## SPRING "TIME FOR CHANGE", WELCOME THE BLACK MILL CLOCK


Beverley's "Westwood" is a picturesque common land on Beverley's doorstep, it is a treasure trove of hidden secrets, historical charm.

The pastureland and woodland is a very popular spot for walkers, park runners, and nature enthusiasts, whilst holding a fascinating history.

The land was granted to the town of Beverley in the 14th Century by the Archbishop of York, ensuring its preservation for public use. The Black Mill, (Far Mill, Baitson's Mill), is an 18th-century windmill that stands as a testament to the area's agricultural past. Though it no longer functions after fire damage, the Pasture Masters removed its working gear when the lease expired in 1868, the Black Mill offers a glimpse into the region's industrious heritage and provides a striking focal point against the natural landscape.

In recognition of its past and keeping the Black Mill in line with the future, as people enjoy a walk, a round of golf, a picnic or just take in its beauty, people get lost in time... now is the time to unveil the future.

In the Spring and Summer months families enjoy playing cricket, football and model aircraft have all used Westwood. On a Saturday morning at 9am, the Beverley Westwood parkrun gets underway, and golfers need to keep track of time.



So a new timepiece will be installed on the Black Mill for the first time, to help people keep a track of time.

Solar timepieces, or sundials, date back to ancient civilisations like the Egyptians and Babylonians, who used the sun's shadow to mark time. These early timekeepers were relatively accurate for their era, though they depended on clear skies and had variations based on latitude and seasonal shifts

Mechanical clocks emerged in the Middle Ages


and they were often placed on historic buildings. One is on show at the Beverley and East Riding Golf Club, The Anti-Milla truncated windmill tower that's incorporated into the clubhouse of the Beverley and East Riding Golf Club, having a beautiful timepiece/ clock on display.



These monumental timepieces provided a public service, regulating daily life before personal watches were common. The evolution from sundials to grand clock towers showcases humanity's enduring quest to measure time with precision and reliability.

Solar watches, which are now quite common, can be accurate to within a second per 100,000 years when synchronised with radio signals. Their main advantage is that they require little to no battery replacement, making them both reliable and ecofriendly. Ideal for the Black Mill and ensuring all who enjoy the Westwood do not get lost in time!!

Karen Guest from Guest and Philips commented, "We are delighted to have been asked to provide the clock for the Black Mill, we recall the first solar watch, released in 1972, the iconic timepiece named the Synchronar 2100. It felt right that the Black Mill Clock would be set at 21.00 in recognition of the masterpiece and show it in its "Illuminating Glory"!



As the clocks Spring Forward do not be fooled, it's time to get up and Spring into action, April is a time of change, do not fool around, time is short.

Local Handyman, Beverley's lan Harrison commented, "To be asked on the first Tuesday of April to fix the time piece to the Black Mill is quite an honour and pleasure. This is an historic occasion, to use my skills positioning the time piece for all to admire is an amazing moment in Beverley's history".

Mayor of Beverley, ClIr David Boynton, said, "People will be able to see the Black Mill Clock aglow from far and wide - it will be the talk of the town. Using solar power is a stroke of genius, as it means no digging up of the Westwood to lay cables. It's about time a new lease of life was given to Black Mill and I'm sure it will strike the right chord with residents and visitors alike".

The Town Council will be approached to support this as under the Parish Councils Act 1957 Section 2, it has the power to provide and maintain public clocks and this will be a high-profile community timepiece.

### **SALT ARCHITECTS - THE SALT WAY 2025**

2025 is a real milestone for SALT Architects as they celebrate being part of the Beverley and East Yorkshire Community for a quarter of a century.

For the last 25 years SALT have worked across the North of England on projects across all sectors and they wanted to find a way to celebrate with those that have helped and those that continue to support them.

Bridget Hansford and Gary Hornsby set up the practice as a 'bridge' or conduit between the teaching of architecture and the delivery of projects which aim to enhance the quality of the environment for all.

