Now Lawrence has decided it is time to retire. Sexton plays a crucial and often underappreciated role in maintaining the sanctity and functionality of a cemetery.

Lawrence has been the custodian of the final resting place for departed souls, undertaking responsibilities that extend beyond mere caretaking, multifaceted duties, ensuring the cemetery serves as a place of solace, reflection, and respect.



Lawrence commented, "I will miss the people, the families, and the responsibility that comes with being Sexton. I have enjoyed being there for people in their time of need, and I have made a lot of friends along the way".

As Sexton, Lawrence was tasked with landscaping, grave digging, and general maintenance, ensuring that the cemetery remains a serene and dignified environment.

Lewis Northen, local funeral director commented, "Lawrence will be missed, he has been there for everyone, a guardian of memory, preserving the dignity of those who have passed away. The Seals along the coast are also starting to have their pups at this time of year with a few great locations along the Yorkshire Coast to see







them and the famous Donna Nook in Lincolnshire where they are sometimes right next to the footpath. It's a great site to see but does get incredibly busy so I'd recommend avoiding busier times if you can.

COUNTRYSIDE MATTERS WITH SAM WALTON

The worry about harvest and if it would ever stop raining, is now a distant memory.

The so-called heat wave certainly dried the grain, and even the barley, which was taking a while to ripen evenly, because of secondary growth, became combinable eventually.

It was not the best sample I have to say but the majority was OK. It was sold on contract earlier this year to go for malting to keep all the beer drinkers happy and at the time of writing, I do not know if it will pass for malting or not.

If it doesn't and I have to take the normal feed price, there is a difference of 5,000.00!!

I did sell all my wheat and barley straw this year and that was quickly gathered up almost immediately after the combine and the big bales usually go to livestock farmers who do not have arable farms.



This year there with the wheat, there were three of the large bales to the acre and with the barley, 1.5 per acre. We used to get more but as time goes on and wheat and barley are now breeds which are shorter in length to give the stalks more strength to be able to produce heavier yields of corn.

How times have changed, as years ago cereals all had long straw which was used for thatching the stacks of sheaves which we carted back after being stalked by hand to allow the grain to dry.

If you think about farming, it has changed considerably over the years and doubtless it will change again and again to feed an ever-increasing world population.

So where we go from here I really do not know with all the many rules and regulations and of course the likely change in weather patterns.

Although there will be no bonfire on

Beverley Westwood, which is good news for the wildlife inhabiting the area, there are some organized displays listed below from 1st November to Sunday 5th (https://hullandeastriding.mumbler.co.uk/bonfire-night-fireworks/).

Sharing experiences with loved ones and people from your local community can be uplifting and helps keep the spirits high as the clocks go back, nights draw in and temperatures drop. Did you know that one of the 13 men, Thomas Percy, was born in Beverley in around 1560 and died on 8th November 1605 by gunpowder shot? I wonder what Thomas Percy would think, seeing the rockets and Roman candles fly high in the East Yorkshire skv.

Getting out and about is a great way to improve physical and mental health and wellbeing, two of the challenges being addressed by the Movember Foundation that raises funds to bring awareness to men's health. This month we decided to get in touch with Jamie Newson-Smith, the owner of The Refill Jar, recently relocated to Flemingate.

Just Beverley enjoys good news and great achievements from people who work and live in and around Beverley. This month we put 8 questions (link to Unit 8 in Flemingate), to Jamie.

1. Why the Refill Jar?

The Refill Jar was set up as a way to help people reduce their single use plastics and help to live a more sustainable lifestyle. As an independent business it is great to feel part of the community and do our little bit also to make Beverley and the surrounding areas a great place to live.

2. How do you relax?

On the rare occasions that I do get to relax I enjoy listening to music and spending time with family and friends - I do love stress though, if I don't feel challenged I can get bored quite easily. My previous jobs in the fire service and major live events were definitely high pressure roles which didn't leave much time to relax.



3. What are your ambitions in business?

Business isn't an easy game. Whilst being your own boss can sometimes look glamorous, its long hours for quite often little pay. With The Refill Jar we have managed to keep growing even with events such as lockdown and the cost of living crisis

I'VE BEEN THINKING... SAYS COLIN RAYNOR

My second thoughts on smoke originated when I was watching an interview between Melvyn Bragg and the painter David Hockney. During the interview, which I would encourage everyone to watch as Hockney is a master of his craft and Bragg is a skilled interviewer, the painter was chain smoking.

In case that is a phrase not know to some it means, he smoked one cigarette after another. Again, people can choose to smoke or not but I am happy to note that the practice of smoking, particularly within restaurants, theatres and other buildings where the public may gather was made illegal in 2007 in this country.

