GOLFERS 'CHIP IN' WITH A DONATION FOR THE DAISY APPEAL

Fund-raising events at Beverley and East Riding Golf Club during 2018 raised more than £2,500 for the Daisy Appeal, topping the £1,450 raised in 2017.

Professor Nick Stafford, who founded the Appeal in 2002, was delighted to receive the money. The Appeal is currently raising money to build and



equip an £8.2million Molecular Imaging Research Centre which is currently under construction at Castle Hill Hospital.

The Centre will house a cyclotron which will pave the way for new procedures, possibly including scanning for Alzheimer's and prostate cancer. The Daisy Appeal has already opened a Research and Development Centre at Castle Hill and the Jack Brignall PET-CT Centre. Additionally, it has funded research at the University of Hull - all of which benefit local people. Professor Nick

Stafford, Founder of the Daisy Appeal, said: "We are extremely grateful to the club. The golfing fraternity has been very good to the Daisy Appeal. It's not just about the money. It's about exposure and the fact that people think the Daisy Appeal is a worthy cause that will be of benefit to everybody." MEET BEVERLEY'S NEW MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCILLORS

The new Mayor of Beverley, Cllr Duncan Jack and his consort, Mayoress Joy Jack, were invested at the annual Mayor-making Ceremony in Beverley Guildhall on Monday, May 20th. Taking over as the Chair of Beverley Town Council from out-going Mayor, Bryan Pearson, Duncan is set to lead the newly elected Town Council. We had the pleasure of meeting Duncan to find out about his vision for his Mayoral year.



Duncan is the second person in his family to be Mayor of Beverley - his Great Grandfather, Richard Care, who ran Cares in Saturday Market, also held this office in 1907-1909 and again took the helm when WE Elwell died in office between 1909-10. It's Duncan's second stint at holding the office - he was previously Mayor 2004-2005.

He is humbled to be re-elected Mayor as he enjoyed the responsibility of representing Beverley last time and is confident he can bring his experience to the post for the benefit of Beverley this time. His wife, Joy, is also looking forward to being Lady Mayoress again!

Robert William Duncan Jack was born in Cottingham but grew up in Beverley. He was educated at St Mary's School until he passed his 11+ and then went to school in Pocklington. After school, he had a variety of jobs, including spending 6 months at Hodgson's Tannery, as a landscape gardener and 10 years in the building industry. Duncan's father ran G Jack & Son Ltd in Wednesday Market which Duncan took over in 1985 upon his father's retirement. Duncan himself retired from the business on December 31st 2015.

Duncan married Joy at St Nicholas Church, Beverley, forty-something years ago. Joy is a Beverlonian who worked in Barclays Bank for many years. They have 2 children; Laura works for Manchester University and Henry is in Newcastle working for Sage.

Both Duncan and Joy are known around the town for their community spirit and volunteering to make Beverley a great place to live and work. Both are members of Beverley Westwood Lions and help with Beverley in Bloom, Joy is on the Beverley Lights Committee and Duncan is a member of the group which has re-established 'Brighter Beverley', which goes around litterpicking and sweeping up detritus from our streets.

Duncan said: "We can pick up 8 bags of litter but within 3 days, people have dropped cigarette ends, chewing gum, drinks cans etc. There are plenty of litter bins around Beverley, which are frequently emptied, so I would implore everyone to put their litter in the bins provided or take it home with them. We all benefit when Beverley is shown at its beautiful best - attracting more visitors to spend their time and money here - so I would ask everyone to have real pride in the place and ensure it always looks great."

Duncan was Vice-Chair of the group which instigated the Beverley Town Trail in 2010. It was Chris Try who pushed for a trail after following Hull's Fish Trail and Rob Mackie came up with the idea of celebrating the Beverley Guilds.

Duncan said: "It took about 10 years to get the funding and now the Trail is 10 years old, perhaps it's time for a relaunch. We have lots of new residents who might not know about the Guilds! People want to discover things around Beverley - the glove on the bench frequently has people mystified near the Market Cross frequently has people mystified."