The symbiotic relation between practice and education has allowed SALT to support and train many young people over the years and the success of those that have taken the opportunity

to develop, whilst keeping in touch SALT have brought added value to their journey.

To celebrate this journey and the many projects they have delivered over the years, they have decided to launch the Tour de SALT Cycle Challenge.

Gary commented, "We will be covering 1000 miles in 6 stages between now and the end of September and each stage will take in a number of our completed projects along a predetermined virtual route ending with a celebration at one of our projects.

"Six stages means that we have six yellow jerseys and each gives an opportunity for sponsorship. All donations and sponsorship money will be equally split between our chosen charities. The charities will be announced shortly."

#### LAIRGATE PROPERTY STARTS TO SPRING TO LIFE

Richard of R D Stott Architects commented, "When renovating a listed building, the external features and gardens are as much a crucial part of the whole process in ensuring the building's aesthetic appeal as the internal works in maintaining and preserving its historic charm".

With the works ongoing internally to ensure the property is delivered to a high standard of specification and quality finish, Richard continued by saying, "That with the longer days and warmer weather, we are now turning our thoughts to the exterior with works starting on the front elevation; the first impression of a building, which is being retained and restored with a traditional colour scheme and restored stone work and new metal railings to align with the building's original character"

"To the rear, we are again, taking advantage of the fine weather to start preparing the area for the final garden landscaping, including grading the site to achieve the correct levels, and laying out the car parking area to provide off road parking spaces for the final scheme and to allow space for the additional trades to start." Discussions and actions are agreed to allow smooth progress of the building.

Ultimately, the Lairgate properties will enjoy ample outside, west facing space with private gardens and private off street parking. The landscaping, planting, paths and garden walls have been designed to highlight the structure's heritage features.



Richard continued, "As we move towards the Summer, we will carefully choose plants and thoughtful layouts that will not only enhance the

landscape and compliment the building but will also create a harmonious blend between the building and its surroundings".

The Lairgate property is moving along at a steady pace, and the restoration of the front elevation and garden design will respect the building's history.

It will enhance its visual impact, ensuring it continues to stand as a remarkable piece of architectural heritage

## GET READY TO BE INVOLVED STARTING 81

Beverley Town Council is planning a community event in Coronation Gardens on Thursday 8th May 2025 to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of VE Day.

VE Day celebrations bring communities together, and Beverley is no different. Unity and remembrance through events, parades, and educational activities along with SSAFA's involvement, ensures that veterans receive the recognition and support they deserve, highlighting the ongoing need for welfare services.



Michael Menzies Baird Chair of SSAFA commented, "It is hoped that we will be able to mark this historic occasion, by turning Beverley into a town of red, white and blue, in conjunction with The Beverley Town Council and the local Beverley Chamber of Trade encouraging shops and businesses to fly the flag. It is time to not only to pay tribute to the past but also reaffirm our commitment to supporting those who have served, ensuring their sacrifices continue to be honored for future generations".

Shaun Dart Chair of BCoT said, "It is important during these current times that we all pull together to celebrate and remember those who have given us our today, the flying of flags and the red, white and blue decorations would provide a great backdrop to the celebrations".



Beverley Town Council will start at 6pm with the VE Day 80 Proclamation, followed by a prayer and words of thanksgiving.

The beacon (purchased for the Queen's Jubilee) will then be lit and the public asked to turn on their tealights, and the official VE Day Words of Celebration will be recited. This will be followed by the singing of "I Vow to Thee, My Country", accompanied by a local band or choir. A programme will be distributed so those gathered have access to the lyrics.

As members of the public enter the garden, they will be presented with an electronic tealight. These are to represent the lamplights of peace and will also be a keepsake of the event. Each electronic candle will be branded with the Beverley VE VJ Day 80 emblem to acknowledge the anniversary.

