# MV SUN NOW ACCESSIBLE FOR WHEELCHAIR USERS Whilst the 'Syntan' is perfect for Barge-Pullers

The 'Syntan' is the barge which is used for the World Barge-pulling Championships, which this year will be held on September 23rd. Teams of 4 are invited to pull the 64-ton barge 200 metres along the Beck.

Meanwhile, the Beverley Barge Preservation Society (BBPS) is delighted to announce that its newly-installed wheelchair lift on the 'Sun' means that wheelchair users are able to enjoy trips out on the River Hull.

The MV Sun is a former British Waterways maintenance vessel which cruises up-river as far as Struncheon Hill Lock which was built as a late addition to the Driffield Navigation.

The 'Sun' has been fitted with windows so that passengers can see out as the vessel moves along. The saloon accommodates up to 12 passengers. There is a small galley and a disabled WC. The BBPS runs public trips on the 'Sun' (next date September 13th) and is available for charters.

The BBPS also owns the 'Mermaid' as well as the 'Syntan'. The 'Syntan barge is now permanently moored on Beverley Beck and is open every Sunday from 10.30am-3pm; it makes a unique party, meeting or conference venue! When 'Syntan' is open, the 'Mermaid', a lifeboat tender, is available for trips along the Beck; she holds 8 passengers.

There is also a planned trip on the 'Syntan' on September 4th. Bookings and further information as above!



# LIVE ON STAGE - WENDY KIRKLAND & BAND PLAY MUSIC FROM THE PIANO DIVAS

The idea of a show featuring the work of pianist singers such as Nina Simone, Eliane Elias, Diana Krall and Blossom Dearie came from the meeting of minds of band members Pat Sprakes, Paul Jefferies and Stevie Smith. But who could produce such a performance? Step up Wendy Kirkland!

There are few pianists in jazz today that can step up to the mark of singing whilst playing and, rather than accompanying themselves, can exhibit superb technical and harmonic ability at the piano. Wendy is that pianist.

Wendy's musical career began at the age of 10, when she started taking piano lessons. She won a scholarship to have her lessons paid for and switched to jazz in her late teens. She accompanied other singers, played in club bands and was a pianist for dance classes but was persuaded to sing by friend and guitarist Bill McCreath which enabled her to reach people turned off by instrumental jazz. Wendy's voice has been likened to Blossom Dearie with hints of Diana Krall. Her influences range from Nat King Cole, Sarah Vaughan and Ella Fitzgerald through Oscar Peterson, Bill Evans, Wynton Kelly to Chick Corea, Eliane Elias and Michel Petrucciani.

Piano Divas is a tribute to the great pianist singers of jazz; the band includes Wendy's husband, Pat Sprakes who she met by chance on a gig - they have been making music together ever since! The Observer review said: "Proper jazz piano, excellent band - a very classy debut" whilst the Sunday Times said: "Mellow and stylish". # DEREK BAUGH PUTS PEN TO PAPER IN AID OF THE DAISY APPEAL

Derek is famous locally and nationally for his 14 years as Head Chef at Willerby Manor and 16 years as Chef Patron at The Manor House, Walkington, sadly long-gone but at the time 'worth driving a hundred miles miles for' according to BBC Radio 4's late food critic Derek Cooper.

He's trained at least three famous chefs, two who have won 'gongs' and one who now runs a restaurant in Manchester with 87 staff! He has a life-time of memories and great stories which he has committed to paper in a book which will entertain and amuse you and is well worth £10, every penny of which is going to the Daisy Appeal.

Derek never got a 'gong' or a Michelin Star, but he did create a venue which, at that time, according to Roy Woodcock, who has written the Foreword, was a 'culinary oasis in a gastronomic desert.' Derek is not a Yorkshireman - he was brought up in North Wales but his lifetime ambition was to become a chef. His journey began when he passed enough O-levels to gain a place at Llandudno Hotel School, working as a commis waiter at the Imperial Hotel at weekends.

Once Derek had arrived in East Yorkshire, as a senior lecturer at Hull College of Technology, then transforming the Nag's Head at Routh before becoming MD at Willerby Manor and finally moving to The Manor House, he found it impossible to move away.





Now enjoying well-earnt retirement, playing lots of golf and enjoying the company of some of the many interesting people he has met over the years, he has, from memory, written 'Memories of a Dorchester Chef and Beyond'.

It is due to be officially launched on September 30th at a champagne luncheon at Tickton Grange along with Paul Whymant's book 'A Poem to Inspire' written to support cancer sufferers and sold in aid of Macmillan.