Duncan is very keen that anyone who would like to get involved with making Beverley even better than it already is or who has a big idea should contact him at the Beverley Town Council

Even though this is ancient wisdom it is entirely topical and applicable to our modern daily lives.

Topics covered include: decreasing anxiety, worry & stress; greater inner peace & happiness and a positive outlook on life & better relationships - plus others aimed at improving our experience of life.

A lovely response from one year



CLASSIC CARS WITH CARFAN - THE VANDEN PLAS AUSTIN ALLEGRO

The subject of this issue is, to paraphrase a well-known high street store, not just any Austin Allegro, but a Vanden Plas Austin Allegro. Now it's a very rare sight indeed on our crowded roads, but in its time, you could find one on most street corners. More than 640,000 of all the different variants were built over an eight-year period from 1973 to 1982.

Carfan remembers these cars coming out and the outcry from motoring journalists about its "square" steering wheel, although makers Austin called it "quartic". Call it what you will, a lot of owners got sick of the repeated criticism and hilarity it caused and changed to a more conventional round one; it was eventually changed on the production line too.

This particular version is of 1978 vintage and, like a fine wine, has aged rather

well, having been looked after by previous owners. Its current owner was brave enough to buy it at auction only last year, but it has (so far) proved to be very reliable. It has only covered 56,000 miles to date and has benefitted from a respray in 2015, both of which have undoubtedly contributed to its longevity.



Interestingly, it has been converted from an automatic transmission to a fivespeed manual as well as having an electronic ignition added. Purists may baulk at such "sacrilegious" changes from the original specification, but there are well-reasoned arguments about originality versus improvement.

Expect to pay around £2000 to put one on your drive, although examples in great condition can cost over twice as much. However, you may struggle to find one as so many have just rusted away - this was, after all, a 1970s British, mass-produced car. So, don't forget, should you see an Allegro (with a round OR quartic steering wheel), don't forget that cheery Carfan wave!

PRACTICAL MOTORING WITH RICH HAYES IGNORE MOTORWAY SMART SIGNS AT YOUR PERIL!

Do you ignore the warning signs on smart motorways? If you do, you could soon find yourself with an automatic fine and points on your license.

Thanks to new Home Office legislation being introduced on 10th June 2019, police will be able to punish drivers who ignore warnings and drive in closed lanes on

smart motorways.

You will probably have already seen the red 'X' signs on smart motorways, but new traffic cameras will mean that anyone caught driving in



those lanes will be slapped with a £100 fine and three points on their license

Research from the RAC suggests that there are still lots of motorists ignoring the signs, but it's not clear whether that is deliberate or not. The signs are commonly used to indicate a closed lane due to a vehicle that has broken down.

At present, motorists caught using these lanes by a police officer only face a fine but from 10th June penalty points could also be dished out.

According to Highways England, the cameras will be in use later this summer.

The takeaway from this article? As soon as you seen a red 'X' sign, move over into an open lane safely.



COUNTRYSIDE MATTERS WITH SAM WALTON...PIGS

Some readers may know that I have been involved with the pig industry for many years, have travelled widely and seen a lot of different ways of producing pigs. I've also seen a huge array of housing for all stages of production. I was looking back through some slides recently and came across one which I had taken in Austria at least fifteen years ago. It is the only place where I have seen maternity pens constructed with ceramic tiles.

It did give off a sort of hygienic, almost clinical impression, as it would be so easy to wash down any dung smeared on the walls and no germs of any kind would be able to penetrate the tiles. Was there a downside? I did wonder if it would be easy to crack the tiles with something like a feed barrow or bucket banging against them. It also gave off an air of possibly being cold material - but, of course, as always, the pens are heated for

the piglets. Overall it was quite impressive! You can always tell if an animal of any kind is comfortable with its surroundings and these pigs were in excellent condition.

