ROAD CLOSURE, MINSTER WAY / JOCK'S LODGE IMPROVEMENT SCHEME

One lane of Minster Way will be closed for nine months to allow for construction work on the A164 and Jock's Lodge Improvement Scheme

A half-mile section of the A164 Lincoln Way/ Minster Way in Beverley will be closed to westbound traffic - those travelling in the Woodmansey-to-Morrisons supermarket direction - between Ward Way Roundabout and Victoria Roundabout (Morrisons roundabout).

East Riding of Yorkshire Council is to close the lane from Monday 14th October until Saturday 12th July next year. A diversion will be in place.

The eastbound lane of this section of A164 Lincoln Way/Minster Way traffic travelling in the Morrisons-to-Woodmansey direction - will remain open as normal.

The road between the Lincoln Way roundabout and the junction with Dunnock Drive will also be closed to all traffic for the same duration, with a diversion in place.

The closures are necessary to allow for the reconstruction of the Lincoln Way roundabout and the realignment of the road as part of the major project to replace the congested Jock's

Lodge junction on the outskirts of Beverley.

Work on the A164 And Jock's Lodge Improvement Scheme began in January, with completion scheduled for 2026.

Councillor Gary McMaster, the council's cabinet member for housing and infrastructure, said: "I want to thank drivers using this stretch of road for bearing with us while work is carried out on this section of the Jock's Lodge scheme.

"This temporary closure is essential to the overall plan, which is one of the largest construction projects the council has ever undertaken, and it will be a huge benefit to motorists in the long run.

"We know this will cause disruption, but we have tried to keep it to a minimum, and we are pleased we're still able to keep the eastbound lane open"

27TH OCTOBER TURN THE CLOCKS BACK 1HR

On the 27th October the clocks go back one hour at 2am, marking the end of Daylight Saving Time (DST) and the beginning of standard time for the Winter months.

This shift usually occurs on the last Sunday of October, giving an extra hour of sleep but leading to shorter daylight hours.

The main goal is to make better use of daylight during the Winter by having lighter mornings.

While this helps with visibility and energy use, it can also bring earlier sunsets, which changes people's routines as nights become longer and days shorter.







IN THE GARDEN - A WINDOWSILL WITH PURPOSE

Using your windowsill to grow food often seems to be a pointless exercise, but the crops that I have harvested over the last year have been of great use.

A classic example would be Thai basil, which has a very strong and distinctive flavour. This has been added to multiple pasta sauces. A cut and come again salad that has been harvested at least four times before having to be sown again has also given us ample food to eat. There is a tomato called 'Pillar Catch Red' which is a miniature bush variety and because of the aspect of the windowsill has again produced a good crop adding numerous sweet tomatoes to salads.

As you can see in the photograph, I planted only two in this location which was merely an experiment but there will certainly be more planted next year. The crops of tomatoes this year have been varied, but I have still managed to freeze a small amount that will make tomato soup during the Winter period.



From an interior design perspective growing plants on the windowsill injects not only colour but a natural edible image. Lots of different styles of pots can be used giving the kitchen window in this example a strong purpose, it not only looks good but tastes good! The best aspect for growing the salad crops is south west and south east facing, most salad crops prefer not to be in full sun, which if you are also growing outdoors, is a big plus. However, tomatoes particularly like the warmth of the south facing sun and from there will produce a good crop.

The Gardening Calendar

I have just harvested my container grown potatoes. The amount from the containers was not as good as usual however the quality of potatoes is excellent and of ample size. Normally I would have expected at least three more tins from the number of containers I planted but yet I am very pleased with what I have



It is the time to start harvesting apples, gently hold the apple in the palm of your hand and slightly lift, if the apple breaks from the branch, then it is ready to eat. This year my stepovers have given me an abundance of fruit which was a vast improvement on last year. The cooking apples which I grow in the small kitchen garden in a cordon style have also produced a good crop. If you are thinking of growing apples both for cooking and desert varieties then now is the time to buy bare rooted plants. Growing apples in a cordon style will enable you to fit them into a small garden, giving you both structure and height and of course an excellent edible crop.

The photograph on the right was taken in February last year, so early days but still showing structure. Under the trellis are numerous herbs, Good King Henry (Chenopodium bonus-henricus) which I use as spinach and Sweet cicely (Myrrhis odorata) which has a wonderful aniseed smell and bears pale

white umbel shaped flowers which look stunning combined with the foliage of the apple cordons. The garden is once again teaming with wildlife. There are so many sparrows it is impossible to try and count how many there are. The squirrels are back in force as are the blackbirds, and the robins which are my constant gardening companions especially when I am weeding.