Although the above is happening nationally at 9:30pm, Beverley Town Council wants the event to be accessible to all and family-friendly, so will hold this at 6pm, but then repeat the whole ceremony again at 9:30pm alongside the rest of the nation. People are invited to bring their own picnics.



From 6:30pm families and friends can relax in Coronation Garden and listen to the National Bell Ring from both St Mary's Church and Beverley Minster.

Between 7pm and 9:30pm, local choirs and music groups will be scheduled to perform uplifting and appropriate music in the garden, leading to the repeat of the ceremony at 9:30pm.

Families and friends are encouraged to bring a picnic and enjoy the May evening in good company and community spirit.

The Mayor of Beverley, Councillor David Boynton commented, "As I conclude my year as Mayor, it has been an honour to have served our Town as Mayor, I look forward to everyone getting involved in remembrance of the historic day, celebrate the occasion in true, traditional fashion wearing red,



white and blue and flying the flag with pride".

Deputy Mayor Alison Healy commented, "We are all looking forward to the VE Day celebrations and remembrance services, marking such an historic occasion".

To add to the ambience, to create a wonderful celebration and remembrance atmosphere, VE Day 80 commemorative flags will be given to local churches to fly and Beverley Town Council will also display union flags throughout the town centre from early May to late August to encompass both VE and VJ Days.

You can do your bit and display your decorations as well. A Beverley of red, white and blue to make it a Summer to remember in more ways.

Whilst plans are still to be finalised in Coronation Garden, The Beverley Male Voice Choir, She Productions and the Church Lads and Church Girls Brigade along with other groups will be organising events, such as ERYC, holding an official wreath laying at 11am in Hengate Memorial Garden.





#### I'VE BEEN THINKING... SAYS COLIN RAYNOR

The sight of lambs gambolling around a field, either playing with each other, or looking to find their mothers for milk, is one of the truly heart warming scenes of the countryside in April. Yet so many folks just go driving past not taking the time to absorb what is truly one of natures miracles.

The Bible offers a picture of the Good Shepherd and it goes on to speak of 'knowing my sheep as I am known'. That phrase we often connect to a relationship that a human being might hope to have with their creator God.

In truth there is a real relationship between the human shepherd and their sheep. It is the shepherd who decides when a ram (male sheep) will copulate with an ewe (female sheep). The gestation period of sheep is between 142-152 days but 147 is used as the average to calculate the likely date which is the due date of



the baby lamb. Ewes can give birth to 1-3 lambs (or more in exceptional circumstances) in a single pregnancy and many shepherds have their sheep scanned and therefore know how many lambs to expect.

The shepherd can decide what is the best time of year to bring lambs in to the world but from the time they are 'covered' by the ram (or tup) the shepherd keeps a keen eye on the ewes at all times. The sheep due to give birth will remain in the fields and will bear a colour on their backs to indicate their pregnancy.

As the time for the birth approaches the ewes will be brought inside to the birthing pen to ensure that they are able to receive sufficient food for themselves and the precious lambs they carry.

Sheep have the ability to give birth without the shepherds assistance although a good shepherd will always note the signs when an ewe is due to give birth. In the majority of births the shepherd is on hand to ensure the birth is normal even though this may be in the middle of the night.

When lambs are born they are put in a separate pen with their mother to learn how to suckle her milk. When in the following week the lambs and their mother are back out in the field this early period of closeness enables the mother to recognise the call of their own lambs.

Sheep will only feed their own lambs although in some cases the shepherd can persuade a sheep to adopt a lamb that has no mother.

Regular readers of this column may recall

that in June 2020 I wrote about Stevie the sheep that was born blind and deaf and named after the famous American singer Stevie Wonder who was also born blind. At that time she was four years old had not had any lambs of her own.

Now nine years old she has been allowed to mate with the ram and has given birth to one lamb each year. Although she is still a loner, unable to know where the other sheep are in the field, she uses the fence to maintain her bearings and grazes happily.

