Director, Karen Wint, who will take over from the current Chair, Stuart Purdy, when he steps down later this month, delivered the presentation cheque to Centre Manager Jo Ramsay, along with some of the team from Beverley Building Society and said: "The Beverley Cherry Tree Community Centre is there for people who are desperately in need of help, for whatever reason and have nowhere else to go.

"All communities need these vital services, and I believe we all have a responsibility to ensure that they are protected for future generations."

Jo concluded: "On behalf of myself and everyone at the Cherry Tree Centre, I'd like to say a huge thank you to both the Society and everyone who has contributed to this Campaign, in whatever way they could throughout 2022. You have helped to change peoples' lives for the better."



## **ALLEN REFLECTS ON YEAR ON**

On the 17th March 2022 Allen Slinger opened the doors to the Ferguson Fawsitt, which answered the question - "Who is taking over The Ferguson Fawsitt?"

It only seems like yesterday when everyone got to experience the changes Allen had made in such a short period of time and the optimism for the year ahead as he looked forward to his first year at the Ferguson Fawsitt.

Allen wanted to build on his reputation of having managed a number of public houses including the Royal Standard and The Tiger Inn. Allen set his heart on transforming the Ferguson Fawsitt in Walkington and to bring it back to become a Community Hub and a place that the locals could be proud.

Allen commented, "I was so excited about taking over the Ferguson Fawsitt, the opportunities it presented to me were endless, it was just a matter of how and when. What I did not expect was all the obstacles that were thrown into the mix, which has been challenging to say the least. But we will continue to get over them and continue to make the Fergie a vibrant Community Hub, offering something for everyone".

Allen took a little time out to reflect on the past 12 months, the changes and to set his stall out for 2023. "Literally".

Allen said, "I knew that the Ferguson Fawsitt was a long term project, what I did not anticipate was the continually rising cost of everything, so the year became a lot more challenging than I had expected.

"Having said that, meeting these challenges head on and with the support of the staff and the local community we are delighted to have got through



the first year and continue with our plans for 2023, the continued expansion and recruiting of experienced staff".

Allen continued, "Supporting local groups has always been a passion of mine, helping where I can and supporting local causes. It has been a pleasure to get behind local teams, groups and good causes such as providing a defibrillator for Beverley Rugby Club, sponsorship of Beverley Ladies and C-Force United who play at Little Weighton, and Mill Lane Juniors (who always come back for a drink and some food).

"There was also the opening the Gallery Cafe and the Event Space following the refurbishment, which also allowed the community hub to take shape entertaining the locals and bringing people into the village from far and wide."

Now on a regular basis and fixed into peoples diaries are the Monday night - Darts Night, 1st

Thursday - Bingo, 1st Friday - Quiz Night, 2nd Friday - Food and Craft Fair with afternoon teas Thursday to Saturday.



The event space is available for private hire, birthday parties, celebrations and music nights. The Food and Craft Fair is now proving to be such a draw to the area, and the fair will continue through 2023. Allen aims to make it a bigger event attracting more stall holders throughout the year. Working with Lisa at The Little Cheese Pantry the Friday Fair is becoming more and more popular.

With his attention to detail Allen regularly invites Mandy the chalk lady to update the interior with her works of art and skill in delivering Allens brief to keep customers up to date with what's on at the Ferguson Fawsitt.

As Allen moves towards his 2nd year at the Fergie, entertainment will continue to grow. Make a note of these dates for the diary:

you feel like you belong here, they just look after you."




Prue, Dennis, Elspeth

### SPRING IS ON THE WAY

Every day gets a little bit brighter, there's a bit more warmth in the air and some stunning sunrises and sunsets over the Westwood.

Spring is on the way and with it, the opportunity to get out and about and see all the delights of spring as the snowdrops and crocuses begin to poke their heads above the soil and the daffodils will be following shortly. Young animals are seen in the fields and there's the scent of spring in the air.

To quote Billy Connolly, "There's no such thing as bad weather - only the wrong clothes"... and it's possibly the best time of the year to get wrapped up and take a walk, raising the endorphin and serotonin levels and getting out in the daylight raising the levels of vitamin D and consequently supporting the immune system.

It's also an ideal time of the year to take a few moments and really be in the "now" and practice a little mindfulness as you walk out into the town. Do you ever stop on your walk across the Westwood or sit on a bench along Toll Gavel and just allow your senses to take in what's happening in each moment with open awareness - noticing what you can smell, hear, see (look up at the buildings) or feel the ground under your feet and the sense of connection?