The events are made possible through the efforts of many volunteers and institutions, with the support of ERYC, the Georgian Society for East Yorkshire, Beverley Town Council and the splendid Hull, City of Culture volunteers.

The most famous woman ever to live in Beverley was Mary Wollstonecraft (d. 1797) who lived at 2 Highgate as a child and was educated here by Dr John Arden. She is called the founder

of modern feminism, and in August 2018 was no. 8 in the BBC's History magazine list of '100 women who changed the world'. Her book, A Vindication of the Rights of Woman, was listed by Melvyn Bragg as among the 12 most important books ever written.



She is of course in our Beverley list, and from late August for 10 days her image will be projected on to the south end of the Beverley Arms, where the Arden family lived.

# YOUR FINANCES WITH GARETH BOTTERILL BUY TO LET PROPERTIES - PERSONAL OR COMPANY OWNERSHIP

Recent changes to the way landlords are taxed on buy to let properties has led to a great deal of consideration of whether buy to let properties should be owned personally or through a limited company.

This is not a straightforward decision as there are numerous tax issues that must be considered before making the decision to transfer privately owned property into an existing or new limited company.

 Income Tax / Corporation Tax: The basic rate of income tax payable on profits is 20%, Corporation tax is currently chargeable at 19% but from 2020 the Corporation tax rate will fall to just 17%. Therefore, a small tax saving can be made on annual profits.

However, the additional compliance costs such as accountancy fees would no doubt mean that in reality there is no cost savings for those paying tax at the basic rate.

The higher rate for income tax is currently 40%; there is no higher rate for Corporation tax so this is where using a limited company could be of some tax benefit, assuming that the directors / shareholders can limit the amount of profits that they draw from the limited company.

Mortgage interest relief will be removed for higher rate tax payers, making private ownership less tax efficient for higher rate tax payers.

• Capital Gains Tax When property is sold, capital gains tax is normally due on the gains made. Individuals are entitled to an annual capital gains tax allowance of £11,700. A limited company does not benefit from this allowance.

There are also different tax rates for capital gains tax. Individuals pay capital gains tax at 18% / 28% depending on if they are higher rate tax payers, whereas a limited company pays the corporation tax rate of 19%, or 17% from 2020.

If a property is jointly owned, then each owner will benefit from the annual allowance of £11,700.

• Extraction of Profits There is a potential tax trap for property owned within a limited company. Individuals pay tax based on their annual profits.

If property is owned by a limited company, the profits will be taxed but if the shareholders then withdraw the profits from the company as a dividend, they are potentially also subject to tax at 7.5% or 32.5%.

There is also a potential double tax charge when property is sold within a limited company and subject to capital gains tax.

If the retained cash is then withdrawn by the shareholders, they also will be taxed on the funds.

# THE PERFECT PICTURE BY BROWN'S PHOTOGRAPHY

Use burst mode for unpredictable subjects.

Kids, pets, wildlife, and many other subjects can be unpredictable. Use burst mode on your camera to increase the chances that you'll capture the moment you're going for.



Burst mode will let your camera continuously capture images as you hold down the shutter button. This can also be helpful for things like group photos - you'll be able to pick through a set of shots to find one with no one blinking!

In addition to burst mode, you want to make sure you have the right shutter speed to have the image look right without sacrificing exposure.

#### Serves 8-12 Inaredients

- 150g Vegan butter
- 8g Vanilla extract
- 200g Dark brown sugar
- 7g Baking powder
- Zest of 1 orange
- 100g Grated carrot
- 200g Self raising flour
- 100g Strong flour
- 100ml Oat milk50ml Aquafaba
- SOMI Aquataba (Chickpea water)

#### Frosting Ingredients:

- 200g Creamed coconut
- 80g Icing sugar
- 2Tbsp Vanilla extract
- 1Tbsp Ground cinnamon
- 50ml Oat milk

#### Method:

Cream together in a mixing bowl the Vegan butter, extract and sugar until a paste like substance is created. Add both flours, aquafaba and oat milk to the mixing bowl and mix together.

Finish the batter by adding the grated carrot and orange zest. Line your baking tin and cook in a preheated 180°C oven for 30 - 45 minutes turning half way. Take out of the oven and allow to cool.

In a new mixing bowl add all of the frosting ingredients together and mix until a smooth even frosting is achieved. Spoon the frosting onto the top of the carrot cake and sprinkle with sunflower seeds or a garnish of your choice. Slice, eat and enjoy!