She is a natural mother and even though she cannot hear them bleating, her lambs know where their mother is and go to her for milk. The caring shepherd has treated Stevie like all the other sheep including shearing her when the season is right to do so.

When you next hear the tune Crimond and sing the words "He makes me to lie down in pastures green...", you will reflect again on wonders of new born lambs and the shepherds who nurture them.

## SPRING IS HERE AND THE GARDEN IS ABUNDANT WITH ROTH WILDLIFF AND RLOSSOM perspective but also

Numerous bees, ladybird's blue tits, sparrows, wrens, blackbirds and squirrels, and of course the pigeons, are a joy to behold and a comfort to me that they have a place to come where they can be safe and feed, make nests or even have a bath!

Planting through the seasons in the garden ensures that there is an ample supply of food for early bees and insects, important for pollination. It is not only a positive for them but also for us as even the simplest show of flowers gives us inspiration.

A classic example of an early flowering plant is the Hellebore foetidus, in the photograph below. It is a very prolific self-seeding plant, but one I would certainly recommend. I walked into the small kitchen garden a few days ago to collect some salad leaves for lunch and was amazed how the plant was heaving with large bees and ladybirds.



This plant bears the name of the stinking hellebore, apparently when its leaves are crushed it omits an unpleasant odour, one that I have to admit I have never noticed, perhaps because I have never crushed the leaves. The plant is an

evergreen, and the architectural pattern of the divided leaves remain though the year which is a bonus when there are no flowers. It grows well in a wooded area or a shaded border. Flowering from January to April.

With the nesting season starting, the blackbirds have started to collect materials for use in building the nest. Ironically, one was clearing an old nest from last year, however I do not think they must have found anything useful as it was cast into the border later in the day, but you never know, everything has its place.

#### Jobs in the garden

Make sure you have started to chit your potatoes, place them in an egg box or container in a well-lit area with natural light in the house but not in direct sunlight. Usually, Easter is the time to plant them out either into pots or into the garden.

If you are putting them into containers then a 35-40 cm (13") wide pot with a depth of 30cm (11") will allow you to plant up to three potatoes. Place a good depth of compost of about 20cm (7/8") in the base and position the potatoes with the tips pointing upwards, then add enough compost just to cover. As soon as the shoots start to show add more compost in order to cover the new growth.

Keep doing this until you get to 10cm (3/4") from the top of the container and then allow the foliage to grow. Keep them watered, then by autumn when the foliage starts to die back, they should be ready to harvest.

Rosemary is a wonderful herb to have in the garden, not only from an evergreen foliage

perspective but also from the fragrance it exudes when you put your hands through the branches. When it flowers it also is a good source of food for the bees.



Looking back at the monastic gardens created in the ninth century the 'physic' garden designed as a quadrangle would contain a mixture of herbs and flowers of which rosemary and sage, roses and lilies would be a main feature, the fragrance would have been outstanding. Many years ago, I planted one of the oldest roses, *Rosa gallica* next to the rosemary, it is a beautiful deeply coloured rose, and the repeat flowering is second to none. Start to sow both tomato and cucumber seeds.

The two varieties I have always found to perform well are Gardeners Delight tomatoes and the Mini Munch cucumber. A small cucumber as the name infers but a prolific producer in all sorts of locations and also because of its size works well in salads.



### **WANSFORD WATERY WANDERINGS**

We don't do very well for landscapes with flowing water in the East Riding, certainly when compared to other regions of Yorkshire. This stroll, however, is almost all alongside water, although some of it is non-flowing.

It's perfect for a Spring day and at its heart is what I regard as one of the most beautiful and photogenic spots anywhere in Yorkshire. The suggested route is perfect for those using either the train or bus from Beverley, as our start and finshing points are served by buses and trains.

If driving, there is street parking near to Nafferton Station. The walk is around 5 miles, or add two if walking back to Nafferton from Driffield.