That set me thinking about many other kinds of housing within the pig industry in countries all over the world. We have in the UK a manufacturer of fully



insulated outdoor maternity arks, who not only supplies a huge portion of the outdoor section in the UK but has recently supplied to places like Denmark, Canada, New Zealand, USA and, would you believe, to Barbados where a new outdoor farm is setting up. Being fully insulated, they will do well in both hot and cold countries. I first saw these in operation in Scotland where one particular firm has 22 outdoor herds with a total of 16, 000 sows and they love them! Of course, not every country has outdoor pigs, but here in the UK, somewhere around 45 percent of our sow herds are outdoors, mainly in East Anglia, but there's also a smattering in many of our other counties.

IN THE GARDEN... JUNE

Its early summer, and we should be able to look forward to some warm sunny days. The days are the longest of the year in June, giving us the opportunity to 'potter' in the garden in the evenings and start to relax and enjoy the garden. Even the most reluctant amongst should be able to get outside and enjoy some time in the garden, albeit it may be sitting on the patio with a long cold drink.

Tasks for June...

All the hard work should have been done earlier in the year. However, you will need to keep on top of things so...

- Mow the lawn don't cut it too short, if we have a really dry spell the lawn will go brown if you do.
- Keep a look out for pest, particularly on roses and lush green shoots
- Keep on top of weeds.
- Tidy up/lift any remaining spring flowering bulbs.
- Lift and divide daffodils especially if they have been in the same place for a long time. Daffodils can become crowded and over time stop producing flowers (this is called coming up blind).
- WATERING PLANTS due to a combination of longer days, generally drier/sunnier days and the rate at which plants 'drink' water, you will probably need to water the garden. Newly planted plants, young vegetables and plants in containers will need watering most. Watering should be done thoroughly ideally either early in the morning or in the evening. Hanging baskets and small containers should be watered daily and fed with a liquid feed once a week. If you have large areas in the garden to water don't try and water the whole area by splashing a bit of water on daily, split the garden into areas and give each a 'good soak' which should last up to a week. Don't be fooled by heavy thundery downpours often most of the rain 'runs off' and doesn't enter the soil.
- Feed plants in containers with a water soluble feed this can be done every time you water and certainly once a week.

DEADHEADING (removing flowers as they fade) - this is an important task which needs doing regularly. Deadheading will extend the flowering period, by diverting the plants' energy from producing seeds into new growth and flowers. To deadhead cut back to just above a bud lower down the stem of the plant using secateurs or garden snips.

Here's hoping the weather is good enough for you to enjoy your garden in all its glory in June.



WALKING WITH IAN RICHAR



Few villages are as instantly recognisable by one image, as is Skidby by its beautiful early nineteenth windmill which commands all views, especially from the south.

It has become a very popular and vibrant commuter village, being close to Hull and Beverley, but it also has much of architectural and historic interest.

Our 4.5 mile walk is perfect for an early summer saunter and takes us on two lovely loops onto the adjacent Wolds, whilst also exploring the fine main street.

Sadly, Skidby has lost its shops (even the innovative venture at the pub) but the Half Moon still functions and there is also the splendid Sails Cafe to refresh you at the end of



1) Start the at the free parking area near the Millhouse Restaurant (HU16 5TF) or take the bus, which runs pretty regularly to and from Beverley. Follow the path on your left that affords fantastic views of the windmill. In late spring and early summer the wildflower meadow is an absolute joy, full of cowslips when I passed by - the photo here made it onto BBC Look North on May 1st - how nice to receive recognition from the legendary Mr





The clear path curves past the windmill and heads out into open country. The present building dates from 1821, but there has been one the site for over 600 years, it ceased commercial production in 1954.

A few years ago, I would often see the sails turning when returning from work to Beverley. I have been told that this no longer occurs, which is sad as it is a wonderful sight.

This pleasant path gives great views and passes the grimly named Gallows Hill, where apparently sheep rustlers met their ends.

2 At the path junction, turn right back towards the village. When you reach the quiet road the main route goes right, but if like me, you have an interest in railways you might enjoy the half mile up to the old rail bridge of the former Hull and Barnsley line - now used by quarry traffic - before returning to the village.