# I'VE BEEN THINKING... BY COLIN RAYNOR

When this September issue comes out normal weather will have resumed... or will it? Talking about the weather is one of the great British pastimes and as the last few months have been abnormally hot, most conversations have included some reference to the temperature of the day and do we like it, or not.



Encouraged by a plethora of weather forecasters

(where do they all come from?) we were also asked to think, was it hotter than 1976? For anyone under fifty years old that wouldn't mean much in the same way as we are sometimes asked if 1947 or 1963 were the worst winters.

Putting aside any flippancy on this subject it is a serious matter when extreme weather is the cause of people's ill health; affects the growth of essential foods and cause disruption to our everyday living.

I would suggest however that the most dangerous outcome of recent months has been the terrible fires that have occurred (in this country and abroad) stretching the fire services to their limits in their efforts to control such rampaging conflagrations.

Either by accident, design or carelessness the fires in the North of our country around Saddleworth Moor and later in the Bolton area have made us aware yet again of the damage that can be done by fire and the debt we owe to the brave men and women who are on the alert every day in case fire gets out of control.

History does record how fires can result in damage and death in a very short space of time. One of the most famous fires in our country of course occurred over 350 years ago at around midnight on the 2nd of September 1666.

Known as the Great fire of London it lasted for four days burning down some 70,000 houses which were predominantly of a wooden structure. Ironically in the previous year thousands of people in London lost their lives due to the plague and some records state that over 15% of the whole country died during this period.

The summer of 1665 is recorded as very hot but also the winter of that year as extremely cold and this caused the wood in many house to become dried out and subsequently quickly burst into flames when the fire spread throughout the city in 1666. Records are sketchy but most show that only about six or seven people lost their lives in the Great fire of London as many were able to get away from the fire.

Since those days of course the fire services have gone from strength to strength in their ability to deal not just with fire and its consequences but in this modern age the horrific accidents that occur on our roads and many other situations that are part of modern living.

The coming months will no doubt bring us the usual mixture of weather so let us be forever thankful that our firefighters are always ready to keep us safe and even prepared to put their lives on the line for us all.

# **COULD HYDROTHERAPY HELP YOUR DOG?**

# COUNTRYSIDE MATTERS WITH SAM WALTON -LEST WE FORGET

If our Grandparents could come back now and see some the changes we have in agriculture, I am not sure whether they would be pleased or disappointed; they'd certainly be shaken. In their day, we had all the old breeds of native livestock, 12 each of pigs, sheep and cattle. I admire the stalwarts who still keep them and who have, in fact, improved them, whilst retaining their natural qualities.

Some time ago, I visited a man who had a farm on the North Yorkshire Moors above Pickering. He had three butchers' shops in London and used to make the journey up every weekend. His secret was all the old breeds he kept, especially the Longhorn cattle. Magnificent beasts in every way; full of taste as they are slow to mature, docile - yet look ferocious, and would probably survive in quite difficult countryside. Yes, I was reminded of the



old breeds when I looked round Driffield Show in July. It is a while since I have seen a Large Black pig though at one time there would be a few on most farms. Slow-growing and fatter than some, but some say fat is where the taste is! Unfortunately, fat costs four times as much to put on than lean. In those days dark skin pigment on the bacon rind was not a problem but today meat-processors would throw their hand up in horror if they had black rind to contend with!



In Grandfather's day, piglets weren't weaned until day 56. The Large Black sows are pregnant for 115 days and are mated again 5 days after weaning, which meant they could only have 2 litters a year, with 7 or 8 piglets in each litter. Today, piglets are weaned at 26/27 days, so the modern sow can produce 2.4 litters a year with a target yield of 30 piglets per sow per year.

So today the stalwart breeders who take great pride in their charges, have niche markets for the meat plus taking them to agricultural shows where they are always a draw for the public.

# PLAN AHEAD WITH RICHARD STOTT OF R D STOTT Architects - Start Planning for Next Year...

The other day I saw a sign up in a local restaurant stating that they were taking bookings for Christmas Dinner, and while I thought this was a tad early for Christmas, it did make me think that maybe I should put a note up in the window to state that we are now preparing design schemes for extensions and new builds for next year.