Start at Nafferton Station, very attractive now that it is lovingly tended by volunteers. Turn left over the crossing and then immediate left on a quiet lane. In 100 yards you cross Nafferton Beck and take the signed path on the streams left bank, heading south to Wansford. This is one of the many crystal clear chalk streams that feed the River Hull, you are likely to see fish in the shallows.



A clear path leads easily to the bridge just outside Wansford. Follow the road to the right into this tiny, but delightful, village. A trio of striking Victorian buildings greets you at the road junction, the former school and vicarage, plus the church in beautiful grounds and which might be open to visitors.

From the church, head South on the pavement to the main road, passing the handsome Village Hall. Cross the busy road with care and enjoy the lovely scenes by the canal lock, a smashing picnic spot! Head left up the road, there is a pavement on the left and soon you will reach the sublime spot at Wansford Mill.


Here the waters of Nafferton Beck gush through an old mill race and then form a most attractive pool full of willow and aquatic plants. On a gorgeous early Spring day, I watched a little egret fishing here - you might spot it in the photos.

There is a public footpath that leads you right past the lovely mill house. Retrace your steps to the road and cross at the bridge into the lane leading to Skerne. Over the bridge is a path on your left which gives you access to the lovely riverside meadows of Snakeholme, a short loop back to the bridge is highly recommended. The infant River Hull is very beautiful here.

Now go back to the canal and pick up the path on the right at the picnic area. This is now an easy and attractive 2 mile waterside stroll into Driffield, with lots of birds to spot including swans. My route finishes at Driffield Station, or the bus stop nearby. Those who have parked at Nafferton can walk the 2 miles back along clear paths, shown on the map. Choose a fine day to enjoy this feast of waterside wandering.





#### THE HISTORY OF THE TERM APRIL SHOWERS

The phrase "April showers" is deeply embedded in the English language, evoking images of Spring's changeable weather. Its history is intertwined with agricultural wisdom and literary tradition, reflecting observations of seasonal patterns.

Here's a breakdown of the term's history:

#### Origins in Observation:

The concept stems from the natural phenomenon of increased rainfall during April, particularly in temperate climates like that of the British Isles. This period marks the transition from Winter to Spring, characterised by fluctuating temperatures and increased atmospheric instability.

Early agricultural societies recognised the importance of this rainfall for promoting plant growth, leading to the association of April showers with the blossoming of May flowers.

In essence, "April showers" is more than just a weather observation; it's a cultural touchstone that reflects our connection to the rhythms of nature and the enduring hope for renewal in Springtime.

#### TIPS FOR TOWING SAFELY: CARAVANS AND TRAILERS

As a representative from your local road safety charity, Hull and East Riding Advanced Motorists, I have been asked to write a series of articles covering different aspects of Advanced Driving.

Going away with the whole family and the caravan, trailer tent or camping trailer is a great experience. As with all driving, when we are towing something, the number one priority should always be the safety aspects involved. Keeping you, your passengers, your vehicle and the trailer or caravan, and other road users safe is a must every time you head out on the roads.

#### 1. Knowing your limits

All cars have a maximum weight they can tow, and this is usually listed in the handbook or specification sheet, alternatively the vehicle's 'gross train weight' may be listed on the vehicle identification number (VIN) plate on the car, which is normally under the bonnet or inside the driver's door. Always check before planning your trip. Be aware that some vehicles may have a zero permitted towing weight.

#### 2. Checking your connections

Check that your breakaway cable or secondary coupling is undamaged and connected correctly to a suitable point on the tow bar or towing vehicle. As well as inspecting for damage, make sure that the trailer is correctly coupled to the tow-ball or pin.