How times have changed. Because my birthday is on Boxing Day and because I smoked, like the rest of my family, I remember regularly getting over two hundred cigarettes over the festive period in my late teenage years.

This was before filter tips and the brand I smoked was called Senior Service. It was normal practice to pass your "cigs" around, and give your friends one.

Encouraged by my wife I resolved to stop smoking and I went on to a pipe and then on to small



cigars. When my health began to suffer I am pleased I did give up and can now tell the medical people I have not smoked for over thirty five years.

During the interview Mr Hockney frequently told Melvyn Bragg that "I will be ninety one years old in five years".

With the exceptional talent he has and the wonderful paintings he still produces I sincerely hope he does reach to be ninety one years old but I also hope he gives up smoking soon.



FANTASTIC FILMS AND WHERE TO FIND THEM

The proverb goes that "necessity is the mother of invention." In the world of film making a low budget should not mean low skill and some great films have come out of having little resources available with filmmakers using their ingenuity to compensate for a lack of money.

This month on Fantastic Films, we will turn the spotlight on four great movies available to watch on streaming services where creativity counts more than cash.



"They're here already! You're next! You're next, You're next...!"

Somebody far cleverer than me once said "every generation needs their own version of Invasion of the Body Snatchers" and indeed there have been three remakes; The fantastic 1978 version with Donald Sutherland, Leonard Nimoy and Jeff Goldblum (which is available on Freevee); the pretty good "Body Snatchers" from 1993 and the truly disappointing 2007 adaptation "The Invasion" despite the star power of Nicole Kidman and Daniel Craig. However, it all started with the original 1956 production which adapted a novel that had been published two years earlier. Intended to be released as a double bill, this little movie was selected for preservation in the United States National Film Registry for being "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant."

Available to watch on ITVX, the film was directed in atmospheric black and white by Don Siegel who in his amazingly prolific career made five films with Clint Eastwood including "Dirty Harry" and John Wayne's last film "The Shootist". The film didn't have the budget for big stars but landed a character actor, Kevin McCarthy, whose name you might not know but film fans will have seen his face in a long career. He plays a doctor in a small California town where he begins to see patients who claim close relatives are imposters. Concerned that several town residents are succumbing to a form of mass hysteria, he investigates further and discovers something far more sinister.

With a running time under 90 minutes, the film has not an ounce of fat. It is a lean, mean thriller which did have some studio interference with a more optimistic epilogue but it doesn't spoil the hardhitting journey. Some say it has a political subtext for the US witch hunts of the time and/or the fear of communist infiltration but regardless this is a classic science fiction thriller which still resonates today.

"Look at that, two cops wishing me luck. I'm doomed."

Have you ever sat in your cinema seat and the opening titles roll for a film and you get that feeling you are in for a treat? It has happened a few times to me and one film really delivered in the late 70s. The big film of the time was "Halloween" but I went to see the director's earlier film Assault on Precinct 13 (available on Prime Video and ITVX) and that electronic score started, John Carpenter

wrote, directed, edited and did the music (because he was "fast and cheap") of this electrifying action thriller (with a healthy dose of humour) which was a western in an urban setting.



After that shocking sequence (if you don't know, I am not spoiling it for you), the set-up is a siege in a police station that is in the process of relocating that has only a skeleton staff and a group of prisoners including a convicted murder on his way to Death Row (the wonderfully named Napoleon Wilson) who must work together to stop a bloodthirsty street gang from storming the building to rack revenge.

The giveaway to its low budget are the limited locations and a lengthy scene of the gang driving around the ghetto targeting their victims but Carpenter turns these to his advantage ratcheting up the tension which leads to terrific action sequences and set pieces plus beautiful cinematography that makes the film look better than most monied films. And, of course, there is that score which anticipated the arrival and influenced the 80s synth-pop bands.

As you might tell, I am a huge fan of John Carpenter and he has made many perfect films but this still stands as one of his finest.

Heading back to science-fiction, one of my favourite cinema experiences of the year so far was "The Creator". An epic science fiction epic where British writer/director, Gareth Edwards managed to pull off stunning visuals and special effects with a fraction of the normal Hollywood budget. However, this should not be surprising when you watch Edwards' first film, Monsters (available on ITVX).

Set in a world that looks like ours except a satellite containing alien DNA has crashed into Mexico (close to the US border) creating an infected zone where alien beings roam raiding towns and villages. On one side of the infected zone an American photojournalist, Andrew, is tasked with escorting his boss's daughter, Samantha through the area and back to the US. So begins a road trip where the duo are conned by some and helped by others caught up in this disaster.