It might seem that we've only just got the kids back to school and our thoughts might well be turning to Christmas, but, if you are thinking of extending or altering your house next year to create more space or give you that extra bedroom, or you are thinking of building a new home, then, while it might seem a long way off, my advice would be to start planning it now. The building process is, unfortunately, a slow process. There is the design to be agreed and then the regulatory local authority, planning and building regulation processes to overcome, and these, in most cases, cannot be speeded up or avoided. Once you've appointed a designer, and they have carried out their surveys and prepared their drawings and you've agreed a design with them, you might be a month or two down the line. The planning process then takes 2 months. Following this, and hopefully the scheme will have been approved without delay, you then need to prepare the more detailed drawings and information for submission to Building Control and to go out to Tender with. Again, with the time involved in preparing the information and then submitting it for approval and going out to Tender this can then take another 2 months. Finally, agreeing the final details and costs with a contractor and agreeing a start on site date can sometimes add another month before you are on site.

You can therefore, never start to plan too early. The earlier you start to plan for that much needed or desired, extra bedroom and or open plan living area, then the smoother and easier it will be in the long run. This is most probably going to be a major financial commitment, maybe second only to the original purchase of your house, and so, it is an important that you don't rush into making decisions that you might regret later. There will be a lot of decisions to make, so give yourself plenty of time. Always seek professional advice from either a registered architect, a professional designer or builder who should be able to advise on what the best options are for your house and for you and what approvals you might need, if any. Make sure everything is signed off prior to starting any works.

# Garden... Septe

write this the weather is starting to break, daytime temperature are not so hiah and we've had some thunderv showers - which have been very welcome for the gardens. However, don't be fooled into thinking watering is not needed - the ground will be rock hard after the long dry spell and the rain will find it difficult to penetrate the soil (it will help if you spike the soil with a fork to open up the ground a little); also, invariably the downpours are followed by strong sunshine which evaporates the water nearly as quickly as it fell.

Without a doubt there will inevitably be plant casualties as a result of the dry weather we have had, most noticeably lawns, and fleshy perennials; annuals and newly planted trees and shrubs, this may include any planted within the last 5 years as their root systems will not have developed deep enough into the soil. So looking ahead, what should we be doing if summers like this year become the norm?

 Choose plants that are drought tolerant - and consider planting them in autumn (as was done before the advent of container grown plants) or in spring, giving them chance to establish a little before the onset of dry weather.

Consider harvesting more rainwater in butts.

• Mulching borders - this helps prevent water evaporating.

· If watering is required - then do so economically. Do not waste water on your lawn - as soon as rain falls it will 'green up', in dry spells cut less frequently and I have long been an advocate of not cutting it too short, even in normal conditions. Only water plants that are 'suffering' - do this by directing the water to the stem base, soaking the soil not the foliage. It is pointless giving the plants frequent sprinklings of water, it will not soak into the root zone and if plants are newly planted it encourages shallow root growth.

# Tasks for September

Tasks in September are all about starting to gear up for a change in season and getting prepared for the months to come.

· Borders - continue to dead head flowers that have faded - you are unlikely to encourage any new flowers at this stage of the season, but not having them around will allow those in full flower to be shown off at their best. Start clearing up leaves and debris to prevent disease and pests 'settling in' for the winter.

· Hedges - trim them for the last time this season, but don't feed them as this will encourage 'soft' growth. If you're considering planting a new hedge over the coming months prepare the site before the really bad weather sets in and the ground is too wet to work.

 Lawns - September is a good month to seed a new lawn, but do so earlier rather than later and reseed any bare patches. Established lawns should be aerated and an autumn weed/feed applied.

· Containers - continue watering, feeding and dead heading seasonal plants in containers, if you do so they should last until the first frosts. However, if they are past their best clear them out and replant with spring bedding plants and under plant with bulbs.

• Bulbs - buy and plant your spring flowering bulbs. If you are planning on forcing hyacinths for Christmas then this month is your last chance to do SO.

· Ponds - continue to feed fish and thin out any pond and marginal plants that have become congested (or started to take over the pond). Lift the plants and leave them on the side of the pond for a few days before removing them completely - this will enable any pond life to safely make their way back into the pond. Cover the pond with netting BEFORE the leaves start to seriously fall.

#### September is the

month when we see the first signs of autumn, I am inclined to think that autumn will arrive quite early as trees are already showing browning of their leaves, especially the 'Horse Chestnuts'.

Yorkshire's very own 'Land's End', with an array of internationally-important habitats, Spurn is a wildlife-rich mosaic of beach, mudflats, saltmarsh, dunes, grassland, open water, saline lagoons and native sea buckthorn scrub.