Some weeks ago, I was cleaning out the greenhouse, a job which I would say to do as soon as possible. There was a toad sat in the corner that I had not seen for a long time. It enters the greenhouse via a broken piece of wood and fortunately eats any slugs that decide to try and devour my plants. A much-needed asset.



Another job I would say to do if you have the space is create an area to collect fallen leaves in the Autumn. Overtime they become what is termed as leaf mould and can be used as a mulch or soil improver on the beds once they have broken down.

I'm sure you will have heard the phrase 'An Englishman's home is his castle' many times. It is a proverb originated in law in the early 17th century.

The definition is given as 'a person's house is a place of safety and sanctuary where they have the right to feel secure and free from stress or harm'.

Anybody who has studied the history of England will be aware that over the recent centuries these fine words have been put to the test and in many cases found wanting. On more than one occasion this has been because of warring factions between the people who have inhabited the British Isles and made claims of possession that caused conflicts bringing death and destruction, poverty and homelessness.

The Methodist Church, the United Reform Church and the Baptist Church have called for October 6th to be recognised as Homelessness Sunday four days before World Homelessness Day on Thursday October 10th.

This asks for all of us to recognise that, even in this modern day and age, thousands of people of all ages cannot claim that they have a home they can call their own safe, secure castle as a place of sanctuary.

This column has no intent to have a political bias but it is worth making comments on

statements and figures that offer us a picture of the land we all live in.

There is information available that tells us over 3,898 people were said to be living homeless in our country during the period between March 2023 and March 2024.

Since records began (only since 2010) there has been an increase of 120%. London has seen predictably the largest increase from 858 in October 2022 to 1,132 in the Autumn of 2023 and here we are again in October at the start of the Autumn and Winter periods. There are countless reasons why this figure is so high including addiction, mental illness, dysfunctional family life and so on.

All of these factors, and many more, make it extremely difficult to find the most appropriate type of help for each individual as any social worker or charity worker will tell you.

Make no mistake, as I look at these statistics, it saddens me to realise each one represents another human being, maybe of my age, maybe much younger. Perhaps their path of life started in a very normal way like yours and mine but for many of the reasons I have written about above they have not been able to cope and in so many situations had no one to help or advise them.

Living in this modern era, when life moves at such a fast rate, I suggest it is difficult



sometimes for the most balanced, educated, financially secure and family orientated individual person to keep up with the demands of daily life.

So during this designated week in early October let us take a moment or two to think about those in our land, and in other parts of the world, who do not have a place where they have 'that safety and sanctuary of life ' that so many of us enjoy. Trust also that those who daily seek to help our less fortunate brothers and sisters gain more tangible support from those who have the power to provide it.

SHOULD I SAVE OR INVEST? HOW TO CHOOSE WISELY, AND WELL

When we talk about saving and investing, we generally think of them as the two main ways to set money aside for the future. It can be easy to confuse them as one and the same thing - or think that you should opt for one or the other.

In fact, they're two quite distinct options that you have for aiming to grow your money for your future. The first step to understanding the difference is to ask yourself a series of questions, including:

- · How much should or could I put aside?
- How soon might I need it?
- · Where should I put it?
- What do I want that money to do for me and my family?

By answering those questions first, you'll be able to decide how much of your money you should be saving, and how much you might want to invest. It's important to understand the difference.

Why should I save?

In its Financial Wellbeing Strategy 2020-2030, the Money and Pensions Service (MaPS) says: "Saving and investing money for later life are similar behaviours, but people can approach these tasks with different mindsets."

Saving is rooted in the 'here and now'. Our current circumstances, income and outgoings, dictate how much we can save in regular contributions. But saving means accepting that there's a tradeoff between a likely lower rate of growth, and the reassurance that you've got a cash 'slush fund' handy should you need it at a moment's notice.

Cash - money for the near future

Broadly speaking, saving is about putting money aside in the short-term, for the short-term - whether it's a 'just-in-case' fund, to cope with those unexpected car repairs, and boiler breakdowns or something specific, such as a family holiday, or a new kitchen. Whatever you're saving the money for, it is usually best to ensure at least a portion of your money is in a cash account with no restrictions on withdrawals so you know you can get your hands on funds at short notice if you need to.