It can be interesting to notice what we miss as we rush around with a list of actions to be ticked off. Maybe focus on one sense such as smell as you move from the shops and coffee bars, go for a wander though St Mary's Church and then walk up onto the Westwood and notice how the scents of each environment change as you pause to notice.

Astronomical Spring begins on the day of the vernal Equinox around 20th/21st March and this year falls on Monday 20th March 2023 and signals the return of sunshine and warmer temperatures in the Northern Hemisphere. This is both an astronomical event and one marked by the ancients as the time when, in theory, the sun's rays are shared equally in the northern and southern hemispheres and night and day are roughly the same length. Early civilisations found these heavenly happenings a reliable way of keeping track of the seasons.

As we move into the light it becomes more tempting to get outdoors into the sunshine and appreciate not only the health-giving benefits of exercise and fresh air but the opportunity to connect with others which can come from the simplest of gestures - a smile, a compliment or spending time in a café really savouring your favourite drink and watching the world pass by.

It might be time to learn new skills so contact your local Adult Education Centre and see what courses are available, whether it be vocational (such as improving IT skills) or cookery. You may have ambitions to set up your own group in the community - did you know that East Riding Council are opening welcoming places to offer warm social spaces with a range of refreshments and activities: www.eastriding.gov.uk/cost-of-living-help-for-households/helping-communities/

If you've got time to spare you might check out what charities are looking for help and working in the outdoors might be just what you're looking for as the days get warmer with organisations such as Beverley Community Orchard. As you wake up in the morning, it's worth remembering, no matter



what the day brings, the birds always start the day with a song and below is one of my favourite ditties

I wish I was a glow worm,
A glow worm's never glum.
'Cos how can you be grumpy
When the sun shines out your bum!







### HOW DO YOU CHOOSE A FACIAL AESTHETICS PRACTITIONER?



For the past 7 years he has also been practicing medical and cosmetic aesthetics, becoming a specialist in this area. He currently works from his home based CQC regulated clinic "Look Natural Aesthetics" near Beverley with his wife Zoe who worked as a staff nurse until she became a full-time mum.

Dr Gower said, "The concern is that the UK is the ONLY country in the world that has absolutely no legislation or laws covering this area for non-medics. Literally anyone can purchase dermal



Dr Gower went on to say, "Procedures such as the non-surgical PDO thread face lift (a rather invasive procedure which requires antibiotic cover and specialist medical training) are also being performed without any regulations.

"For medical staff to perform this procedure they need to undergo specific medical training and their clinic would need to be regulated by the Care Quality Commission (CQC - the body which governs hospitals, care homes and GPs for example).



The same rules apply for medical aesthetic procedures such as treatment of hyperhidrosis (excessive sweating) platelet rich plasma injections, jaw clenching or migraine and that is the key message.

"Only qualified medical staff are governed by legislation and required to have insurance. Only they can purchase quality products from pharmacies. If medical staff don't adhere to strict rules by their professional bodies, then they can face severe consequences or even be struck off".

It is commonly known that complications are always possible with any treatments. An

experienced medical practitioner is far more likely to recognise them and give appropriate treatment.

If you have a medical concern, you go and see your GP, an eye problem and you find an optician, but for aesthetic treatments there is a culture of seeking out the cheapest deal, trusting anyone with a needle, and agreeing to treatments without questioning qualifications, experience or product.

Before you agree to a treatment, follow these guidelines.



### Top tips to safer treatment:

- Always have a preliminary consultation. Never feel pressured to have treatment on the day or pay up front. A good practitioner will always provide you with a full assessment and give you treatment options and a cooling off period.
- Just as anyone can inject, anyone can train an injector, and give a certificate after a day's training. So do your research. Check what experience and qualifications your practitioner has?
- What products will you be treated with? Check what is being injected into your face and where it is purchased from.

### FANTASTIC FILMS AND WHERE TO FIND THEM

The good folks at Just Beverley have invited me back to share some of my thoughts on some great films that are available on streaming services. Especially the underrated ones that you might pass by while browsing such a large choice.

March sees the culmination of the awards corridor. The season begins in December with critics and associations giving their picks of the best films of the year and culminating with the Academy Awards. Oscar winners are being announced on 13th March. As well as praising the fine work of those behind and in front of the camera, the awards season plays an important role in getting films spoken about and hopefully encouraging more folk to see them.

Hopefully, you are finding this year's award nominees in the cinema but the theme of this month's musings are the films of previous years that might have been forgotten as they were worthy nominees but not the winner.