- 3 Where the lane joins the road to Little Weighton, go left and on the next corner take the well signed path on the right out onto the Wold that heads due north to Risby. This gives easy walking until you join the minor road of Dunflat
- 4 Go right here, stopping to view the earthworks of Risby Hall's formal gardens - there are two information boards here. Pass the entrance to the Folly Lakes and Cafe, or go down and have a cuppa, it is a lovely spot.
- 5 At the edge of the wood take the signed track on the right, back south towards Skidby, known as Oldgate. Again the views are extensive and the last section into the village is particularly verdant as it passes by a dramatic former quarry face - but do beware a herd of what can be very frisky cows!



- 3 You are now in the heart of the old village by the church and lovely Greens. St, Michael's is no architectural masterpiece, but it is usually open and welcoming with some nice medieval details such as a lancet window. Head right up Main Street towards the windmill, there are some good quality farm buildings that front the street in a typically East Yorkshire way as you approach the pub, which might just be open. I recall Skidby having two shops and when they closed a retail outlet opened for a while at the pub. It is sad that a large village of some 1300 people can no longer sustain somewhere to buy newspapers, milk or stamps, but that is change I suppose. It was interesting to chat with a local resident who has lived in the village for over 30 years, who feels that the only real downside to living in such a pleasant place is having to drive to the shops or post office in either Cottingham or Little Weighton.
- 7 At the road junction go right down to the windmill and the car park. The windmill is now of course a fine museum, well worth visiting, as is the marvellous cafe in the courtyard (closed on Mondays) Indeed, on an early summer's day there can be few better places to relax with a coffee and scone after a nice gentle walk in the lovely Yorkshire countryside.

CYCLING WITH WILSONS WHEELS - PREPARING FOR A CYCLE SPORTIVE

Sportive season is now well under way with the famous Fred Whitton in the Lake District and the Dales Sportive already having taken place. Here, therefore, are a few top tips for that sportive event that you may be taking part in.


Spares are a must, even if the event is supported. I would strongly recommend two spare inner tubes, a chain link, a multi-tool with chain splitter and plenty of fittings, as well as a hand pump. I personally prefer a hand pump as they never run out and are quick and easy to use, unlike CO2 canisters, which can sometimes be faulty, or be difficult to connect with the valve.

In terms of sustenance, sportives will normally have feed stations, however, it's also worth taking some of your own nutrition, as you don't know what might be on offer. If it's not a brand or item you are used to, for example, then it's possible that it may upset your stomach. In such circumstances, it may therefore be better to stick to what you know.

It's also an idea to take extra clothing with you like a gillet or rain cape, unless it's guaranteed to be good weather, as there is nothing worse than being caught out in a rain storm and that little bit if extra weight isn't going to make any difference in the grand scheme of things. Also make sure your phone is fully charged and/or take an OS map of the local area in the event that you encounter a mechanical problem and need to get back to the HQ or your car. This is especially in case you find yourself in a position where you don't know where you are or if you are unfamiliar with the area. Google Maps/map applications on your phone or a physical map will save you time and help to ensure that get you home safe.

If you're not handy with your bike, it might also be worth getting it checked over by a local bike shop, before you take part in the event, to make sure that it's in good working order.

Most importantly, take it at your own pace, don't blow or hit the wall and make sure you enjoy yourself.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT TO HAVE A RESPONSIVE WEBSITE - SAYS GRACE HUTCHINSON OF INDICOLL

Can you remember the last time you encountered a desktop website on your phone? Trying to navigate it by pinching, zooming and scrolling probably made for a pretty poor user experience. We'd even hazard a guess that you likely didn't buy a product or service from this business.