Instant or easy-access cash savings are a vital part of your financial resilience. Financial advisers recommend keeping three to six months' salary of 'emergency' money in cash. If you're paying in regularly, and you haven't looked to see how much money you've got in your savings or even current accounts, you may want to check. Too much money sitting in cash accounts isn't always working as hard for you as it could be.

Investing for the long term

Saving for long-term goals is where investments come into play. Investing in things like stocks and shares, or bonds and leaving the money untouched for ten to fifteen years or more, means it has the potential to grow into a bigger sum than it would in a cash account.

Investing money for comfortable retirement is a good example, we don't know the final figure we'll need for the future, since we don't know how long we'll live. But we definitely plan to retire one day - and investing for that day is a long-term financial strategy.

However, investing means you're accepting more risk with the money you put in, since the markets may rise and fall - and so may the value of your investments. But the ups and downs of markets typically even out over the medium to long term (five years or more). And the greater growth potential means your money can benefit from the 'snowballing' effect of compounding too.

Why choose investing?

Stock-market-based investments tend to produce greater growth over the long term due to the risk-reward relationship - by accepting more risk, we have the potential to receive more reward. We can also choose the level of risk we feel comfortable with, by making informed choices about where to invest, and what type of investments to choose, such as bonds and equities.

Investing gives you more control over where your money is, and more choice.

Can I reduce the risk of investing?

In general, investing in the short term (i.e. for three or four years) carries a higher risk than investing for longer-term objectives, since there's less time for an investment to recover value if the market falls. Over the longer-term, investors can ride out market volatility more confidently. Cash saving is a more cautious option, but the returns, although often lower, are more guaranteed.

You have a number of options to reduce your risk and make sure you don't risk more than you're comfortable with - mainly by spreading your investments across different types of assets. This principle is known as diversification.

As a representative from your local road safety charity, Hull and East Riding Advanced Motorists, I have been asked to write a series of articles covering different aspects of Advanced

We are all volunteers and our group is currently celebrating our Diamond Jubilee Anniversary 1964-2024. 60 years of coaching Advanced Driving, contributing to making our local roads safer. We run a range of courses and our contact details are at the bottom of this article. Please aet in touch.

The Summer holidays are now over. Order and normality will resume along with the school run which starts again for another year. Here are some useful tips which may help.



Prior to the start of term, check with the school or local council to see if the parking/dropping off arrangements have changed.

Everyone needs to be there at the same time, so the closer you get to the school the more crowded and

congested the roads and pavements will be.

• Make sure everyone is in the right seat. If you use child or booster seats, make sure they are

fit for purpose and correctly secured. Check out Good Egg for some top tips:

- · Pack for success. Dependent on the age of your little ones, pack some healthy treats to distract them and keep them engaged, even on a short
- · Leave enough time. Setting off for school can be a frustrating and rushed experience. Be sure to allow yourself enough time to get ready in the morning, as a half-eaten breakfast and badly combed hair, or forgotten PE kit, can put both you and your child in the wrong frame of mind for the start of the day.
- It's not a race. In many areas with local schools the motto is '20's plenty.' Remember that this is a limit, not a target. Always help out the school crossing patrol, and you'll probably receive a friendly wave and smile for your assistance.
- · Start them while they're young. Teach your children about road safety so they know how to behave around moving traffic. Setting a good example while in the driving seat will stay with them in preparation for when they learn to drive. Parking in a safe place and walking the last few metres will not just help with congestion; it will also allow you to teach them the right way to cross a road, looking right and left, then right again for us Green Cross code users. Teaching children to use the road sensibly will save lives.

Please Remember:

• Traffic always picks up again after the school

holidays so your journey will take longer and potentially be more stressful.

- Make sure the car is fuelled up and fit and ready for stop-start traffic so you have one less thing to worry about.
- Be vigilant around schools as there's likely to be children getting out of cars and not just walking to school, but maybe cycling, skateboarding or using their scooter



RIDING THE RIDING'S LINES

The rail network of the East Riding is not extensive, we lost routes to the infamous Beeching cuts 60 years ago, but our 4 lines and 21 stations that do remain offer lots of delights for the train traveller.