"Sons are put on this earth to trouble their fathers."

Tom Hanks is one of the darlings of the Oscars and a two-time winner but recently, during an interview, he mentioned that he was surprised that one film in his credits was not mentioned when discussing his career. Perhaps it is because Road to Perdition (available on Amazon Prime and Disnev+) sees him cast against type as a ruthless and feared mob enforcer, Michael Sullivan, in 1930s Illinois. He loves his family, even if he appears distant and mysterious to his sons, and is fiercely loyal to the mob boss, John Rooney (played by Paul Newman in his last performance). However, the consequences of an incident involving Rooney's jealous son (a pre-Bond Daniel Craig) and Sullivan's eldest, force the hitman and boy to flee. A cat-and-mouse road trip ensues where the son finds the real mettle of his father.

This was Brit Sam Mendes' second film, who went on to become a prolific director whose credits now include Skyfall, 1917 and this year's Empire of Light. He enlisted the services of veteran cinematographer Conrad L Hall to photograph the film. The result is a beautiful-looking film despite its relatively sombre subject matter and Hall posthumously won the Oscar for his work. That was the film's only win despite five nominations in a year where Chicago took Best Picture. Only one of those nominations was in the acting categories (for Newman) despite stellar performances that draw you into the story of great intensity with occasional chinks of light.

A little side note. It has been twenty years since the child actor, Tyler Hoechlin, played the pivotal role of Tom Hanks' son. The beginning of a career that now sees him playing Superman in Supergirl and Superman & Lois.

#### "Hank, do you ever feel evil? I do."

In 1998, Sam Rami was the director of joyously over-the-top and unique genre hits such as The Evil Dead trilogy, Darkman, and The Quick & the Dead. So he was a surprising choice for a small-

scale thriller. However, somebody saw the dude had range and asked him to helm A Simple Plan (BBC iPlayer), a film that garnered two Academy Award nominations.



Like Fargo a couple of years earlier, the setting is rural America in the midst of a snowy winter and deals with working-class (blue collar as the Americans say) characters whose fortunes have not followed the American dream. The premise is straightforward where two brothers and a friend discover a crashed plane on an isolated nature reserve. Inside they find a dead pilot and a bag containing millions of dollars. Since there are no crash reports, they decide to keep the money and sit on it to see if anybody mentions it. Of course, time breeds mistrust and, as seemingly sensible decisions are made, unintended consequences heap pressure and increasingly drastic resolutions for the trio.

The late Bill Paxton excels as the educated Hank who believes that he can keep everything under control while Billy Bob Thornton received an Oscar nomination as Jacob, his dim brother who surprisingly has a stronger moral conscience. A small cast of character actors (including Bridget Fonda, Brent Briscoe, Jack Walsh, and Gary Cole) keep the film grounded and Raimi reigns in previous excesses to channel Hitchcock in a tightly plotted (and also award-nominated) screenplay.

### "I'm sorry, if you were right, I would agree with vou."

Robert De Niro has two acting Oscars and six other nominations. One of those nominations was for his heart-wrenching portrayal of Leonard Lowe in Awakenings (1991 - Netflix) and it is known that the Oscars like to praise performances based on disability. However, the extraordinary nature of the performance is the stages his character undergoes.



The film is a fictionalised account of the work of Dr Oliver Saks and is based on his non-fiction book. For such a gregarious personality, Robin Williams could play thoughtful introverts and he excels as Dr Sayer, a clinician who prefers research as, although compassionate, he has difficulty connecting with people but ends up employed in 1969 at a hospital in New York's Bronx. Many patients are in a catatonic state but Sayer discovers they all have a reflex. Driven by intellectual curiosity and humanity, but against the wishes of his jaded colleagues, he experiments with new medication on Leonard who has been in this state for over twenty years. Leonard awakens from his 20-year-old state to a changed world.



Now, I try to refrain from spoilers in this column but De Niro has to portray a character whose journey goes from discovery to tragedy and his performance is heart-breaking and rightly got the nomination. However, although not nominated (he was nominated in 1988,89 and 91 and eventually won for Good Will Hunting) Robin Williams imbues the film with humanity along with Julie Kavner, who is known better as the voice of Marge Simpson, as the first nurse to believe in the doctor's work. With a nominated screenplay by Steve Zallian, this is one of the lesser discussed works from the late director Penny Marshall (Big, A League of Their Own) but Awakenings is a powerful film which is humorous yet sad but in the end, has a very life-affirming message.