For this reason, Google changed its algorithm back in 2015 to factor in mobile presence as a ranking signal. Hester Ullyart - Star of Chippy -

In September 2014 I was working down Carnaby St in a clothing store. This isn't a major part of the story - but it explains how as a ready-to-go freshly conservatoire trained actress (RADA dahhhling) I'd ended up working full time selling disgusting clothes to rich tourists and constantly kicking myself for letting the side down whilst still not being able to pay my cheap-for-London-because-I-live-in-a-(charming)-cupboard rent. Sound familiar? My daily thoughts said the mantra that I was a failure but that somehow it would all be ok. How had I ended up in this situation? Shouldn't I be Maxine Peake/(insert any other Northern female example) by now?

Then, on my 19-minute break, I listen to the voicemail from an unknown number. It's Richard Avery telling me all about this new theatre that everyone is rallying to make happen in Beverley. I'm chuffed for him - for my home - but at this point I'm still thinking due to the crap they tell us - that London is really where it's at. Ah, what a fool I was. Disclaimer - I'm a Hull girl but I was born in Beverley - it says Beverley on my passport, and I saw a ghost in Nellies when I was a kid (I did! I think. Probably...maybe...) so deal with it. Next thing I know myself and then stranger Ms. Annie Kirkman are 'auditioning' for A Christmas Carol in a beautiful old totally crazy dusty cavernous room in the midst of building work, a Baptist church in Bev with a possibly mad bloke in baggy pants with a British accent (AKA the talented Mike Friend) barking at us to sing this, read that, don't bump into that ladder, thanks very much.

It was great. All of it. Choking on sawdust we are told to mind the various gaps in the floor as another bloke in tracksuit pants comes in - I think he's the janitor - turns out it's Clive Kneller no less - funniest character actor around these parts, sniffing out the work. Thank God he did that, else we'd have all missed out on a lot of joy. And then we make a Vince Regan's adaptation of A Christmas Carol. The first production. I still wish we'd filmed it - that is - the making of it. The making of the theatre. The kids and the kids' parents sitting in the stalls because there's nowhere else for them to be yet, watching Mike put his marvellous creations together in the coldest winter I remember for years. The volunteers in overalls painting/sanding/sweeping around every corner. The laughs and the stress and the beauty of knowing you are making something. The drills competing with the 'hushed sound of the choir'. Rachel Barnes with her ghostly floating cello. Me burning my wig on a lightbulb. (Nobody ever knew that the Ghost of Christmas Past had a bald patch). And the ultimate incredible success of it all. Ta daaaaa! We're open! That production was the best thing that could have happened to me personally, in terms of a mind-flip about what I knew I wanted my life to be like, but also, just in general for the area, for the people, the place - the countless good times, hard times, sweat and the joy.

The magic that has come out ERT since is testament to that - the people who put their muscle and time behind their intent - putting in absolute grit and determination - hours and hours of timethe theatre 'staff' - largely unpaid - still working their arses off today - the talent in the upcoming generations, the actors who are looking around going 'oh, there's work here?' - actors like myself who felt they had to look elsewhere...

It's not London's fault. It's over-saturated. Like all capitals, big cities - we dream of the bright lights yonder - perpetuating the idea that you have to go elsewhere to find what you are looking for. Not true my friend, not true. I don't live in London anymore. It wasn't the clothing store's fault - I just realised that there's a lot more to gain from doing and listening to my gut than waiting. I write my own work, I travel, I tour, I enquire, I make. I spent a lot of last year in New Zealand working at the Lyttelton Arts Factory facilitating and directing and when I'm in the UK, in Hull, Beverley - or on tour, going where the work is. I'm so glad to be able to say that in times when people are trying to put up walls, many of us are proving that there are no walls. Just humans. And energy. And more life. And creativity. That everyone has. You don't have to be rich to be rich (thank heavens).

And so to ERT- five years or so on... it continues to bloom and blossom. They just got a new sign! Now that is exciting. We love ERT. There's music, there's chat, there's community, there's art, there's life and you don't get that with many places because it simply isn't possible to manufacture or pretend emulate. Congratulations to the East Riding Theatre staff, team, and of course the audiences who prove that there is a need and a desire for it. It's all for you baby!