Naming all the stations makes a good quiz question, you have a map to help, but very few people can get them all, fewer still have used them all. Even I, who has been a regular rail user here for over 40 years still have 1 to go - Rawcliffe, on the curious route from Goole to Leeds. The lovely tiled map in Beverley station shows the former network.



We in Beverley are fortunate to have good rail links to much of the Wolds and the coast, with half hourly trains to the north and into Hull.

One commendable feature of this line are the beautifully maintained stations, where teams of volunteers tend lovely station gardens, especially at Driffield and Hutton Cranswick. That noted train user, Michael Portillo, rates Bridlington station as one of his favourites. The recently installed statue of a barrow boy is very attractive.

Some of our rural stations, such as Arram and Broomfleet, are amongst the least used in the country. Using them is, however, a delight in this age of congested roads, check the timetables carefully though as you might have a long wait for a return service. The Goole to Leeds line is often known as a ghost route, for it only has one train each way per day. A great way to explore the whole region by rail is by buying a Day Ranger ticket, Northern have a range of these on their website.

Good value single tickets can also be found on their App. I recommend these linear journeys, with a walk to link two stations. Alight at Bempton, walk through the village and up the quiet lane to the RSPB sanctuary, then walk the wonderful cliff top paths to Bridlington, returning from there. Change at Hull for the short journey to Hessle, fine views of the Humber Bridge and estuary await you on the 3 mile stroll to your return station at North Ferriby.



Hull and Beverley stations are both highly regarded for their fine architecture, each appearing in the 100 Best Railway Stations book by Simon Jenkins. The currently unused former booking hall at Hull Paragon, is a stunning gem of Edwardian tiles & woodwork. So hopefully it's all aboard this Autumn, for as the old advert put it 'let the train take the strain.'

In my own case I only had one field of wheat, which was unaffected and looked like it should and similar with the barley. The rest reminded me of the yield we got when we had binders, stooking of sheaves



and threshing machines, not because of the actual crop but all the bare patches in all the other fields which suffered from being so wet.

How times have changed. Having been involved with farming for more years than I care to think about, it is always good to have a reminder of how things have changed.

In September I visited Wragby Show in Lincolnshire where there was a collection of old machinery, which brought back many memories of what we used to have and what they would do.

That was possible because of the enthusiasts we have who have preserved some of the old tractors



as an example, many of which looked as if they were brand new and there are still many on some farms which have a use today for various jobs.

I was also pleased to see so many breeds of sheep, many of which are rare breeds now or should I say rarer on some farms.

Sheep have always played a part on both the Yorkshire and Lincolnshire Wolds but many of the breeds there would never have been on the Wolds but all thanks to enthusiasts are kept like treasures and so good to see.

What has not been so good to see this year is a lot of the damage done to a host of crops.

You will recall we had what seemed like continuous rain for quite a long period and that has done no end of damage to lots of crops with yields the same as we had when I was a lad when we used the old tractors just mentioned!



THE HISTORY OF DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME IN THE UK

Daylight Saving Time (DST), often known as "British Summer Time" (BST) in the UK, is the practice of setting clocks forward by one hour during the warmer months to extend evening daylight and conserve energy.

The history of daylight saving in the UK reflects broader global changes in society, war, and technology. From its origins in the early 20th century to its present-day practice, the development of DST in the UK highlights its social, economic, and political implications.



Early Proposals for Daylight Saving Time

The concept of daylight saving time is often credited to William Willett, a British builder and outdoors enthusiast. In 1907, Willett published a pamphlet titled The Waste of Daylight, in which he argued that people were wasting valuable daylight hours by sleeping in during the summer months. Willett's proposal suggested moving the clocks forward by 80 minutes in four incremental 20-minute shifts during April and reversing the process in September.

Willett's motivation was primarily recreational - he wanted to give people more daylight for outdoor activities - but he also saw practical benefits, such as reduced energy consumption in the evening. Despite Willett's passionate advocacy, the British government initially rejected the idea. It wasn't until the outbreak of World War I that the concept gained serious traction.

World War I and the Introduction of Daylight Saving

World War I brought significant changes to everyday life in the UK and other European countries. As the war effort demanded greater resource conservation, governments began to reconsider how energy could be saved. In 1916, Germany became the first country to officially adopt daylight saving time, primarily to reduce the consumption of coal for lighting and heating. Shortly thereafter, the UK followed suit, introducing British Summer Time on May 21, 1916. This marked the first official use of DST in the country. The introduction of DST was part of a broader effort to manage resources more efficiently during wartime. By shifting the clocks forward, the UK was able to reduce the need for artificial lighting in the evening, thus saving fuel that could be redirected to the war effort.