#### 3. Service your trailer

Do not neglect your trailer when you are planning your vehicle service requirements. If you are not competent yourself, take it into a specialist. The NTTA (National Trailer Towing Association) will offer a free visual safety check at one of their approved centres. NTTA (www.ntta.co.uk/freesafetycheck/)

#### 4. Tyre pressure

The tyre pressure must be correct and all tyres

free from cuts, bulges and with adequate tread (including the spare which should be inflated to the highest pressure that may be required). Remember, tyres must have a continuous tread depth of at least 1.6mm on cars, light vans and trailers, across the centre three-quarters of the width. Visit Tyre Safe if you need to check your pressures.

#### 5. Fit the plates

Be sure the correct number plate is fitted. This should be the same registration number as your vehicle and needs to conform to DVLA Standards.

#### 6. Visibility

Having a good view of the rear of your trailer or caravan is always advisable. This usually means seeing an area 4 metres wide from the side of and 20 metres behind. Almost all vehicles including 4x4s will require extended mirrors to achieve this, and if the caravan or trailer is wider than the car they will always be required. You can be fined up to £1,000 and get 3 penalty points for failing to use suitable towing mirrors, so check your visibility before travelling. However, don't forget to remove the mirrors when you're not towing - it's illegal to have them fitted if you don't need them.

#### 7. Watch your speed

Always keep to the legal speed limit for the road you are using, and in case you need a recap here are the speed limits for cars towing caravans or trailers:

- 30mph limit applies on all roads with street lighting unless signs show otherwise.
- 50mph applies on single carriageways unless signs show otherwise.
- 60mph applies on dual carriageways and motorways.

It should also be remembered that you must not travel in the outside lane of a motorway, with three lanes or more, if you are driving a vehicle towing a trailer



#### 8. Weather forecast

You should have increased vigilance when towing in wet, icy or windy weather conditions as you are at amplified risk. Avoid towing in these circumstances if you can, but if you have no choice then be careful when driving downhill or round a tight bend and be careful of exposed areas where the wind may affect you. When you're turning, engage a lower gear to give you more engine braking. Also check the Met Office for the latest weather forecast to help you to plan your route.

#### 9. Competency to tow

Whilst it may be possible to manually handle a smaller trailer on your own a larger unit will often prevent this. A sound knowledge of the dynamics of moving forward, the intricacies of reversing and the knowledge required to ensure safe loading are paramount to staying safe. If you are unsure sign up for a course at one of the Caravan or camping clubs, or make use of the knowledge of a friend or relative who may have the requisite skills.

The DVSA and YouTube have videos on tow a trailer or caravan with a car, to make sure you are towing safely and legally.

## BEVERLEY WESTWOOD PARKRUN: WHAT DOES THE RUN DIRECTOR DO?

You might look at the Run Director each week and wonder to yourself what they actually do! They appear to potter about, chat to visitors, catch coats from too warm runners, laugh with the regulars, or just wander up and down the finish area trying to look important!



Whilst those things are actually true there is a lot more to the role than just looking the part. The RD has overall responsibility for the event, from health and safety, your well-being, to communicating the event's expectation of volunteers, participants and visitors.

They are generally found in the start / finish area so they can keep an eye on how things are going. The RD also has the ultimate authority on the day whether to cancel or postpone the event or if an adjustment to the course is preded.

The RD is like a master of ceremonies, they welcome all the runners and walkers to the event, this is done via a pre-event briefing. They will acknowledge contributions of the volunteers, and welcome visitors to the event along with sharing milestones for runners / walkers and volunteers with the crowd

Most importantly they will share some key rules and tips with everyone, no extendable leads or waist harnesses for dogs, give us our tokens back, children under 11 should be with an adult etc.

The only exception at our parkrun is for the Duke of Edinburgh volunteers, they get the option to be RD in their volunteer stint.

They don't all take it but a few do and that is amazing to see, young people standing up in front of that big crowd and commanding their attention. Very impressive!

Run Director is my favourite role. It might be I am a glory hunter or even just a show off but really, I just love the excitement of the day when I am RD.