### "If I could eat rocks, I'd stay in the volcanoes and never come down."

I am thinking the fourth film is becoming the wildcard slot (or to use another analogy the mystery house in "Escape to the Country") and this month I go against my theme but highlight a film that hopes to win an Oscar this year. Nominated for this year's Best Documentary Feature, Fire of Love (now available on Disney+) explores the world of Katia and Maurice Krafft, married scientists obsessed with a ferocious element of nature that we rarely see on film. Volcanoes.



This is no spoiler as the film starts by mentioning their demise at an eruption in Japan in 1991 and looks at what they left behind after their deaths. Both were incredible photographers. Katia catalogued still life while Maurice filmed. Both of them captured extraordinary images throughout their lives. The film delves into the couple's archive and gives us ninety minutes of stunningly beautiful visuals that only their daring could capture. All while detailing these lovers' lives and their work as celebrated volcanologists which leads to a greater understanding of the most fearsome power of the natural world.

At the time of writing, I wish all award nominees success and hope that you enjoy some of the great films out there.

Most of us probably regard our local river, the Hull, as largely a muddy, sluggish affair, slowly winding its way south of Beverley Beck, to its confluence with the Humber in the city that shares its name.

There is far more to it than that, its upper reaches hold nationally important sites of special scientific interest: its crystal clear waters being the most northerly chalk streams in Europe.

I have long been intrigued by the source of this 20 mile long river, and over recent months have been determined to find it. That was not easy, as access to the Upper Hull valley is patchy and limited, but here I guide you to the many, often thrilling, places, you can visit and walk.

The story that emerges is quite complex, as the river does not have one source, but many, and also bewilderingly frequent changes of name.

The most widely accepted place for the source of the Hull, lies with a series of beautiful chalk springs - 2 miles west of Driffield at Elmswell. Sadly, the site is normally open for public access to this exquisite spot for just one day each year.

I first went to see the fine old hall, and the adjacent springs, on the last open day in April 2022.

It is staggeringly beautiful, numerous bubbling springs spout in all directions, to form a wide watercourse that flows down to Little Driffield.

I can find no date yet for the access day in 2023, don't miss it if you are able to go. You can walk a nice stretch of this flow from the



Millennium Green in the King's Mill area of Driffield, crossing a bridge by the mill race.

wet periods these gush out of the ground in spouts.

My neighbour, John Seaman, pointed out there is another contender to be seen as a source of the Hull, at Kirkburn. This is also largely unknown, yet rather magical place. Thankfully, there are fewer access restrictions here.

If you park by the splendid Norman church, which is always open, you can view the springs, by using the gate at the back of the churchyard. Here a mini- gorge, full of lovely trees, is also full of springs.

I was informed by a kind villager, that during



The spring water quickly forms quite a wide river course, which flows towards Driffield, first as Kirkburn Beck, then quickly changing to Eastburn, then Southburn Beck, which the railway passes over.

By the time it reaches Bell Mills, the waters of the streams flowing down from Elmswell, have added to the flow - many maps now label it the Hull, most locals call it West Beck!

If you go right down the path behind the church, you reach the village street. Follow it down past the former pub and you reach a village green, a lovely wild spot with the stream gushing under a bridge. There is a picnic table - perfect for warmer days ahead.

It would be wonderful if the footpaths that run alongside these becks could be joined up to form a circular waterside walk - sadly this is unlikely.

I would recommend the following spots to really enjoy this special river environment, where you can stroll by the water.



Firstly at Foston, the beck being a main feeder of the bigger river, Foston Mill is a lovely location. From here you can walk a mile up the beck and return to the village across pleasant fields.

Further up, this classic chalk stream changes name to Lowthorpe Beck, paths out of the lovely village of Harpham allow walkers to enjoy it.

By parking at Wansford Bridge on the Skerne Road, walkers can access 2 fine reaches of the river that run along the western banks. Here, the river has become wide and powerful; full of trout, and if you are lucky, sightings of kingfishers and otters.

I had to check with my old A Level Geography teacher, Martin Brayne, how geographers judge the true source of a river - it's the feeder stream that is furthest from the mouth of a river.


By this definition, the true source of the Hull is not either of those usually cited. It is in fact higher on the Wolds at Kilham, where springs form the beck that flows down through Harpham, Lowthorpe and Foston, joining with Frodingham Beck, then West Beck, downstream from Brigham.

At this last confluence, which can be walked and accessed by a fine bridge, the true River Hull begins its journey to Beverley and the city.