Post-War Developments

Following World War I, the UK continued to use British Summer Time, although the practice remained somewhat controversial. Some people caused confusion, particularly for farmers who relied on consistent daylight patterns for their work. Nonetheless, the energy-saving benefits of DST ensured its continued use, and it became a regular part of British life.

However, DST was not uniformly applied across all sectors of society. During the interwar period, some regions and industries experimented with different timings. For example, from 1925 to 1939. London operated on "Double British Summer Time" (DBST), where clocks were moved forward by two hours during the summer months, further extending evening daylight.

World War II and Double British Summer Time

During World War II, the need for energy conservation and efficiency again became paramount. In 1940, the UK government reintroduced Double British Summer Time as a wartime measure. Clocks were advanced two hours forward during the summer and remained one hour ahead of standard time throughout the winter months.

The use of DBST allowed the UK to maximise daylight hours, minimising the need for artificial lighting and helping conserve fuel during a time of extreme scarcity. This system continued until 1945, when the war ended, and the UK reverted to the more standard practice of moving clocks forward by one hour during the Summer months.



Post-War Standardisation

After World War II, the use of British Summer Time continued, but the UK experimented with various modifications. In the 1960s, during a period of energy crises, the UK government again considered changes to DST to further improve energy efficiency. From 1968 to 1971, the UK conducted an experiment in which British Summer Time was kept in place year-round, eliminating the need for the biannual clock changes. This period was referred to as "British Standard Time." However, the experiment was ultimately deemed unsuccessful due to public dissatisfaction. Many people, especially in northern parts of the UK, complained about the dark winter mornings, which often delayed children's journey to school and complicated daily routines.

In 1971, the UK returned to the practice of moving clocks forward by one hour in the summer and back by one hour in the winter. This system, which has remained in place ever since, ensures

Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) during the winter and British Summer Time (BST) during the warmer months.



Modern Practice and FU Standardisation

In recent decades, the UK has continued to follow the established system of GMT in winter and BST in summer, with the clocks moving forward on the last Sunday in March and backward on the last Sunday in October. The primary motivation for continuing this practice remains the same as it was in the early 20th century: to make better use of daylight and reduce energy consumption.

However, daylight saving time has been a topic of ongoing debate both in the UK and across Europe. In 1996, the European Union standardised the dates for the start and end of DST across its member states, ensuring that all countries changed their clocks on the same days each year. This brought greater consistency to the system, but also reignited discussions about the relevance of daylight saving in the modern era, especially as energy conservation became less of an issue with technological advances in lighting.

The Future of Daylight Saving in the UK

In recent years, there have been calls to abandon DST entirely or adopt permanent daylight saving. Some argue that the practice is outdated and that modern energy-efficient lighting and heating technologies have made the system redundant. Others believe that DST continues to offer benefits, particularly in terms of increasing leisure hours in the evening and improving public health by encouraging outdoor activities.

The UK's exit from the European Union reopened discussions about whether the UK should retain its current daylight saving system or adopt a new approach. While the EU has proposed ending the mandatory clock changes across Europe, allowing individual countries to decide whether to adopt permanent DST or standard time, the UK has yet to make any significant changes.





With the darker nights at this time of year it means there are plenty of opportunities for night photography, as well as the stunning sunrises and sunsets through the Autumn, and with there still been a lot of solar activity it's worth keeping an eye on the Northern Lights forecast as well.

I've been spending some time on the Westwood on an evening to capture some of the amazing sunsets which I think always look more vibrant and colourful at this time of year, like this shot silhouetting the Black Mill and trees just before the sun dipped below the horizon.



It's also a great location to watch the moonrise and I was lucky enough to get these shots recently on a very calm night, including one of the Moon above the Black Mill which I'd wanted to take for a while now.

Due to the brightness of the moon, you can usually take photos without a tripod or any other special kit, so it makes it one of the easiest astronomical sights to photograph.

Another great location for night photography is the Humber Bridge, while it's a bit trickier to capture stars and Northern Lights due to the light from


the city, the bridge itself is a great subject and long exposure shots usually reveal some great reflections in the Humber as well as light trails from the traffic.



It can also look quite atmospheric, sometimes shrouded in mist or at dusk with a beautiful orange sky.