The event is limited to 500 competitors who all start at the same time - so it's a big battle to get to the front for the narrow sections.

But one guy who keeps going back for more is Pete Fielding Smith who will be doing it for the 10th year in a row this year! This event is very hard on the body - as well as carrying your bike for long periods of time, which includes going up steep steps, the descents are very tough, too, so it's also tough on your bike. 

# ARTS CORRESPONDENT GARRY BURNETT CONSIDERS THE APPEAL OF CULTURE: MUSIC

Daniel Thompson and Charlotte Coggin, founders of Culture:Music have their base on the top floor of Kardomah 94, near to Queen's Gardens in Hull. I've seen the orchestra 4 times in the last 12 months, twice at Toll Gavel United Church, Beverley and twice in Hull Minster and have not only been mesmerised and delighted by the standard of playing and beautiful range of music, but captivated by the energy and ethos of its leaders who are on a mission to promote 'orchestral music' and to be as inclusive and accessible as they can, to all audiences and players. Culture:Music returns to Beverley this month!



'I'd rather they were not called 'classical concerts" says Daniel. 'I prefer 'orchestral gigs', which reflects the wide repertoire of music they perform, a mixture of classical standards, film and TV scores and arrangements from musicals, and have even covered 90's dance classics performing for Pride in Hull for two consecutive years, so don't be surprised to hear anything from Mozart to John Williams or even Fatboy Slim in a typical concert programme. Previous 'themes' for Culture:Orchestra

concerts include 'Magic' and modern film music and have created a synergy between electronic and traditional instruments such as the accompaniment for 'The Dark Knight' theme by a synthesised tubular bell.

One of the things which makes Culture:Orchestra such a delight is the feeling that they are prepared to take risks and challenge their audiences whilst at the same time putting their arm around them and saying 'come on in, this is for you toe!' all performed with a stunning degree of musical accomplishment. It was in the middle of a dismal and drizzling Sunday afternoon in January, that Culture:Orchestra was born. In the early stages of Hull, City of Culture an 'anthem' for the year was sought and Henry Priestman's 1990s hit with The Christians 'Forgotten Town' was chosen. I remember feeling the goose bumps on the back of my neck when I heard the new arrangement performed by a community choir and an assembly of volunteer musicians, many of whom had little experience of playing together before. I also remember feeling very moved, as I did in the 2012 Olympics opening ceremony, by the power and impact of this stunning new

arrangement, with clever and telling visual accompaniment.

'When we performed at the first ever UK Pride in 2017, there was an absolute deluge. I told everyone not to worry, it would stop raining when we were playing... and it did! It might have been the moment they all really began to take me seriously as a conductor!'

Culture:Orchestra members come from a variety of backgrounds. 'Their ages range from 16-86' says Daniel, though he wouldn't reveal who was at which end! All are very

proficient musicians and play with the kind of passion and enthusiasm which reflects their conductor's drive. Their mission is also to dispel some of the conventions and expectations of attending a 'typical' classical concert. 'I've looked up from conducting and seen somebody try to hide their mobile phone and said 'No, carry on 'live-streaming', we need all the publicity we can get!' He also wants to make the concert experience an exciting, multimedia one, taking the audience through a multi-sensory and emotional journey. They aim to 'smudge the lines' further with future plans involving collaboration with a contemporary composer and performing in less conventional settings.

'I did mention to church officials that we wanted to attract people in who had probably never set foot in a church before' he says, a sentiment which



I know resonates particularly with most church leaders who, like Daniel and Charlotte with music, are always interested in presenting churches as relevant and welcoming environments.

Why choose churches? Easy! 'They're the usually the biggest house in town!'. Acoustics and ambience in both Toll Gavel and Hull Minster have been a massive contributory factor to the concerts' success and now Beverley audiences have the opportunity to see Culture Orchestra perform twice in the Autumn at Toll Gavel. On September 21st at 8pm they perform 'On Broadway', with arrangements taken from 'Lion King', 'Wicked', 'Sweeny Todd', 'Oklahoma', 'Les Misérables' and 'The Color Purple' and return in December for Culture:Christmas.

Plans for the future? 'The orchestra was initially a 3-year 'pipedream' says Daniel. 'I don't care where we 'peak', but that's nowhere near yet. 'That's in the distance somewhere'.

Culture:Orchestra is only in its second year of existence, but you feel that with leaders like Charlotte and Daniel, we are all in for an exciting ride as far as 'orchestral gigs' are concerned.