It might not be a journey of discovery to compare with seeking the source of the Nile, but it is our own little adventure on the doorstep, and a delightful way to spend a few hours exploring this spring.

To fully appreciate the area, I suggest you use a detailed OS map, these can be found for free on bingmaps.com.

Looking through the eyelet, the ghost of a propeller drives this schooner back to a November fog and funnel belching smoke.

Take a sounding! Twenty five fathoms, sir!

Sand parted accommodating the hull and The Laura turned from vessel to vassal beneath cliffs of Speeton Clay. Tug lines snagged, snapped. Receiver of Wreck informed.

The cargo of coke salvaged. The vessel salvaged except the boilers - back broken,



skeletal ribs, eyelet where the propeller once turned.

This iron beast rendered by tides into a parody of pipes, exposed to the sea from which a skeleton is slowly lost to the living.

If you walk from Reighton Gap as the tide is going out, it's possible you'll see the remains of The Laura stranded on the beach.

Even if you don't there are superlative views of Bempton Cliffs and Filey.

### DOOR, WHARRAM-LE-STREET

The year Edward the Confessor's head first appeared on coins, stones were quarried, carried, dressed or carved, set one upon another to make this doorway.

Behind this tall narrow door the mystery of ceremonies held in half-light for half-believers, be they Saxon or Viking, living a fragile peace.

A sandstone doorway which welcomed all until the squire wanted a porch. The original walled up. Behold! The new entrance with its aspirations.

We are still divided, half believers in equality living a fragile peace. All doors now barred, the year Elizabeth the second's head last appeared on a coin.

Wharram-le-Street is just over the border now in North Yorkshire, an ancient village with a church still largely Saxon in date, particularly the tower. It's worth a stop, if you are passing. The circular walk to Wharram Percy is nearby, as are some Yorkshire Wildlife Trust places.

### **PORT MULGRAVE**


Disconnected, inaccessible, this hamlet of flotsam and jetsam, formed partly from sea's gifts, the remainder descended precipitous cliffs.

Steps fly on visiting air, bent iron frames might dare me to descend but January's storm ripped half away, now only fishermen brave the climb.

Shale juxtaposed against a wild fantastic sea where seals breed, whales become beached. A crack! Before a tumbling melange of cliff threatens to bury these shacks.

People imagine merfolk copulating on the strand amongst our waste. A nereid's birth howls swept away by the storm, colostrum rich in microplastic from their diet of fish

I long to visit such rugged places, to search between myth and legend. Port Mulgrave is a memory, inaccessible as the tropical oceans which laid down these rocks.



Port Mulgrave is the village at the cliff top and the shanty fishing village on the beach. I haven't been able to get down to the bay itself since the coastal path was washed away but people do!

Be warned you need to be fit and have the right gear! Port Mulgrave has been an iron ore terminal. The tunnel and rail line were destroyed before the Second World War.


### Quiet Flows the Hull






### COUNTRYSIDE **MATTERS WI SAM WALTON FARMERS AND PIGEONS!!**

That farming these days is a challenge, there is no doubt. Apart from all the rules and regulations we

have or red tape as I call it, the climate seems to be altering also.

There are more floods and droughts around the World now than ever before. On top of that, we seem to be seeing different diseases or growing conditions, all of which need to be dealt with. Fortunately, there are wonderful research centres which scrutinise everything you can think of in their many trials for weeds, disease and pests and then come up with recommendations to help us control them.



So, as we can understand the results and the management required, most farmers these days have regular crop inspections by individual independent crop consultants who keep us up to date with what is required and when.

One pest for which there does not seem

to be any easy cure, is the way in which pigeons eat the heart out of crops such as Oil Seed Rape.

I gave that up two years ago, or thought I had, but in a weak moment last autumn, because of higher prices, I relented and drilled 20 acres behind the farm. It came out well and looked green and made quick growth. Then suddenly it was invaded by hundreds of pigeons, the results were devastating.

Yes, we can control them in a way by having various bangers going off or having someone prepared to sit in the field during daylight hours and shoot them but that means someone almost being in the field continually.



There are types of gas driven bangers and we can hang cartridges on a rope which you light at the bottom, and it slowly burns its way up to each cartridge which then bangs loudly. There are mock windmill types with flags shaped like hawks on and other deterrents.

However, being a Farm next to a

Village, those loud bangs are not welcomed, particularly early in the morning and I have had two expensive bang guns stolen. Despite all the preventions we try our best but several areas in the crop are devastated. At least we live on to see another day.






and with their new found hobby of walking it feels like they have.