Befitting the budget, it eschews the spectacular creating an almost documentary feel especially as a lot of the dialogue was improvised where the story relies on the human encounters, our pair



make on their perilous journey. In the few scenes where the titular alien monsters appear the CGI is seamless and even more extraordinary when you realise that Edwards created them himself on a home computer. Not sure my laptop would achieve the same results. If you are looking for big bangs, this is not for you but if you like a thoughtful human sci-fi story, Monsters is worth a view.

Finally, a recent British film which deserves more attention. I do have a bit of aversion to films that seem to not only proclaim "it's grim up North" but combine it with there being no hope for us northerners. Fortunately, although Ali & Ava (available on BBC iPlayer) seems to be going in that direction, there is a welcome grain of optimism by the end.

Set and filmed in Bradford, the film is a slice of social realism centred around a middle-aged romance between the two title characters. Both from very different backgrounds and carrying baggage of the past, Ali is a landlord who is empathetic to his tenants but is locked in a marriage that has fallen apart but shows a brave and charming face in public. Ava is a widowed teaching assistant with a large family. A chance meeting (helped by the great British weather) finds a strong connection that comes into conflict with their past and current experiences

In some ways, Ali & Ava is quite a slight film but it has layers that rely on the performances of the leads and Claire Rushbrook and Adeel Akhtar deliver the needed chemistry. You want to spend time with these characters and wish their ending to be a happy one. It is extremely gratifying to see Akhtar front and centre here after delivering stand-out supporting performances (such as "Four Lions" and TV's "Utopia").

Ali & Ava is not always a pleasant watch but there is a genuine humanity and humour contained which can be quite rare.

The nights are long and dark now but I hope you find some entertaining in the above recommendations. Next stop... Christmas movies.

IS BEVERLEY HOSTING YORKSHIRE'S BIGGEST CHRISTMAS TREE FESTIVAL THIS DECEMBER?

It's back. And it's bigger than ever. Beverley Minster's annual Christmas Tree Festival is packing 125 beautifully decorated trees into our stunning, medieval church this December.

While we can't definitively claim to be the biggest Christmas Tree Festival in Yorkshire we have tried - and failed - to find one that's bigger. If anyone knows any different, do let us know!

Each tree is sponsored by a different local charity, organisation, school or business. And as they are free to decorate their own tree as they wish - it means every fir looks unique once it's been dressed and lit with beautiful fairy lights.

"This year has seen a growing demand for Christmas Tree sponsorship" says Bob Farley who leads the festival team at the Minster.

"It just goes to show what a huge community event this is with charities, large and small joining in alongside local businesses, schools, residential homes for the elderly, and many other East Yorkshire groups. This festival is by the community for the community, while also helping us to raise much-needed funds for the Minster".



Last year trees sported a diverse range of decorations to showcase the focus of each sponsor including crocheted bras, sunflowers, cans of beer, Christmas puddings, decorations made from hedgerow-foraged rubbish, and 'young and old' images of the occupants of a local care home.

Many of this year's participants are already planning ahead and preparing for their Christmas Tree entry for 2023. And again just as in previous years, visitors to the Festival between 1st and 10th December can get involved in voting for their favourite tree.

New this December will be the chance for visitors to join special sessions to decorate their own Christmas wreaths amongst the festival trees. Led by experts from the Beverley Flower Club, sessions will run on Weds 6th, Thurs 7th and Fri 8th - the same days as the Made in East Yorkshire Markets.

This means more festive activities to enjoy across the town. Places are limited so booking ahead will be essential. Each participant will be allowed into the Christmas Tree Festival for free and will enjoy a warming mug of hot chocolate too as part of their wreath-making experience.

Also, new this year will be extended opening hours on Thursday 7th December when the Festival will close at 6pm instead of 4pm to allow local visitors to pop in after work to see the trees.

Similar to last year there will be a Quiet Session on the morning of Monday 4th December between 9am and 10am for neurodiverse visitors who may struggle with the crowds and noise at other times of the festival. We have also added a second Quiet Session on the same day between 4pm and 5pm.



Finally, set amongst the trees during the evenings will be a number of carol concerts. The annual MacMillan Carol Concert takes place on Tuesday 5th December at 7pm and Carols by Candlelight, led by the Minster choir, take place on Friday 8th and Saturday 9th of December.

On the evening of Sunday, the 10th Britten's Ceremony of Carols is performed.

Entry to the Christmas Tree Festival remains £5 (in line with last year) with accompanied children under 18 allowed in for free. Visitors can pay by card or cash on the door.
